AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to criminal trespass and burglary upon the premises of a pharmacy

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 140.00 of the penal law is amended by adding a new 2 subdivision 6 to read as follows:

3 6. "PHARMACY" MEANS THAT AREA WITHIN A BUILDING AT WHICH THE PRACTICE 4 OF THE PROFESSION OF PHARMACY IS CONDUCTED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE 5 HUNDRED THIRTY-SEVEN OF THE EDUCATION LAW.

6 S 2. Subdivision 1 of section 140.15 of the penal law, as amended by 7 chapter 315 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:

8 1. he or she knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in a dwelling OR A 9 PHARMACY; or

10 S 3. Subdivision 2 of section 140.25 of the penal law, as amended by 11 chapter 361 of the laws of 1981, is amended to read as follows:

12 2. The building is a dwelling, OR THE PORTION OF THE BUILDING THAT IS 13 A PHARMACY.

14 S 4. The opening paragraph of section 140.30 of the penal law, as 15 amended by chapter 361 of the laws of 1981, is amended to read as 16 follows:

17 A person is guilty of burglary in the first degree when he OR SHE 18 knowingly enters or remains unlawfully in a dwelling OR A PHARMACY with 19 intent to commit a crime therein, and when, in effecting entry or while 20 in the dwelling or in immediate flight therefrom, he OR SHE or another 21 participant in the crime:

22 S 5. This act shall take effect on the first of November next 23 succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law.
