AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to cash registers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 1 399-j to read as follows:

3 S 399-J. CASH REGISTERS. 1. ANY CASH REGISTER USED BY OR IN THE OPERA-4 TION OF A BUSINESS WHICH CUSTOMARILY DEALS WITH CONSUMERS, OTHER THAN A 5 HOTEL, MOTEL, RETAIL LICENSED PREMISES FOR THE ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION 6 ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR RESTAURANT WHERE A PRINTED AND ITEMIZED CHECK OF 7 IS PROVIDED FOR THE CUSTOMER'S PERUSAL BEFORE PAYMENT, SHALL VISUALLY 8 DISPLAY THE AMOUNT OF ANY SALE IN A MANNER READILY VISIBLE TO SUCH 9 CONSUMER.

10 2. WHENEVER THERE SHALL BE A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION, AN APPLICATION MAY BE MADE BY THE ATTORNEY GENERAL IN THE NAME OF THE PEOPLE OF 11 THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO A COURT OR JUSTICE HAVING JURISDICTION BY A SPECIAL 12 13 TO ISSUE AN INJUNCTION, AND UPON NOTICE TO THE RESPONDENT OF PROCEEDING NOT LESS THAN FIVE DAYS, TO ENJOIN AND RESTRAIN THE CONTINUANCE OF 14 SUCH IF IT SHALL APPEAR TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE COURT OR 15 VIOLATIONS; AND JUSTICE THAT THE RESPONDENT HAS, IN FACT, VIOLATED 16 THIS SECTION, AN ISSUED BY SUCH COURT OR JUSTICE, ENJOINING AND 17 INJUNCTION MAY BE 18 RESTRAINING ANY FURTHER VIOLATION, WITHOUT REQUIRING PROOF THAT ANY PERSON HAS, IN FACT, BEEN INJURED OR DAMAGED THEREBY. WHENEVER THE COURT 19 20 SHALL DETERMINE THAT A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION HAS OCCURRED, THE COURT 21 A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT MORE THAN FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS FOR IMPOSE MAY EACH VIOLATION. IN CONNECTION WITH ANY SUCH APPLICATION, 22 THEATTORNEY AUTHORIZED TO TAKE PROOF AND MAKE A DETERMINATION OF THE 23 GENERAL IS 24 RELEVANT FACTS AND TO ISSUE SUBPOENAS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CIVIL PRAC-25 TICE LAW AND RULES.

26 S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after it shall have become a law and shall apply to all cash registers 27 28 installed on or after such date; provided, however that all existing 29 cash registers in violation of subdivision 1 of section 399-j of the
