AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to requiring school districts in a city of one million or more to investigate and report on the status of polychlorinated biphenyls

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 4 of section 3641 of the education law is 2 amended by adding a new paragraph e to read as follows:

E. (1) SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN A CITY OF ONE MILLION OR MORE SHALL 3 TEST 4 THE PRESENCE OF POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYLS (PCBS) IN AND AROUND FOR 5 SCHOOL BUILDINGS AND SHALL SUBMIT TO THE COMMISSIONER AND THE COMMIS-SIONER OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION A REPORT ON THE RESULTS. 6 SUCH 7 REPORT SHALL BE IN THE FORM PRESCRIBED BY THE COMMISSIONER, IN CONSULTA-8 TION WITH THE COMMISSIONER OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION. THESAMPLING METHODS SHALL MEET THE PROTOCOL FOR SAMPLING CAULK AND SOIL CONTAINED IN 9 PROTOCOL FOR ADDRESSING POLYCHLORINATED BIPHENYLS ADOPTED BY THE 10 THE DEPARTMENT IN JUNE TWO THOUSAND SEVEN. THE REPORT SHALL REFLECT 11 THE OF INSPECTIONS OF ALL SCHOOL BUILDINGS CONSTRUCTED OR RENOVATED 12 RESULTS 13 IN A MANNER REQUIRING THE USE OF CAULK BETWEEN NINETEEN HUNDRED FIFTY AND NINETEEN HUNDRED EIGHTY AND SHALL INCLUDE THE TESTING OF EXPANSION 14 JOINT CAULKING AND DOOR AND WINDOW CAULKING AS WELL AS SOIL 15 IN AND 16 AROUND SCHOOL BUILDINGS. ANALYSIS OF SAMPLES SHALL BE CONDUCTED BY A 17 LABORATORY CERTIFIED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PURSUANT TO SECTION 18 FIVE HUNDRED TWO OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW. THE STATE SHALL REIMBURSE EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT IN THE AMOUNT OF FIFTY DOLLARS PER SAMPLE. 19 SUCH SHALL BE SUBMITTED TO THE COMMISSIONER, AND THE COMMISSIONER OF 20 REPORT ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION, BY THE FIRST OF JANUARY NEXT SUCCEEDING THE 21 22 OF THE SCHOOL YEAR IN WHICH THE LAST INSPECTION WAS CONDUCTED, CLOSE 23 WITH ALL BUILDINGS BEING INSPECTED BY JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FOUR-24 FIFTY PERCENT OF SUCH BUILDINGS SHALL BE TESTED PURSUANT TO THIS TEEN.

SUBPARAGRAPH BY JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN. THE DEPARTMENT, AND 1 THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION, SHALL POST THE REPORT 2 3 PROVIDED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT IN A TIMELY MANNER ON THEIR RESPECTIVE WEBSITES. THE DISTRICT SHALL PROVIDE TO THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE DEPART-4 5 MENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION, AND THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE DEPART-MENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION, SHALL PROMPTLY POST ON THEIR RESPEC-6 TIVE WEBSITES, INSPECTION AND TEST RESULTS FOR EACH INDIVIDUAL SCHOOL 7 BUILDING AS THE TESTS ARE COMPLETED ON A SCHOOL-BY-SCHOOL BASIS. 8 SCHOOL-BY-SCHOOL RESULTS SHALL BE SENT TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE 9 10 UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, EACH SCHOOL'S ADMINIS-TRATION AND THE PARENTS OF STUDENTS ATTENDING EACH SCHOOL. 11 THE ORDER IN WHICH SCHOOLS ARE INSPECTED SHALL BE DETERMINED BY RANDOM DRAW. 12 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION SHALL ENFORCE THE 13 14 PROVISIONS CONTAINED IN SUBPARAGRAPH ONE OF THIS PARAGRAPH IN A TIMELY

15 MANNER.

16 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
