AN ACT to amend the social services in relation to a medical law, assistance information and payment system

PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subparagraph 2 of paragraph (b) of subdivision 8 of section 367-b of the social services law, as amended by chapter 109 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as follows:

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(2) Coordination of benefits. Develop, test and implement an automated improve the coordination of benefits between the medical process to assistance program and other sources of coverage for medical 6 assistance 7 recipients. Such initiative shall initially examine the savings poten-8 tial to the medical assistance program through retrospective review of claims paid which shall be completed not later than January thirty-9 10 first, two thousand seven. If, based upon such initial experience, the Medicaid inspector general deems the automated process to be capable of 11 12 including or moving to a prospective review, with negligible effect on turnaround of claims for provider payment or on recipient access to 13 services, then the Medicaid inspector general in subsequent tests 14 15 savings potential through prospective, pre-claims payment PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH 16 review. SHALL MENT AN INITIATIVE ESTABLISHING AN AUTOMATED REAL TIME PROSPECTIVE PRE-17 CLAIMS PAYMENT REVIEW PROCESS, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED 18 TO, A PRE-PHARMACY CLAIMS REVIEW OF ALTERNATIVE 19 PHARMACY AUTHORIZATION AND INSURANCE COVERAGE PROGRAM, PROVIDED HOWEVER THAT 20 ANY SUCH INITIATIVE 21 MINIMAL INITIAL COSTS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. ANY INITIATIVE 22 IMPLEMENTED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SHALL HAVE A NEGLIGIBLE 23 THE TURNAROUND OF CLAIMS FOR PROVIDER PAYMENT OR ON RECIPIENT ACCESS

TO SERVICES AND DEMONSTRATE SAVINGS POTENTIAL.

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S 2. The department of health shall issue a request for proposals for the purpose of providing the system described in subparagraph (2) of paragraph (b) of subdivision 8 of section 367-b of the social services law, as amended by section one of this act, within 90 days of the effective date of this act. Bids from qualified vendors shall be received by the department of health no later than 60 days following the issuance of the request for proposals. Any contract issued pursuant to this section shall be issued within 90 days following receipt of bids and installation of such system completed by the successful bidder within 180 days of the issuance of such contract.

S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
