AN ACT to amend the labor law, in relation to independent contractors

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

The labor law is amended by adding two new sections 196-b 1 Section 1. and 196-c to read as follows:

S 196-B. DEFINITIONS. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION THE TERM:

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1. "COMPENSATION" MEANS THE EARNINGS OF AN INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. THE TERM "COMPENSATION" ALSO INCLUDES REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES.

6 2. "INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR" MEANS A SOLE PROPRIETOR WHO IS NOT AN 7 EMPLOYEE AND WHO IS HIRED OR RETAINED BY A CLIENT FOR AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO 8 OR GREATER THAN SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS.

9 3. "CLIENT" INCLUDES A CORPORATION, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY, PART-10 NERSHIP, ASSOCIATION OR NON-PROFITMAKING ORGANIZATION CONTRACTING WITH AN INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR IN ANY OCCUPATION, INDUSTRY, TRADE, BUSINESS 11 12 SERVICE FOR COMPENSATION EQUAL TO OR GREATER THAN SIX HUNDRED OR 13 THE TERM "CLIENT" SHALL NOT INCLUDE A GOVERNMENTAL DOLLARS. ENTITY, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ANY AGENCY, BOARD, DEPARTMENT, COMMISSION 14 OF THE STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THEREOF; AND CLIENT SHALL NOT 15 INCLUDE A PERSON. THE TERM "CLIENT" SHALL NOT INCLUDE OWNERS OF ONE AND 16 TWO-FAMILY DWELLINGS. 17

18 S 196-C. PAYMENT OF INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS. 1. AN INDEPENDENT 19 CONTRACTOR SHALL BE PAID THE COMPENSATION EARNED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 20 AGREED WORK TERMS BUT NOT LATER THAN THE LAST DAY OF THE MONTH FOLLOWING THE MONTH IN WHICH THE COMPENSATION IS EARNED. 21 THE AGREED WORK TERMS SHALL BE REDUCED IN WRITING, SIGNED BY BOTH THE CLIENT AND THE INDEPEND-22 ENT CONTRACTOR, KEPT ON FILE BY THE CLIENT FOR A PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 23 24 SIX YEARS AND MADE AVAILABLE TO THE COMMISSIONER UPON REQUEST. SUCH 25 WRITING SHALL INCLUDE A DESCRIPTION OF HOW COMPENSATION EARNED AND PAYA-BLE SHALL BE CALCULATED. THE FAILURE OF A CLIENT TO PRODUCE SUCH WRITTEN 26

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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1 WORK TERMS, UPON REQUEST OF THE COMMISSIONER, SHALL GIVE RISE TO A 2 PRESUMPTION THAT THE TERMS THAT THE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR HAS PRESENTED 3 ARE THE AGREED TERMS.

4 2. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL INVESTIGATE AND ATTEMPT TO ADJUST EQUITABLY 5 CONTROVERSIES BETWEEN CLIENTS AND INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS RELATING TO 6 THIS SECTION.

7 3. THE COMMISSIONER MAY TAKE ASSIGNMENTS OF CLAIMS FOR COMPENSATION AS 8 SECTION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-SIX-B OF THIS ARTICLE FROM INDE-DEFINED IN PENDENT CONTRACTORS OR THIRD PARTIES IN TRUST FOR SUCH INDEPENDENT 9 10 CONTRACTORS OR FOR THE VARIOUS FUNDS FOR SUCH INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS. ALL SUCH ASSIGNMENTS SHALL RUN TO THE COMMISSIONER AND HIS SUCCESSOR 11 ΙN OFFICE. THE COMMISSIONER MAY SUE COMPANIES ON COMPENSATION CLAIMS THUS 12 13 ASSIGNED. HE MAY JOIN IN A SINGLE ACTION ANY NUMBER OF COMPENSATION 14 CLAIMS AGAINST THE SAME COMPANY.

15 4. ANY INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR MAY FILE WITH THE COMMISSIONER A 16 COMPLAINT REGARDING A VIOLATION OF THIS ARTICLE FOR AN INVESTIGATION OF 17 SUCH COMPLAINT AND STATEMENT SETTING THE APPROPRIATE REMEDY, IF ANY. FAILURE OF A CLIENT TO KEEP ADEOUATE RECORDS SHALL NOT OPERATE AS A BAR 18 19 TΟ FILING OF A COMPLAINT BY AN INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR. IN SUCH A CASE 20 THE CLIENT IN VIOLATION SHALL BEAR THE BURDEN OF PROVING THAT THE 21 COMPLAINING INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR WAS PAID COMPENSATION.

ON BEHALF OF ANY INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR PAID LESS THAN THE COMPEN-22 5. SATION TO WHICH HE OR SHE IS ENTITLED UNDER THE AGREED WORK TERMS UNDER 23 PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE, THE COMMISSIONER MAY BRING ANY LEGAL 24 THE 25 ACTION NECESSARY, INCLUDING ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION, TO COLLECT SUCH CLAIM AND AS PART OF SUCH LEGAL ACTION, IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER REMEDIES 26 AND PENALTIES OTHERWISE AVAILABLE UNDER THIS ARTICLE, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ASSESS AGAINST THE CLIENT AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT AS LIQUIDATED DAMAGES, 27 28 UNLESS THE CLIENT PROVES A GOOD FAITH BASIS FOR BELIEVING THAT 29 ITS UNDERPAYMENT OF COMPENSATION WAS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW. LIQUIDATED 30 DAMAGES SHALL BE CALCULATED BY THE COMMISSIONER AS NO MORE THAN ONE 31 32 HUNDRED PERCENT OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION FOUND TO BE DUE. IN 33 INSTITUTED IN THE COURTS UPON A COMPENSATION CLAIM BY AN ANY ACTION 34 INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR OR THE COMMISSIONER IN WHICH THE INDEPENDENT 35 CONTRACTOR PREVAILS, THE COURT SHALL ALLOW SUCH INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR ALL REASONABLE ATTORNEY'S FEES, PREJUDGMENT INTEREST AS REQUIRED UNDER 36 37 THE CIVIL PRACTICE LAW AND RULES, AND, UNLESS THE CLIENT PROVES A GOOD FAITH BASIS TO BELIEVE THAT ITS UNDERPAYMENT OF COMPENSATION WAS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAW, AN ADDITIONAL AMOUNT AS LIQUIDATED DAMAGES 38 39 40 EQUAL TO ONE HUNDRED PERCENT OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF COMPENSATION FOUND TO BE DUE. THE REMEDIES PROVIDED BY THIS ARTICLE MAY BE ENFORCED SIMUL-41 TANEOUSLY OR CONSECUTIVELY SO FAR AS NOT INCONSISTENT WITH EACH OTHER. 42

6. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, AN ACTION TO RECOVER
44 UPON A LIABILITY IMPOSED BY THIS ARTICLE MUST BE COMMENCED WITHIN SIX
45 YEARS. ALL INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS SHALL HAVE THE RIGHT TO RECOVER FULL
46 COMPENSATION ACCRUED DURING THE SIX YEARS PREVIOUS TO THE COMMENCING OF
47 SUCH ACTION, WHETHER SUCH ACTION IS INSTITUTED BY THE INDEPENDENT
48 CONTRACTOR OR BY THE COMMISSIONER.

49 7. EACH INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR WHO FILES A COMPLAINT REGARDING A 50 VIOLATION OF A PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE PROVIDED WITH A WRIT-51 TEN DESCRIPTION OF THE ANTICIPATED PROCESSING OF THE COMPLAINT, INCLUD-52 ING INVESTIGATION, CASE CONFERENCE, POTENTIAL CIVIL AND CRIMINAL PENAL-53 TIES, AND COLLECTION PROCEDURES.

54 8. EACH INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AND HIS OR HER REPRESENTATIVE SHALL BE 55 NOTIFIED IN WRITING OF ANY CASE CONFERENCE BEFORE IT IS HELD AND GIVEN 56 THE OPPORTUNITY TO ATTEND. 9. EACH INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AND HIS OR HER REPRESENTATIVE SHALL BE NOTIFIED IN WRITING OF ANY AWARD AND COLLECTION OF BACK COMPENSATION AND CIVIL PENALTIES, AND OF ANY INTENT TO SEEK CRIMINAL PENALTIES. IN THE EVENT THAT CRIMINAL PENALTIES ARE SOUGHT THE INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR AND HIS OR HER REPRESENTATIVE SHALL BE NOTIFIED OF THE OUTCOME OF PROSE-CUTION.

7 10. IF THE COMMISSIONER DETERMINES THAT A CLIENT HAS VIOLATED A 8 PROVISION OF THIS ARTICLE, OR A RULE OR REGULATION PROMULGATED THERE-UNDER, BY FAILING TO PAY THE COMPENSATION OF THEIR INDEPENDENT CONTRAC-9 10 TORS, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ISSUE TO THE CLIENT AN ORDER DIRECTING COMPLIANCE THEREWITH, WHICH SHALL DESCRIBE PARTICULARLY THE NATURE OF 11 THE ALLEGED VIOLATION, AND ORDER THE PAYMENT OF INTEREST AT THE RATE OF 12 INTEREST THEN IN EFFECTED AS PRESCRIBED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF BANKS 13 14 PURSUANT TO SECTION FOURTEEN-A OF THE BANKING LAW PER ANNUM FROM THE DATE OF THE UNDERPAYMENT TO THE DATE OF THE PAYMENT. IN ADDITION TO 15 16 DIRECTING PAYMENT OF COMPENSATION FOUND TO BE DUE, SUCH ORDER, IF ISSUED TO A CLIENT WHO PREVIOUSLY HAS BEEN FOUND IN VIOLATION OF THOSE 17 PROVISIONS, RULES OR REGULATIONS, OR TO A CLIENT WHOSE VIOLATION IS 18 19 WILLFUL OR EGREGIOUS, SHALL DIRECT PAYMENT TO THE COMMISSIONER OF AN 20 ADDITIONAL SUM AS A CIVIL PENALTY IN AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO DOUBLE THE TOTAL 21 AMOUNT FOUND TO BE DUE.

22 11. EVERY CLIENT WHO DOES NOT PAY THE COMPENSATION OF ALL OF ITS INDE-23 PENDENT CONTRACTORS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER, 24 AND THE OFFICERS AND AGENTS OF ANY CLIENT WHO KNOWINGLY PERMIT THE 25 CLIENT TO VIOLATE THIS CHAPTER BY FAILING TO PAY THE COMPENSATION OF ANY 26 OF ITS INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS THERE-27 OF, SHALL BE GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR FOR THE FIRST OFFENSE AND UPON CONVICTION THEREFOR SHALL BE FINED NOT LESS THAN FIVE HUNDRED NOR MORE 28 THAN TWENTY THOUSAND DOLLARS OR IMPRISONED FOR NOT MORE THAN ONE YEAR, 29 AND, IN THE EVENT THAT ANY SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE OCCURS WITHIN 30 SIX YEARS OF THE DATE OF CONVICTION FOR A PRIOR OFFENSE, SHALL BE GUILTY 31 32 OF A FELONY FOR THE SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, AND UPON CONVICTION THEREFOR, SHALL BE FINED NOT LESS THAN FIVE HUNDRED NOR MORE THAN TWENTY 33 THOUSAND DOLLARS OR IMPRISONED FOR NOT MORE THAN ONE YEAR PLUS ONE DAY, 34 OR PUNISHED BY BOTH SUCH FINE AND IMPRISONMENT, FOR EACH SUCH OFFENSE. 35 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 36
