AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to leaving the scene of an incident without reporting after injury was caused to another person

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 600 of the vehicle and traffic
2 law, as amended by chapter 49 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as
3 follows:

4 2. [Personal] BODILY injury. a. Any person operating a motor vehicle
5 who, knowing or having cause to know that [personal] BODILY injury has
6 been caused to another person, due to an incident involving the motor
7 vehicle operated by such person shall, before leaving the place where
8 the said [personal] BODILY injury occurred, stop, exhibit his or her
9 license and insurance identification card for such vehicle, when such
10 card is required pursuant to articles six and eight of this chapter, and
11 give his or her name, residence, including street and street number,
12 insurance carrier and insurance identification information including but
13 not limited to the number and effective dates of said individual's
14 insurance policy and license number, to the injured party, if practical,
15 and also to a police officer, or in the event that no police officer is
16 in the vicinity of the place of said injury, then, he or she shall
17 report said incident as soon as physically able to the nearest police
18 station or judicial officer.

19 b. It shall be the duty of any member of a law enforcement agency who
20 is at the scene of the accident to request the said operator or opera-
21 tors of the motor vehicles, when physically capable of doing so, to
22 exchange the information required hereinabove and such member of a law
23 enforcement agency shall assist such operator or operators in making
24 such exchange of information in a reasonable and harmonious manner.

25 c. A violation of the provisions of paragraph a of this subdivision
26 resulting solely from the failure of an operator to exhibit his or her

1 license and insurance identification card for the vehicle or exchange
2 the information required in such paragraph shall constitute a class B
3 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than two hundred fifty nor
4 more than five hundred dollars in addition to any other penalties
5 provided by law. Any subsequent such violation shall constitute a class
6 A misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less than five hundred nor
7 more than one thousand dollars in addition to any other penalties
8 provided by law. Any violation of the provisions of paragraph a of this
9 subdivision, other than for the mere failure of an operator to exhibit
10 his or her license and insurance identification card for such vehicle or
11 exchange the information required in such paragraph, shall constitute a
12 class A misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not less than five hundred
13 dollars nor more than one thousand dollars in addition to any other
14 penalties provided by law. Any such violation committed by a person
15 after such person has previously been convicted of such a violation
16 shall constitute a class E felony, punishable by a fine of not less than
17 one thousand nor more than two thousand five hundred dollars in addition
18 to any other penalties provided by law. Any violation of the provisions
19 of paragraph a of this subdivision, other than for the mere failure of
20 an operator to exhibit his or her license and insurance identification
21 card for such vehicle or exchange the information required in such para-
22 graph, where the [personal] BODILY injury involved (i) results in seri-
23 ous physical injury, as defined in section 10.00 of the penal law, shall
24 constitute a class E felony, punishable by a fine of not less than one
25 thousand nor more than five thousand dollars in addition to any other
26 penalties provided by law, or (ii) results in death shall constitute a
27 class D felony punishable by a fine of not less than two thousand nor
28 more than five thousand dollars in addition to any other penalties
29 provided by law.

30 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
