AN ACT to amend the civil practice law and rules, in relation to required pleadings in actions arising from the conduct of a business required to be licensed by the state

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision (e) of rule 3015 of the civil practice law and rules, as amended by chapter 458 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

(e) License to do business. Where the plaintiff's cause of 5 against a consumer arises from the plaintiff's conduct of a business which is required by state or local law to be licensed by the department 7 of consumer affairs of the city of New York, the Suffolk county depart-8 ment of consumer affairs, the Westchester county department of consumer 9 affairs/weight-measures, the county of Rockland, the county of Putnam or 10 the Nassau county department of consumer affairs, the complaint allege, as part of the cause of action, that plaintiff was duly licensed 11 the time of services rendered and shall contain the name and number, 12 13 if any, of such license and the governmental agency which issued 14 license[; provided, however, that where the plaintiff does not have a 15 license at the commencement of the action the plaintiff may, subject to 16 the provisions of rule thirty hundred twenty-five of this article, amend the complaint with the name and number of an after-acquired license or 17 the previously held license, as the case may be, and the name of the 18 governmental agency which issued such license or move for leave to amend 19 the complaint in accordance with such provisions]. The failure of the 20 21 plaintiff to comply with this subdivision will permit the defendant to 22 move for dismissal pursuant to paragraph seven of subdivision (a) of rule thirty-two hundred eleven of this chapter. 23

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
