AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to establishing the education equity act

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "education 2 equity act". 3 S 2. The education law is amended by adding a new article 66 to read 4 as follows: 5 ARTICLE 66 6 EDUCATION EOUITY ACT 7 SECTION 3300. DEFINITIONS. 8 3301. SCHOOL-BASED LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE PLANS. 9 3302. DETERMINATION OF PRIMARY LANGUAGE. 10 3303. INTERPRETATION SERVICES REQUIRED. 11 3304. TRANSLATION SERVICES REQUIRED. 3305. NOTICE TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS. 12 3306. CERTIFICATION OF TRANSLATION. 13 14 3307. DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION WEBSITE. 3308. REPORTING. 15 16 3309. GENERAL PROVISIONS. 17 3300. DEFINITIONS. WHEREVER USED IN THIS ARTICLE, THE FOLLOWING S TERMS SHALL HAVE THE RESPECTIVE MEANINGS HEREINAFTER SET FORTH OR INDI-18 19 CATED: 20 1. COVERED LANGUAGES. THE TERM "COVERED LANGUAGES" MEANS TWO OF THE 21 MOST COMMONLY SPOKEN LANGUAGES, OTHER THAN ENGLISH, BEING SPOKEN BY AT LEAST TWO PERCENT, ROUNDED TO THE NEAREST PERCENTILE, OF THE POPULATION 22 IN A SCHOOL DISTRICT WITHIN A CITY, VILLAGE OR TOWN HAVING A POPULATION 23 EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

LESS THAN ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND INHABITANTS, TWO OF THE 1 OF 2 MOST COMMONLY SPOKEN LANGUAGES, OTHER THAN ENGLISH, BEING SPOKEN BY AT 3 LEAST TWO PERCENT, ROUNDED TO THE NEAREST PERCENTILE, OF THE POPULATION 4 IN A SCHOOL DISTRICT WITHIN A CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE HUNDRED 5 TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND INHABITANTS OR MORE, EIGHT OF THE MOST COMMONLY SPOKEN LANGUAGES, OTHER THAN ENGLISH, BEING SPOKEN IN A COMMUNITY б 7 DISTRICT, AS DEFINED IN ARTICLE FIFTY-TWO-A OF THIS CHAPTER, WITHIN A 8 CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE MILLION OR MORE INHABITANTS. 15 2. PRIMARY LANGUAGE. THE TERM "PRIMARY LANGUAGE" MEANS THE PRIMARY 16 LANGUAGE SPOKEN BY A STUDENT'S PARENTS OR GUARDIANS, AS EXPRESSED TO THE 17 DEPARTMENT BY SUCH PARENTS OR GUARDIANS.

18 3. SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE TERM "SCHOOL DISTRICT" MEANS EACH SCHOOL 19 DISTRICT WITHIN THE STATE OF NEW YORK INCLUDING THOSE WITHIN A CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE THOUSAND OR MORE INHABIT-20 21 ANTS AND EACH COMMUNITY DISTRICT OF THE CITY DISTRICT, AS DEFINED IN ARTICLE FIFTY-TWO-A OF THIS CHAPTER. SCHOOL DISTRICT FURTHER MEANS THE 22 23 OFFICE OR AGENCY DESIGNATED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO ADMINISTER THE 24 PROGRAM SET FORTH IN THIS ARTICLE.

4. SCHOOL. THE TERM "SCHOOL" MEANS ANY PUBLIC SCHOOL WITHIN THE JURIS-DICTION OF ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION THREE OF THIS SECTION.

5. TRANSLATION. THE TERM "TRANSLATION" MEANS THE ACT OF COMMUNICATION
BETWEEN SPEAKERS OF TWO OR MORE COVERED LANGUAGES WHEREIN THE WRITTEN
WORDS OF ONE PERSON ARE COMMUNICATED TO OTHERS IN WRITING IN A DIFFERENT
LANGUAGE.

32 S 3301. SCHOOL-BASED LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE PLANS. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL ANNUALLY PREPARE A LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE PLAN WHICH SHALL CONTAIN, 33 34 AT A MINIMUM, AN ASSESSMENT OF THE LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE NEEDS OF THE 35 SCHOOL DISTRICT, THE ABILITY OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO FULFILL SUCH NEEDS AND THE RESOURCES REQUIRED FOR THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO FULFILL SUCH 36 37 NEEDS. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL COLLECT AND REVIEW SUCH LANGUAGE 38 ASSISTANCE PLANS AT A DATE SUFFICIENTLY EARLY IN EACH FISCAL YEAR TO BE ABLE TO CONSIDER THE CONTENTS OF SUCH PLANS IN FORMULATING SCHOOL-BASED 39 40 BUDGETS FOR THE COMING FISCAL YEAR.

41 S 3302. DETERMINATION OF PRIMARY LANGUAGE. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL 42 DETERMINE, UPON ENROLLMENT OR WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF ENROLLMENT, THE 43 PRIMARY LANGUAGE SPOKEN BY THE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF EACH STUDENT 44 ENROLLED IN A PUBLIC SCHOOL WITHIN SUCH DISTRICT AND WHETHER, IF SUCH 45 LANGUAGE IS NOT ENGLISH, SUCH PARENT OR GUARDIAN REQUIRES LANGUAGE 46 ASSISTANCE SERVICES IN ORDER TO COMMUNICATE EFFECTIVELY WITH THE SCHOOL 47 DISTRICT.

48 S 3303. INTERPRETATION SERVICES REQUIRED. 1. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT 49 SHALL ENSURE THAT DURING REGULAR BUSINESS HOURS A SUFFICIENT NUMBER OF 50 ARE AVAILABLE BY TELEPHONE TO PROVIDE INTERPRETATION INDIVIDUALS SERVICES IN EACH OF THE COVERED LANGUAGES TO MEET THE EXPECTED NEEDS OF 51 PARENTS OR GUARDIANS WHO SEEK TO COMMUNICATE WITH THEIR CHILD'S SCHOOL. 52 WHERE RESOURCES ALLOW, SUCH SERVICES SHALL ALSO BE AVAILABLE THROUGH 53 54 STAFF MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE PRESENT AT SCHOOLS, REGIONAL OR OTHER DEPART-55 MENTAL OFFICES, AND OTHER LOCATIONS WHERE PARENTS AND GUARDIANS MAY INTERACT WITH THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, BUT MAY BE PROVIDED AT SUCH LOCATIONS 56

1 BY TELEPHONE IN THE EVENT THAT A PERSON FLUENT IN THE NECESSARY COVERED 2 LANGUAGE IS NOT AVAILABLE AT SUCH LOCATION.

3 2. FOR CITIES HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE MILLION OR MORE INHABITANTS, 4 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE INTERPRETATION SERVICES AT MEETINGS OF THE 5 PANEL FOR EDUCATIONAL POLICY EVENTS AT WHICH FOUR HUNDRED OR MORE 6 PERSONS ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND AND MEETINGS OR EVENTS AT WHICH THE 7 DEPARTMENT REASONABLY BELIEVES THAT TEN PERCENT OR MORE OF THE PERSONS 8 EXPECTED TO ATTEND SPEAK PRIMARY LANGUAGES THAT ARE COVERED LANGUAGES 9 OTHER THAN ENGLISH. SUCH INTERPRETATION SERVICES SHALL BE PROVIDED IN 10 WHICHEVER OF THE COVERED LANGUAGES THE DEPARTMENT EXPECTS WILL BE SPOKEN AS THE PRIMARY LANGUAGE OF THE PERSONS ATTENDING SUCH MEETING OR EVENT. 11

12 S 3304. TRANSLATION SERVICES REQUIRED. 1. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL 13 TRANSLATE THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS INTO EACH OF THE COVERED LANGUAGES AND 14 DISSEMINATE SUCH DOCUMENTS TO EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL WITHIN SUCH DISTRICT 15 FOR DISSEMINATION TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS IN WHICHEVER OF THE COVERED 16 LANGUAGES, IF ANY, IS THEIR PRIMARY LANGUAGE, AS DETERMINED BY SUCH 17 DISTRICT PURSUANT TO SECTION THIRTY-THREE HUNDRED TWO OF THIS ARTICLE: 18 A. THE STANDARDIZED TEXT ON REPORT CARDS AND PERMISSION SLIPS; AND

B. DOCUMENTS DISSEMINATED TO ONE THOUSAND OR MORE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS THAT REQUIRE A PARENT OR GUARDIAN TO RESPOND TO THE DEPARTMENT, OR THAT REQUIRE A PARENT OR GUARDIAN TO TAKE AN ACTION IN ORDER TO OBTAIN OR PRESERVE A RIGHT OR BENEFIT WITH RESPECT TO THEIR CHILD'S EDUCATION, OR THAT PROVIDE NOTIFICATION OF AN UPCOMING EVENT THAT CONCERNS THEIR CHILD'S EDUCATION.

WITH RESPECT TO ANY DOCUMENT THAT THE SCHOOL DISTRICT PRODUCES FOR 26 DISTRIBUTION TO ALL OR SUBSTANTIALLY ALL PARENTS AND GUARDIANS OF STUDENTS IN SUCH SCHOOL DISTRICT AND THAT IT DOES NOT DISTRIBUTE TO ALL 27 PARENTS OR GUARDIANS IN THE PRIMARY LANGUAGE OF SUCH PARENTS OR GUARDI-28 29 ANS, AS DETERMINED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT PURSUANT TO SECTION THIRTY-THREE HUNDRED TWO OF THIS ARTICLE, AND WHICH DOCUMENT CONCERNS 30 DISCIPLINE OR STUDENTS' HEALTH, SAFETY, RIGHT TO ATTEND SCHOOL OR ANY 31 32 OTHER LEGAL RIGHT GRANTED TO STUDENTS OR TO THE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS BY 33 LOCAL, CITY, STATE OR FEDERAL LAW, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL PROVIDE EITHER A COVER LETTER OR A STATEMENT ON THE FACE OF SUCH DOCUMENT, INDI-34 CATING IN EACH COVERED LANGUAGE HOW TO OBTAIN A FREE TRANSLATION OR 35 INTERPRETATION OF SUCH DOCUMENT FROM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT. 36

3. WITH RESPECT TO ANY DOCUMENT NOT PREPARED FOR BROAD DISTRIBUTION 37 THAT CONCERNS AN INDIVIDUAL STUDENT'S HEALTH, SAFETY, LEGAL OR DISCIPLI-38 39 NARY MATTER, RIGHT TO CONTINUE TO RECEIVE PUBLIC EDUCATION OR PLACEMENT 40 ANY SPECIAL EDUCATION, ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNER OR NON-STANDARD IN ACADEMIC PROGRAM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL, IF NOT REQUIRED TO DO OTHER-41 WISE BY STATE OR FEDERAL LAW, RULE OR REGULATION, PROVIDE SUCH STUDENT'S 42 43 PARENTS OR GUARDIANS WHOSE PRIMARY LANGUAGE IS A COVERED LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH WITH A TRANSLATION OF SUCH DOCUMENT INTO THE APPROPRIATE 44 45 COVERED LANGUAGE, OR SHALL PROVIDE EITHER A COVER LETTER OR A STATEMENT ON THE FACE OF THE DOCUMENT, INDICATING IN THE APPROPRIATE COVERED 46 LANGUAGE HOW TO OBTAIN A FREE TRANSLATION OR INTERPRETATION OF SUCH 47 48 DOCUMENT FROM THE SCHOOL DISTRICT.

EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL PROVIDE A MECHANISM BY WHICH ITS PUBLIC 50 SCHOOL EMPLOYEES CAN FAX DOCUMENTS OF A REASONABLE LENGTH TO A PERSON OR 51 SERVICE AND RECEIVE BACK A TRANSLATION OF SUCH DOCUMENTS IN ACCORDANCE 52 WITH THE SENDER'S INSTRUCTIONS. SUCH MECHANISM SHALL BE DESIGNED SUCH 53 THAT, UNDER ORDINARY CIRCUMSTANCES, A PRINCIPAL OR TEACHER CAN OBTAIN A 54 TRANSLATION OF A SINGLE-PAGE NOTE OR LETTER WITHIN TWENTY-FOUR HOURS OR 55 BY THE CONCLUSION OF THE NEXT BUSINESS DAY, WHICHEVER IS LATER.

S 3305. NOTICE TO PARENTS AND GUARDIANS. 1. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL 1 PREPARE IN EACH OF THE COVERED LANGUAGES A SHORT, CONCISE DOCUMENT 2 3 SETTING FORTH THE RIGHTS OF PARENTS AND GUARDIANS WITH RESPECT TO TRANS-4 LATION AND INTERPRETATION SERVICES AS REQUIRED BY THIS ARTICLE AND BY 5 OTHER APPLICABLE LAW, RULE OR REGULATION, AND EXPLAINING HOW TO ANY 6 OBTAIN SUCH SERVICES. SUCH DOCUMENT SHALL BE PROVIDED, IN THE APPROPRI-7 ATE COVERED LANGUAGE, IF ANY, TO EACH PARENT OR GUARDIAN WHO, AS DETER-8 MINED BY THE LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT PURSUANT TO SECTION THIRTY-THREE HUNDRED TWO OF THIS ARTICLE, REQUIRES LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES. 9 10 COPIES OF SUCH DOCUMENT IN EACH COVERED LANGUAGE SHALL BE PLACED IN EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL OR OFFICE TO WHICH THE PUBLIC HAS ACCESS IN SUFFICIENT 11 OUANTITY THAT IT CAN BE PROVIDED TO ANY MEMBER OF THE PUBLIC WHO ENTERS 12 SUCH SCHOOL OR OFFICE AND REQUIRES LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE SERVICES. 13

IN A CONSPICUOUS LOCATION IN EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL, SCHOOL DISTRICT OFFICE
OR OTHER DEPARTMENTAL OFFICE BUILDING TO WHICH THE PUBLIC HAS ACCESS,
INDICATING THE AVAILABILITY AND LOCATION IN SUCH SCHOOL OR BUILDING OF
THE DOCUMENT REQUIRED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION.

S. IN THE EVENT THAT THE SCHOOL DISTRICT DETERMINES THAT TEN PERCENT
 OR MORE OF THE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF THE STUDENTS ATTENDING ANY INDI VIDUAL SCHOOL SPEAK A PRIMARY LANGUAGE THAT IS NOT A COVERED LANGUAGE,

BE CONSTRUED AS PROHIBITING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM EXCEEDING 31 THE 32 MANDATES OF THIS ARTICLE, FROM RELYING UPON THE RESOURCES OF OTHER CITY, 33 STATE OR FEDERAL AGENCIES, OR FROM TRANSLATING DOCUMENTS INTO, OR PROVIDING INTERPRETATION SERVICES IN, LANGUAGES OTHER THAN 34 THE COVERED 35 LANGUAGES. 4. BE CONSTRUED AS PROHIBITING THE SCHOOL DISTRICT FROM UTILIZING 36 37 BOCES AS A DESIGNATED AGENCY TO ADMINISTER THE PROGRAM SET FORTH IN THIS 38 ARTICLE OR AS A SOURCE OF FINANCIAL AID FOR SUCH PROGRAM. 39 5. REQUIRE THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO TRANSLATE DOCUMENTS OR PROVIDE 40 INTERPRETATION FOR MATTERS THAT DO NOT CONCERN A STUDENT'S EDUCATION, OR THAT ARE PROLIX OR ARE UNINTELLIGIBLE. 41 THE SCHOOL DISTRICT TO TRANSLATE OR INTERPRET LEGAL DOCU-42 REOUIRE 6. 43 MENTS NOT OTHERWISE REQUIRED TO BE TRANSLATED BY THIS CHAPTER, INCLUD-44 ING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, LEGAL DOCUMENTS GENERATED BY OR FOR USE IN A 45 PROCEEDING NOT HELD BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, EXCEPT TO PROVIDE UPON REQUEST A GENERAL EXPLANATION OF THE NATURE OF SUCH DOCUMENTS IF SUCH 46 47 DOCUMENTS CONCERN THE PUBLIC EDUCATION OF THE PARENT'S OR GUARDIAN'S 48 CHILD. S 3. Severability clause. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivi-49 50 sion, section or part of this act shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect, 51 impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in 52 its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section 53 54 or part thereof directly involved in the controversy in which such judg-55 ment shall have been rendered. It is hereby declared to be the intent of 56 the legislature that this act would have been enacted even if such

invalid provisions had not been included herein provided it does not materially alter the effect of this legislation. S 4. This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day after it shall have become a law.
