AN ACT to amend the legislative law, in relation to establishing the New York state independent budget office

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The legislative law is amended by adding a new article 4-B 1 2 to read as follows: 3 ARTICLE 4-B 4 NEW YORK STATE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE 5 SECTION 75. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE NEW YORK STATE INDEPENDENT BUDGET б OFFICE. 7 76. DIRECTOR OF THE NEW YORK STATE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE. 8 75. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE NEW YORK STATE INDEPENDENT BUDGET S OFFICE. THERE SHALL HEREBY BE ESTABLISHED A NEW YORK STATE 9 INDEPENDENT 10 BUDGET OFFICE. 1. IT SHALL BE THE DUTY OF THE NEW YORK STATE INDEPEND-11 ENT BUDGET OFFICE TO PROVIDE THE MEMBERS AND COMMITTEES OF THE LEGISLA-12 TURE WITH INFORMATION WHICH WILL ASSIST SUCH OFFICIALS AND BODIES IN THE 13 DISCHARGE OF THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES WHICH ARE RELATED TO THE BUDGETARY 14 PROCESS INCLUDING: (A) INFORMATION WITH RESPECT TO THE BUDGET, APPROPRIATIONS BILLS 15 AND 16 PROPOSED LAWS WITH FISCAL IMPLICATIONS; 17 INFORMATION WITH RESPECT TO ESTIMATED REVENUES AND RECEIPTS, AND (B) 18 CHANGING REVENUE CONDITIONS; (C) INFORMATION WITH RESPECT TO THE PERFORMANCE AND EFFECTIVENESS OF 19 20 STATE AGENCIES AND PROGRAMS; AND EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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1 (D) TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, SUCH OTHER INFORMATION OR ANALYSES AS 2 MAY BE REQUESTED BY SUCH OFFICIALS AND BODIES, AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

3 REQUESTS MADE BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT 4 OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIR OF THE ASSEMBLY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AND 5 THE CHAIR OF THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE REGARDING THE BUDGET, REVENUES 6 AND EXPENDITURES SHALL RECEIVE PRIORITY ATTENTION.

7 THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL COMPLETE A FISCAL IMPACT 2. 8 STATEMENT: (A) FOR ANY BILL BEING CONSIDERED ON AN ASSEMBLY WAYS AND 9 MEANS COMMITTEE AGENDA OR A SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE AGENDA, TO THE 10 EXTENT POSSIBLE; (B) FOR ANY BILL AT THE REQUEST OF THE SPEAKER OR MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY OR THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OR MINORITY 11 LEADER OF THE SENATE; AND (C) AT THE REQUEST OF A COMMITTEE CHAIR 12 OR RANKING MEMBER OF A COMMITTEE FOR ANY BILL REFERRED TO THEIR RESPECTIVE 13 14 COMMITTEE. FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENTS SHALL ESTIMATE THE IMPACT ON STATE 15 REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES.

16 3. THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL SUBMIT AN ANALYSIS OF THE 17 EXECUTIVE BUDGET BY MARCH FIRST OF EACH YEAR TO THE MEMBERS OF THE 18 ASSEMBLY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AND THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE, AND 19 MAKE COPIES OF SUCH ANALYSIS AVAILABLE TO ALL OTHER MEMBERS OF THE 20 LEGISLATURE AND ALL OTHER INDIVIDUALS, UPON REQUEST.

4. THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL, TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE,
DEVELOP PROPOSALS FOR COST EFFECTIVE ALTERNATIVE APPROACHES TO MEET THE
PUBLIC RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE STATE.

5. THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL PUBLISH A REPORT WITH RESPECT
TO THE EXPECTED LEVELS OF STATE REVENUES BY THE FIRST DAY OF JANUARY,
THE FIRST DAY OF APRIL, THE FIRST DAY OF JULY AND THE FIRST DAY OF OCTOBER OF EACH YEAR.

28 6. THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL PUBLISH BY DECEMBER FIRST OF 29 EACH YEAR A REPORT ANALYZING THE FISCAL OUTLOOK OF THE STATE FOR THE 30 NEXT FIVE YEARS.

INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL, FROM TIME TO TIME, PUBLISH 31 THE 7. 32 SUCH REPORTS AS MAY BE APPROPRIATE TO ENHANCE THE OFFICIAL AND PUBLIC 33 UNDERSTANDING OF THE BUDGETARY PROCESS AND OF THE BUDGET DOCUMENTS. SUCH 34 OFFICE SHALL, FROM TIME TO TIME, PUBLISH SUCH REPORTS AS MAY BE NECES-SARY OR APPROPRIATE TO PROVIDE SUCH INFORMATION, DATA AND ANALYSIS AS 35 WILL ENHANCE OFFICIAL AND PUBLIC UNDERSTANDING OF MATTERS RELATING TO 36 37 STATE REVENUES, EXPENDITURES, MANAGEMENT PRACTICES AND RELATED MATTERS.

8. THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE MAY PROCURE UP-TO-DATE COMPUTER BEQUIPMENT, OBTAIN THE SERVICES OF EXPERTS AND CONSULTANTS IN COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY, AND DEVELOP TECHNIQUES FOR THE EVALUATION OF REVENUE PROJEC-TIONS AND BUDGETARY REQUIREMENTS.

9. ALL INFORMATION, DATA, ESTIMATES AND STATISTICS, AND ALL STUDIES
AND REPORTS PREPARED BY THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL BE MADE
AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC AND SHALL ALSO BE MADE AVAILABLE BY ELECTRONIC
MEANS OVER THE INTERNET.

DIRECTOR OF THE NEW YORK STATE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE. 1. 46 76. S 47 THE NEW YORK STATE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL BE HEADED BY A DIREC-48 TOR WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED, UPON THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF AN INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE, BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY AND THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE. THE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR THE INITIAL 49 50 51 APPOINTMENT OF SUCH DIRECTOR SHALL BE MADE NO LATER THAN JANUARY FIFTEENTH OF THE SECOND YEAR FOLLOWING THE ENACTMENT OF THIS ARTICLE TO 52 THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE. SUBSEQUENT RECOMMENDATIONS SHALL BE MADE BETWEEN 53 54 JANUARY SECOND AND JANUARY FIFTEENTH EVERY SIXTH YEAR THEREAFTER. THE 55 SPECIAL COMMITTEE SHALL APPOINT THE INITIAL DIRECTOR NO LATER THAN 56 FEBRUARY FIFTEENTH OF THE SECOND YEAR FOLLOWING THE ENACTMENT OF THIS

ARTICLE AND SUCH INITIAL DIRECTOR SHALL TAKE OFFICE BEGINNING APRIL
 FIRST OF THE SECOND YEAR FOLLOWING THE ENACTMENT OF THIS ARTICLE.
 SUBSEQUENT APPOINTMENTS SHALL BE MADE NO LATER THAN FEBRUARY FIFTEENTH
 EVERY SIXTH YEAR THEREAFTER.

(A) THERE SHALL BE AN INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE 6 CONSISTING OF (I) ONE PERSON APPOINTED BY EACH OF THE FOLLOWING OFFI-7 CIALS AND WHO SHALL SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF SUCH OFFICIALS; THE CHAIR 8 AND RANKING MEMBER OF THE ASSEMBLY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AND THE CHAIR AND RANKING MEMBER OF THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE, AND (II) SIX 9 10 OTHER MEMBERS JOINTLY APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY AND THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, WHO SHALL SERVE FOR SIX YEAR TERMS, 11 PROVIDED, HOWEVER THAT OF THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED, TWO SHALL SERVE 12 FOR TERMS EXPIRING ON MARCH THIRTY-FIRST, OF THE SECOND YEAR FOLLOWING 13 14 THE ENACTMENT OF THIS ARTICLE; TWO SHALL SERVE FOR TERMS EXPIRING ON MARCH THIRTY-FIRST, OF THE FOURTH YEAR FOLLOWING THE ENACTMENT OF THIS 15 16 ARTICLE; AND TWO SHALL SERVE FOR TERMS EXPIRING ON MARCH THIRTY-FIRST, OF THE SIXTH YEAR FOLLOWING THE ENACTMENT OF THIS ARTICLE. THE MEMBERS 17 SHALL ALL BE INDIVIDUALS WITH EXTENSIVE EXPERIENCE AND KNOWLEDGE IN THE 18 FIELDS OF FINANCE, ECONOMICS, ACCOUNTING, PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION AND PUBLIC POLICY ANALYSIS INCLUDING AT LEAST ONE NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED 19 20 21 EXPERT IN THE FIELDS OF BUDGET THEORY AND THE BUDGET PROCESS; ONE DEAN OR DIRECTOR OR FORMER DEAN OR DIRECTOR OF A GRADUATE SCHOOL OF BUSINESS 22 ADMINISTRATION, PUBLIC AFFAIRS OR PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION LOCATED IN NEW 23 YORK STATE; ONE OFFICER OR FORMER OFFICER OR ECONOMIC ADVISOR OF A LABOR 24 25 UNION; ONE OFFICER OR FORMER OFFICER OR ECONOMIC ADVISOR TO A BUSINESS 26 CORPORATION; AND ONE OFFICER OR FORMER OFFICER OF A CIVIC OR PUBLIC INTEREST ADVOCACY ORGANIZATION INVOLVED IN BUDGET MATTERS. NO INDIVID-27 28 UAL SHALL SERVE CONSECUTIVE TERMS.

(B) THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL DEVELOP
GUIDELINES FOR THE BEST PRACTICES OF THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE. THE
INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL MEET ANNUALLY WITH
THE DIRECTOR TO REVIEW SUCH GUIDELINES AND TO MAKE COMMENTS AND
SUGGESTIONS ON THE OVERALL PRACTICES OF THE OFFICE.

34 (C) MEMBERS OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL RECEIVE NO COMPENSATION
 35 BUT SHALL BE REIMBURSED FOR REASONABLE EXPENSES INCURRED IN CONNECTION
 36 WITH THEIR DUTIES.

3. THE DIRECTOR OF THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL BE APPOINTED 37 38 WITHOUT REGARD TO POLITICAL AFFILIATION AND SOLELY ON THE BASIS OF 39 FITNESS TO PERFORM THE DUTIES ASSIGNED BY THIS ARTICLE. THE TERM OF 40 OFFICE OF THE DIRECTOR FIRST APPOINTED SHALL EXPIRE ON FEBRUARY FIFTEENTH, OF THE SIXTH YEAR FOLLOWING THE ENACTMENT OF THIS ARTICLE AND 41 TERMS OF OFFICE OF DIRECTORS SUBSEQUENTLY APPOINTED SHALL EXPIRE ON 42 THE 43 SUCH DATE IN EACH SIXTH YEAR THEREAFTER. ANY INDIVIDUAL APPOINTED TO FILL A VACANCY PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF A TERM SHALL SERVE ONLY FOR 44 45 THE UNEXPIRED PORTION OF SUCH TERM. AN INDIVIDUAL SERVING AS DIRECTOR AT THE EXPIRATION OF THE TERM MAY CONTINUE TO SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS 46 47 ANY DIRECTOR SERVING CONSECUTIVE TERMS SHALL BE RECOMMENDED APPOINTED. BY THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND APPOINTED BY THE 48 SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY AND THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE FOR 49 50 THE SECOND TERM. NO DIRECTOR SHALL SERVE MORE THAN TWO TERMS CONSEC-51 UTIVELY.

4. TEN PERCENT OF THE APPROPRIATIONS MADE TO THE DIVISION OF THE BUDGET SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO PAY FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET
OFFICE DURING EACH FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING WITH THE FIRST DAY OF APRIL
AFTER THIS SECTION SHALL HAVE BECOME A LAW. THE DIRECTOR OF THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL APPOINT SUCH PERSONNEL AND PROCURE THE

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SERVICES OF SUCH EXPERTS AND CONSULTANTS, WITHIN THE APPROPRIATIONS

2 AVAILABLE THEREFOR, AS MAY BE NECESSARY FOR SUCH DIRECTOR TO CARRY OUT 3 THE DUTIES AND FUNCTIONS ASSIGNED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE. SUCH 4 PERSONNEL AND EXPERTS SHALL PERFORM SUCH DUTIES AS MAY BE ASSIGNED TO 5 THEM BY THE DIRECTOR.

5. THE DIRECTOR OF THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE SHALL HAVE ACCESS AT 6 7 ALL REASONABLE TIMES TO OFFICES OF STATE DEPARTMENTS, COMMISSIONS, BOARDS, BUREAUS AND OFFICES, TO INSTITUTIONS AND TO ALL STATE AUTHORI-TIES AND PUBLIC WORKS OF THE STATE AND THEY MAY, FOR THE PURPOSE OF 8 9 10 OBTAINING INFORMATION AS TO THE METHOD OF OPERATION, GENERAL CONDITION, MANAGEMENT AND NEEDS THEREOF, EXAMINE THE BOOKS, PAPERS AND PUBLIC 11 RECORDS THEREIN. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW SUCH STATE 12 DEPARTMENTS, COMMISSIONS, BOARDS, BUREAUS, OFFICES, STATE AUTHORITIES 13 14 AND INSTITUTIONS SHALL, THROUGH THEIR PROPER OFFICERS OR DEPUTIES, FURNISH TO THE DIRECTOR SUCH DATA, INFORMATION OR STATEMENTS AS MAY BE 15 NECESSARY FOR THE PROPER EXERCISE OF HIS OR HER POWERS AND DUTIES AND 16 FOR THE PURPOSE OF CARRYING INTO EFFECT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE. 17 6. THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL DETERMINE 18 19 THE SALARY OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE INDEPENDENT BUDGET OFFICE. S 2. This act shall take effect immediately. 20
