- AN ACT to amend the general obligations law, in relation to the duty to keep premises safe for certain uses and enacting the "equine activity safety code act"

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 9-103 of the general obligations law, as amended by 2 chapter 408 of the laws of 1979, paragraph a of subdivision 1 as sepa-3 rately amended by chapters 141 and 286 of the laws of 1984 and paragraph 4 c of subdivision 1 as added by chapter 174 of the laws of 1980, is 5 amended to read as follows:

S 9-103. No duty to keep premises safe for certain uses; responsibil-6 7 ity for acts of such users. 1. THE LEGISLATURE REAFFIRMS THE PURPOSE OF 8 THIS SECTION WHICH IS TO ENCOURAGE PROPERTY OWNERS TO MAKE LAND AND 9 WATER AREAS AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC FOR RECREATIONAL OR CONSERVATION PURPOSES BY LIMITING THEIR POTENTIAL LIABILITY EXPOSURE 10 TOWARD PERSONS THEREON FOR SUCH PURPOSES. ITS PROVISIONS SHOULD BE CONSTRUED 11 ENTERING 12 TO ACCOMPLISH THOSE OBJECTIVES.

13 1-A. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN THIS SECTION:

A. "LANDS USED IN AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION" MEANS LAND AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION FOUR OF SECTION THREE HUNDRED ONE OF THE AGRICULTURE AND MARKETS LAW, EXCEPT THAT THE PARCEL OF LAND MAY BE LESS THAN TEN ACRES AND STILL QUALIFY.

18 B. "OWNER, LESSEE, OR OCCUPANT" MEANS ANY PERSON ENTITLED TO THE 19 EXCLUSIVE OR NON-EXCLUSIVE USE OR POSSESSION OF THE PREMISES, INCLUDING 20 HOLDERS OF CONSERVATION AND TRAIL EASEMENTS.

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets
[] is old law to be omitted.

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"UNDEVELOPED PREMISES" MEANS PROPERTY EXISTING IN ITS NATURALLY 1 C. 2 OCCURRING STATE, WITHOUT STRUCTURES, IMPROVEMENTS OR MANMADE OBJECTS 3 CONSTRUCTED, SITUATED OR PLACED ON THE PROPERTY BY THE OWNER, LESSEE, 4 OCCUPANT OR OTHER PERSONS. IF PROPERTY CONTAINS BOTH UNDEVELOPED AND 5 DEVELOPED AREAS, THE OWNER, LESSEE OR OCCUPANT OWES NO DUTY TO KEEP THE 6 UNDEVELOPED PORTION OF THE PREMISES SAFE FOR ENTRY OR USE BY OTHERS FOR 7 RECREATIONAL PURPOSES, BUT NOTHING IN THIS SECTION AFFECTS OR ALTERS THE 8 LIABILITY OF SUCH OWNER, LESSEE OR OCCUPANT TO OTHERS WHO ENTER UPON THE 9 DEVELOPED PORTION OF THE PREMISES. UNDEVELOPED LAND MAY INCLUDE A 10 CLEARED PATH IF IT IS NOT PAVED AND THE PATH SHALL NOT CEASE ТО BE 11 "UNDEVELOPED" BECAUSE ITS CREATION OR MAINTENANCE REQUIRES MINOR ALTER-12 ATION OF LANDSCAPE. LAND DOES NOT CEASE TO BE "UNDEVELOPED" IF THE ONLY IS THE PLANTING AND MAINTENANCE OF FLORA, INCLUDING 13 MANMADE ALTERATION 14 TREES, SHRUBS, FLOWERS, OR GRASS.

15 2. Except as provided in subdivision [two] THREE OF THIS SECTION,

16 a. an owner, lessee or occupant of UNDEVELOPED premises OR OF LAND IN AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION, whether or not posted as provided in 17 USED section 11-2111 of the environmental conservation law, AND WHETHER OR 18 19 NOT A FARM, owes no duty to keep the premises safe for entry or use by others for ANY RECREATIONAL USE, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO hunting, 20 organized gleaning as defined in section seventy-one-y of the 21 fishing, agriculture and markets law, canoeing, boating, trapping, hiking, cross-22 23 country skiing, tobogganing, sledding, speleological activities, horse-24 back riding, bicycle riding, hang gliding, motorized vehicle operation 25 for recreational purposes, snowmobile operation, cutting or gathering of 26 wood for non-commercial purposes or training of dogs, or to give warning of any hazardous condition or use of or structure or activity on such 27 28 premises to persons entering for such purposes;

b. an owner, lessee or occupant of premises who gives permission to another to pursue any such activities upon such premises does not thereby (1) extend any assurance that the premises are safe for such purpose, or (2) constitute the person to whom permission is granted an invitee to whom a duty of care is owed, or (3) assume responsibility for or incur liability for any injury to person or property caused by any act of persons to whom the permission is granted.

c. an owner, lessee or occupant of a farm, as defined in section 36 six 37 hundred seventy-one of the labor law, whether or not posted as provided in section 11-2111 of the environmental conservation law, owes 38 no duty 39 to keep such farm safe for entry or use by a person who enters or 40 remains in or upon such farm without consent or privilege, or to qive warning of any hazardous condition or use of or structure or activity on 41 such farm to persons so entering or remaining. This shall not be inter-42 43 preted, or construed, as a limit on liability for acts of gross negli-44 gence in addition to those other acts referred to in subdivision [two] 45 THREE of this section.

46 [2.] 3. This section does not limit the liability which would other-47 wise exist:

48 a. for willful or malicious failure to guard, or to warn against, a
49 dangerous condition, use, structure or activity; or
50 b. for injury suffered in any case where permission to pursue any of

50 b. for injury suffered in any case where permission to pursue any of 51 the activities enumerated in this section was granted for a consider-52 ation other than the consideration, if any, paid to said landowner by 53 the state or federal government, or permission to train dogs was granted 54 for a consideration other than that provided for in section 11-0925 of 55 the environmental conservation law; or

c. for injury caused, by acts of persons to whom permission to pursue any of the activities enumerated in this section was granted, to other 1 2 3 persons as to whom the person granting permission, or the owner, lessee 4 or occupant of the premises, owed a duty to keep the premises safe or to 5 warn of danger. 6 Nothing in this section creates a duty of care or ground of [3.] 4. 7 liability for injury to person or property. 8 5. NO CAUSE OF ACTION SHALL ARISE AGAINST THE OWNER, TENANT OR LESSEE 9 LAND OR PREMISES FOR INJURIES TO ANY PERSON, OTHER THAN AN EMPLOYEE OF 10 OR CONTRACTOR OF THE OWNER, TENANT OR LESSEE, WHO IS ON THE LAND OR PREMISES FOR THE PURPOSE OF PICKING AND PURCHASING AGRICULTURAL OR FARM 11 12 PRODUCTS AT A FARM OR "U-PICK" OPERATION, UNLESS THE PERSON'S INJURIES WERE CAUSED BY A CONDITION WHICH INVOLVED AN UNREASONABLE RISK OF HARM 13 14 AND ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY: 15 A. THE OWNER, TENANT OR LESSEE KNEW, HAD REASON TO KNOW OF, OR REASON-ABLY SHOULD HAVE KNOWN OF THE CONDITION OR RISK. 16 17 B. THE OWNER, TENANT OR LESSEE FAILED TO EXERCISE REASONABLE CARE TO MAKE THE CONDITION SAFE, OR TO WARN THE PERSON OF THE CONDITION OR RISK. 18 19 The general obligations law is amended by adding a new article S 2. 20 18-B to read as follows: 21 ARTICLE 18-B 22 EQUINE ACTIVITY SAFETY CODE 23 SECTION 18-301. "ENGAGES ASSISTING 33 VETERINARY TREATMENT OF, DRIVING, OR BEING A PASSENGER UPON AN INEQUINE, WHETHER MOUNTED OR UNMOUNTED, VISITING OR TOURING OR UTILIZING 34 35 AN EQUINE FACILITY AS PART OF AN ORGANIZED EVENT OR ACTIVITY, OR ANY PERSON ASSISTING A PARTICIPANT OR SHOW MANAGEMENT. THE TERM "ENGAGES IN 36 37 AN EQUINE ACTIVITY" DOES NOT INCLUDE BEING A SPECTATOR AT AN EQUINE 38 ACTIVITY, EXCEPT IN CASES WHERE THE SPECTATOR PLACES HIMSELF IN AN UNAU-39 THORIZED AREA OR IN IMMEDIATE PROXIMITY TO THE EQUINE ACTIVITY. 40 2. "EOUINE" MEANS A HORSE, PONY, MULE OR DONKEY. 3. "EQUINE ACTIVITY" MEANS: 41 (A) EQUINE SHOWS, FAIRS, COMPETITIONS, PERFORMANCES OR PARADES 42 THAT 43 ANY OR ALL BREEDS OF EQUINES AND ANY OF THE EQUINE DISCIPLINES, INVOLVE 44 INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO DRESSAGE, HUNTER AND JUMPER HORSE SHOWS, 45 GRAND PRIX JUMPING, THREE-DAY EVENTS, COMBINED TRAINING, RODEOS, RIDING, DRIVING, PULLING, CUTTING, POLO, STEEPLECHASING, ENGLISH AND WESTERN 46 47 PERFORMANCE RIDING, ENDURANCE TRAIL RIDING, GYMKHANA GAMES, AND HUNTING. 48 (B) EQUINE TRAINING OR TEACHING ACTIVITIES OR BOTH. 49 (C) THE BOARDING OF EQUINES; INCLUDING NORMAL DAILY CARE THEREOF. 50 RIDING, INSPECTING OR EVALUATING BY A PURCHASER OR AN (D) AGENT AN EQUINE BELONGING TO ANOTHER, WHETHER OR NOT THE OWNER HAS RECEIVED SOME 51 MONETARY CONSIDERATION OR OTHER THING OF VALUE FOR THE USE OF THE EQUINE 52 OR IS PERMITTING A PROSPECTIVE PURCHASER OF THE EQUINE TO RIDE, INSPECT 53 54 OR EVALUATE THE EQUINE. 55 (E) RIDES, TRIPS, HUNTS OR OTHER EQUINE ACTIVITIES OF ANY TYPE HOWEVER 56 INFORMAL OR IMPROMPTU THAT ARE SPONSORED BY AN EQUINE ACTIVITY SPONSOR.

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(F) PLACING OR REPLACING HORSESHOES OR HOOF TRIMMING ON AN EOUINE. 1 2 (G) PROVIDING OR ASSISTING IN VETERINARY TREATMENT OF AN EQUINE. 3 "EQUINE ACTIVITY SPONSOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, GROUP, CLUB, PART-4. 4 NERSHIP, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY OR CORPORATION, WHETHER OR NOT THE 5 IS OPERATING FOR PROFIT OR NONPROFIT, WHICH SPONSORS, ORGAN-SPONSOR IZES OR PROVIDES THE FACILITIES FOR, AN EQUINE ACTIVITY, INCLUDING 6 BUT 7 NOT LIMITED TO: PONY CLUBS, 4-H CLUBS, HUNT CLUBS, RIDING CLUBS, SCHOOL AND COLLEGE-SPONSORED CLASSES, PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES, 8 THERAPEUTIC RIDING PROGRAMS, STABLE AND FARM OWNERS AND OPERATORS, INSTRUCTORS, AND 9 10 PROMOTERS OF EQUINE FACILITIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO FARMS, CLUBHOUSES, PONY RIDE STRINGS, FAIRS, AND ARENAS AT WHICH THE 11 STABLES, 12 ACTIVITY IS HELD. 5. "EQUINE PROFESSIONAL" MEANS A PERSON ENGAGED FOR COMPENSATION: 13 14 (A) IN INSTRUCTING A PARTICIPANT OR RENTING TO A PARTICIPANT AN EQUINE 15 FOR THE PURPOSE OF RIDING, DRIVING OR BEING A PASSENGER UPON THE EQUINE; (B) IN RENTING EQUIPMENT OR TACK TO A PARTICIPANT; 16 17 (C) TO PROVIDE DAILY CARE OF HORSES BOARDED AT AN EQUINE FACILITY; OR (D) TO TRAIN AN EOUINE. 18 19 6. "INHERENT RISKS OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES" MEANS THOSE DANGERS OR CONDI-TIONS WHICH ARE AN INTEGRAL PART OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING BUT NOT 20 21 LIMITED TO: 22 PROPENSITY OF EQUINES TO BEHAVE IN WAYS THAT MAY RESULT IN (A) THE 23 INJURY, HARM OR DEATH TO PERSONS ON OR AROUND THEM; 24 (B) THE UNPREDICTABILITY OF AN EQUINE'S REACTION TO SUCH THINGS AS 25 SOUNDS, SUDDEN MOVEMENT, AND UNFAMILIAR OBJECTS, PERSONS OR OTHER 26 ANIMALS; 27 (C) CERTAIN HAZARDS SUCH AS SURFACE AND SUBSURFACE CONDITIONS INCLUD-28 ING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, ROCKS, FOREST GROWTH, DEBRIS, BRANCHES, TREES, 29 ROOTS, STUMPS OR OTHER NATURAL OBJECTS; (D) COLLISIONS WITH OTHER EQUINES OR OBJECTS; AND 30 (E) THE POTENTIAL OF A PARTICIPANT TO ACT IN A NEGLIGENT MANNER 31 THAT MAY CONTRIBUTE TO INJURY TO THE PARTICIPANT OR OTHERS, SUCH AS FAILING 32 33 TO MAINTAIN CONTROL OVER THE ANIMAL OR NOT ACTING WITHIN HIS OR HER 34 ABILITY. 35 7. "PARTICIPANT" MEANS ANY PERSON, WHETHER AMATEUR OR PROFESSIONAL, ENGAGES IN AN EQUINE ACTIVITY, WHETHER OR NOT A FEE IS PAID TO 36 WHO 37 PARTICIPATE IN THE EQUINE ACTIVITY. 38 LIABILITY OF PERSONS INVOLVED IN EQUINE ACTIVITIES. S 18-303. 1. 39 NOTHING IN SECTION 18-304 OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL PREVENT OR LIMIT THE 40 LIABILITY OF AN EOUINE ACTIVITY SPONSOR OR AN EOUINE PROFESSIONAL, IF THE EQUINE ACTIVITY SPONSOR OR EQUINE PROFESSIONAL: 41 (1) PROVIDED THE EQUIPMENT OR TACK, AND KNEW OR SHOULD HAVE KNOWN 42 (A) 43 EQUIPMENT OR TACK WAS FAULTY, AND SUCH EQUIPMENT OR TACK WAS THAT THE 44 FAULTY TO THE EXTENT THAT IT DID CAUSE THE INJURY; OR 45 (2) PROVIDED THE EOUINE AND FAILED TO MAKE REASONABLE AND PRUDENT EFFORTS TO DETERMINE THE ABILITY OF THE PARTICIPANT TO ENGAGE SAFELY IN 46 47 THE EQUINE ACTIVITY, AND DETERMINE THE ABILITY OF THE PARTICIPANT TO 48 SAFELY MANAGE THE PARTICULAR EQUINE BASED ON THE PARTICIPANT'S REPRESEN-49 TATIONS OF HIS ABILITY; 50 OWNS, LEASES, RENTS, HAS AUTHORIZED USE OF OR IS OTHERWISE IN (B) LAWFUL POSSESSION AND CONTROL OF THE LAND, OR FACILITIES UPON WHICH THE 51 SUSTAINED INJURIES BECAUSE OF A DANGEROUS LATENT CONDITION 52 PARTICIPANT WHICH WAS KNOWN OR SHOULD HAVE BEEN KNOWN TO THE EQUINE ACTIVITY SPONSOR 53 54 OR EQUINE PROFESSIONAL AND FOR WHICH WARNING SIGNS, PURSUANT TO SECTION 55 18-305 OF THIS ARTICLE HAVE NOT BEEN CONSPICUOUSLY POSTED;

COMMITS AN ACT OR OMISSION THAT CONSTITUTES WILLFUL OR WANTON 1 (C) 2 DISREGARD FOR THE SAFETY OF THE PARTICIPANT, AND THAT ACT OR OMISSION 3 CAUSED THE INJURY; 4 (D) INTENTIONALLY INJURES THE PARTICIPANT. 5 2. THIS SECTION SHALL NOT APPLY TO THE HORSE RACING ACTIVITY AUTHOR-6 IZED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE TWO, THREE OR FOUR OF THE RACING, PARI-MUTUEL 7 WAGERING AND BREEDING LAW. 8 18-304. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY. 1. EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBDI-S VISION TWO OF SECTION 18-303 OF THIS ARTICLE, AN EQUINE ACTIVITY SPON-9 10 AN EQUINE PROFESSIONAL OR ANY OTHER PERSON, WHICH SHALL SOR, INCLUDE A LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY, CORPORATION OR PARTNERSHIP, 11 SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO OR THE DEATH OF A PARTICIPANT RESULTING 12 FROM THE OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES AND, EXCEPT AS 13 INHERENT RISKS 14 PROVIDED IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF SECTION 18-303 OF THIS ARTICLE, NO PARTICIPANT NOR PARTICIPANT'S REPRESENTATIVE 15 SHALL MAKE ANY CLAIM AGAINST, MAINTAIN AN ACTION AGAINST OR RECOVER FROM AN EQUINE ACTIVITY 16 SPONSOR, AN EQUINE PROFESSIONAL OR ANY OTHER PERSON FOR INJURY, LOSS, 17 DAMAGE OR DEATH OF THE PARTICIPANT RESULTING FROM ANY OF THE INHERENT 18 19 RISKS OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES. 20 2. NOTHING IN THIS ARTICLE SHALL LIMIT THE APPLICATION OF THE 21 PROVISIONS OF SECTION 9-103 OF THIS CHAPTER. 22 18-305. POSTING AND NOTIFICATION. 1. EVERY EQUINE PROFESSIONAL S SHALL POST AND MAINTAIN SIGNS WHICH CONTAIN THE WARNING NOTICE SPECIFIED 23 IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION. SUCH SIGNS SHALL BE PLACED IN A 24 25 CLEARLY VISIBLE LOCATION IN THE PROXIMITY OF THE EQUINE ACTIVITY. THE WARNING NOTICE SPECIFIED IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION SHALL APPEAR 26 ON THE SIGN IN BLACK LETTERS, WITH EACH LETTER TO BE A MINIMUM OF 27 ONE INCH IN HEIGHT. EVERY WRITTEN CONTRACT ENTERED INTO BY AN EQUINE PROFES-28 SIONAL FOR THE PROVIDING OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES, INSTRUCTION, OR THE 29 RENTAL OF EQUIPMENT OR TACK OR AN EQUINE TO A PARTICIPANT, WHETHER OR 30 NOT THE CONTRACT INVOLVES EQUINE ACTIVITIES ON OR OFF THE LOCATION OR 31 32 SITE OF THE EQUINE PROFESSIONAL'S BUSINESS, SHALL CONTAIN IN CLEARLY PRINT THE WARNING NOTICE SPECIFIED IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS 33 READABLE SECTION. 34 35 2. THE SIGNS AND CONTRACTS DESCRIBED IN SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION SHALL CONTAIN THE FOLLOWING WARNING NOTICE: 36 37 WARNING 38 UNDER NEW YORK LAW, AN EQUINE PROFESSIONAL OR EQUINE ACTIVITY SPONSOR IS NOT LIABLE FOR AN INJURY TO, OR THE DEATH OF, A PARTICIPANT IN EQUINE 39 40 ACTIVITIES RESULTING FROM THE INHERENT RISKS OF EQUINE ACTIVITIES, PURSUANT TO SECTION 18-304 OF THE GENERAL OBLIGATIONS LAW. 41 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that 42 43 the provisions of section two of this act shall take effect on the nine-44 tieth day after it shall have become a law; and provided further, that 45 the provisions of this act shall apply only to causes of action commenced on or after the effective date of each applicable section. 46
