- AN ACT to amend the education law and the social services law, in relation to the practice of school psychology

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

REQUIREMENTS FOR A PROFESSIONAL LICENSE. TO QUALIFY FOR A 27 LICENSE AS A LICENSED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST, AN APPLICANT SHALL FULFILL THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS: 28 29 1. APPLICATION: FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT; 2. 39	MEANS. INVASIVE PROCEDURE INCLUDES SURGERY, LASERS, IONIZING RADIATION,
40	THERAPEUTIC ULTRASOUND, OR ELECTROCONVULSIVE THERAPY; OR
41	(C) ENGAGING IN DUAL SETTING PRACTICE, OR OTHERWISE OFFERING OR

43	EDUCATION PROGRAM WHERE THE PRACTITIONER IS CURRENTLY EMPLOYED OR UNDER

ANY PERSON LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE MAY USE ACCEPTED CODES
 AND CLASSIFICATIONS OF SIGNS, SYMPTOMS, DYSFUNCTIONS AND DISORDERS, AS
 APPROVED IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE DEPARTMENT,
 IN THE PRACTICE OF SUCH LICENSED PROFESSION.

4. NOTHING IN THIS ARTICLE SHALL BE DEEMED TO ALTER, MODIFY OR AFFECT
THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION THREE THOUSAND TWELVE OR TWENTY-FIVE HUNDRED
TEN OF THIS CHAPTER OR OTHERWISE AFFECT THE CERTIFICATION OF A SCHOOL

21 S 2. Paragraph a of subdivision 3 of section 6507 of the education 22 law, as amended by chapter 554 of the laws of 2013, is amended to read 23 as follows:

24 a. Establish standards for preprofessional and professional education, 25 experience and licensing examinations as required to implement the arti-26 cle for each profession. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the 27 commissioner shall establish standards requiring that all persons applyon or after January first, nineteen hundred ninety-one, initially, 28 ing, 29 or for the renewal of, a license, registration or limited permit to be a physician, chiropractor, dentist, registered nurse, podiatrist, optome-30 31 psychiatrist, psychologist, LICENSED SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST, trist, 32 licensed master social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed 33 creative arts therapist, licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed mental health counselor, licensed psychoanalyst, dental hygien-34 35 ist, licensed behavior analyst, or certified behavior analyst assistant shall, in addition to all the other licensure, certification or permit 36 37 requirements, have completed two hours of coursework or training regard-38 ing the identification and reporting of child abuse and maltreatment. 39 The coursework or training shall be obtained from an institution or 40 provider which has been approved by the department to provide such coursework or training. The coursework or training shall include infor-41 mation regarding the physical and behavioral indicators of child abuse 42 43 and maltreatment and the statutory reporting requirements set out in 44 sections four hundred thirteen through four hundred twenty of the social 45 services law, including but not limited to, when and how a report must be made, what other actions the reporter is mandated or authorized to 46 47 take, the legal protections afforded reporters, and the consequences for 48 failing to report. Such coursework or training may also include information regarding the physical and behavioral indicators of the abuse of 49 50 individuals with mental retardation and other developmental disabilities 51 and voluntary reporting of abused or neglected adults to the office of mental retardation and developmental disabilities or the local adult 52 protective services unit. Each applicant shall provide the department 53 54 with documentation showing that he or she has completed the required 55 training. The department shall provide an exemption from the child abuse 56 and maltreatment training requirements to any applicant who requests 1 such an exemption and who shows, to the department's satisfaction, that 2 there would be no need because of the nature of his or her practice for 3 him or her to complete such training;

4 S 3. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 1 of section 413 of the social 5 services law, as amended by chapter 554 of the laws of 2013, is amended 6 to read as follows:

7 The following persons and officials are required to report or (a) 8 cause a report to be made in accordance with this title when they have reasonable cause to suspect that a child coming before them in their 9 10 professional or official capacity is an abused or maltreated child, or 11 when they have reasonable cause to suspect that a child is an abused or maltreated child where the parent, guardian, custodian or other person legally responsible for such child comes before them in their profes-12 13 14 sional or official capacity and states from personal knowledge facts, 15 conditions or circumstances which, if correct, would render the child an abused or maltreated child: any physician; registered physician assist-16 dental hygienist; 17 ant; surgeon; medical examiner; coroner; dentist; 18 chiropractor; podiatrist; osteopath; optometrist; resident; intern; psychologist; SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST; registered nurse; 19 social worker; emergency medical technician; licensed creative arts therapist; licensed 20 and family therapist; licensed mental health counselor; 21 marriage 22 licensed psychoanalyst; licensed behavior analyst; certified behavior 23 analyst assistant; hospital personnel engaged in the admission, examina-24 tion, care or treatment of persons; a Christian Science practitioner; 25 school official, which includes but is not limited to school teacher, 26 school guidance counselor, school psychologist, school social worker, 27 school nurse, school administrator or other school personnel required to hold a teaching or administrative license or certificate; 28 social 29 services worker; director of a children's overnight camp, summer day 30 camp or traveling summer day camp, as such camps are defined in section thirteen hundred ninety-two of the public health law; day care center 31 32 worker; school-age child care worker; provider of family or group family day care; or any other child care or foster care worker; mental health 33 34 professional; substance abuse counselor; alcoholism counselor; all 35 persons credentialed by the office of alcoholism and substance abuse services; peace officer; police officer; district attorney or assistant 36 37 district attorney; investigator employed in the office of a district 38

38 attorney; or other law enforcement official. 39 S 4. Section 7602 of the education law, as added by chapter 987 of the 40 laws of 1971, is amended to read as follows:

S 7602. State board for psychology. 41 A state board for psychology 42 shall be appointed by the board of regents on recommendation of the 43 commissioner for the purpose of assisting the board of regents and the 44 department on matters of professional licensing and professional conduct 45 in accordance with section sixty-five hundred eight of this title. The board shall be composed of not less than eleven [psychologists licensed 46 47 in this state] MEMBERS, A NUMBER OF LICENSED WHOM SHALL BE SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS SUFFICIENT TO 48 ASSURE MEANINGFUL PARTICIPATION IN BOARD ACTIVITIES. An executive secretary to the board shall be appointed by 49 50 the board of regents upon the recommendation of the commissioner and 51 shall be a psychologist, licensed in this state.

52 S 5. Severability. If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section or part 53 of this act shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to 54 be invalid, the judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the 55 remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, 1 sentence, paragraph, section or part thereof directly involved in the 2 controversy in which the judgment shall have been rendered.

3 6. This act shall take effect January 1, 2016; provided that if S 4 section 11 of chapter 554 of the laws of 2013 shall not have taken 5 effect on or before such date, then section two of this act shall take 6 effect on the same date and in the same manner as such section 11 takes 7 effect; provided that if section 12 of chapter 554 of the laws of 2013 8 shall not have taken effect on or before such date then section three of this act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as 9 10 such section 12 takes effect; provided further that the department of education is authorized to promulgate any and all rules and regulations 11 and take any other measure necessary to implement this act on or before 12 its effective date, including, but not limited to, the appointment of 13 state board for psychology, the acceptance and processing of appli-14 the 15 cations for licensure and the issuance of licenses; provided further that the provisions of article 166-A of the education law, as added by 16 section one of this act, requiring a license or limited permit to prac-17 tice under such article shall not be enforced until January 1, 2017. 18
