AN ACT to amend the public health law and the environmental conservation law, in relation to reporting of pesticide poisonings

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The opening paragraph of paragraph (t) of subdivision 5 of section 225 of the public health law is designated subparagraph (i) and a new subparagraph (ii) is added to read as follows:

3 (II) NOTWITHSTANDING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF PARAGRAPH, EVERY HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER LICENSED OR CERTIFIED UNDER 6 TITLE EIGHT OF THE EDUCATION LAW ACTING WITHIN HIS OR HER LAWFUL SCOPE 7 IN ATTENDANCE WITH A PERSON WITH CONFIRMED OR SUSPECTED PRACTICE 8 PESTICIDE POISONING, OR CLINICAL LABORATORY TEST RESULTS WHICH SHOW 9 ABNORMALLY DEPRESSED CHOLINESTERASE LEVELS AND ABNORMALLY TISSUE LEVELS OF PESTICIDES, SHALL REPORT SUCH OCCURRENCE TO THE COMMIS-10 SIONER AND THE COMMISSIONER OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION WITHIN 11 INCLUDING THE NAME, ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF THE 12 TY-FOUR HOURS, 13 PERSON EXPOSED TO PESTICIDES; THE NATURE OF THE PESTICIDE EXPOSURE; LOCATION WHERE THE EXPOSURE OCCURRED; THE NAME OF THE PESTICIDE APPLICA-14 IF APPLICABLE, WHO APPLIED OR OTHERWISE HANDLED THE PESTICIDE; AND 15 16 THE PESTICIDE IDENTIFIED OR SUSPECTED IN THE PESTICIDE POISONING OR TEST 17 RESULTS. EVERY PERSON WITH CONFIRMED OR SUSPECTED PESTICIDE POISONING OR 18 CLINICAL LABORATORY TEST RESULTS WHICH SHOW ABNORMALLY DEPRESSED 19 NESTERASE LEVELS AND ABNORMALLY ELEVATED TISSUE LEVELS OF PESTICIDES SHALL BE INFORMED BY THE HEALTH CARE PRACTITIONER LICENSED OR CERTIFIED 20 EIGHT OF THE EDUCATION LAW ACTING WITHIN HIS OR HER LAWFUL 21 TITLE 22 SCOPE OF PRACTICE, THAT ALL INFORMATION AND DATA FROM THE DIAGNOSIS 23 RESULTS WILL BE DISCLOSED TO THEDEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL

TELEPHONE NUMBER WILL BE KEPT CONFIDENTIAL, EXCEPT THAT HE OR SHE MAY WAIVE THIS CONFIDENTIALITY IF THEY WISH. CONFIDENTIALITY OF THE PERSON'S NAME, ADDRESS AND TELEPHONE NUMBER SHALL BE THE SHARED RESPONSIBILITY OF THE DEPARTMENT AND THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION, EXCEPT IF THE PERSON WAIVES THIS RIGHT.

- S 2. Section 71-2903 of the environmental conservation law is amended by adding a new subdivision 3 to read as follows:
- 8 3. THE COMMISSIONER, OR ANY AUTHORIZED DESIGNEE OF THE COMMISSIONER, SHALL IMMEDIATELY INVESTIGATE ALL REPORTS FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, 9 10 PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF PARAGRAPH (T) OF SUBDIVISION FIVE OF SECTION TWO HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, OF CONFIRMED 11 OR SUSPECTED PESTICIDE POISONING OR CLINICAL LABORATORY TEST RESULTS 12 SHOW ABNORMAL DEPRESSED CHOLINESTERASE LEVELS AND 13 WHICH ABNORMAL 14 ELEVATED TISSUE LEVELS OF PESTICIDES. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ANNUALLY 15 REPORT IN DETAIL THE RESULTS OF SUCH INVESTIGATIONS OF CONFIRMED OR 16 SUSPECTED INCIDENCE OF PESTICIDE POISONING AND RESULTS OF ALL CLINICAL 17 LABORATORY TEST RESULTS WHICH SHOW ABNORMALLY DEPRESSED CHOLINESTERASE LEVELS AND ABNORMALLY ELEVATED TISSUE LEVELS OF PESTICIDES, EXCLUDING 18 19 ONLY THE NAMES, ADDRESSES AND TELEPHONE NUMBERS OF THE PERSONS EXPOSED TO PESTICIDES, UNLESS THIS RIGHT TO CONFIDENTIALITY HAS BEEN WAIVED, 20 21 SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIRS OF THE SENATE AND ASSEMBLY ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION AND HEALTH 23 COMMITTEES AND THE COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH BY JANUARY THIRTIETH FOR THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR. ALL INFORMATION AND DATA FROM COMPLETED INVESTI-24 25 GATIONS SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC THROUGH THE FREEDOM OF INFORMA-26 TION LAW, EXCEPT AS SUCH INFORMATION IS REQUIRED TO BE KEPT CONFIDENTIAL 27 AND THAT CONFIDENTIALITY HAS NOT BEEN WAIVED.
- 28 S 3. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 29 have become a law.
