AN ACT to amend the public health law and the state finance law, in relation to creating the New York state governor's council on physical fitness, sports and health

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Article 2 of the public health law is amended by adding a new title 6 to read as follows:

TITLE 6

NEW YORK STATE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON

PHYSICAL FITNESS, SPORTS AND HEALTH

6 SECTION 267. NEW YORK STATE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON PHYSICAL FITNESS, 7 SPORTS AND HEALTH.

267-A. POWERS, FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES.

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267-B. MEMBERS AND MEETINGS.

10 S 267. NEW YORK STATE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON PHYSICAL FITNESS, SPORTS 11 AND HEALTH. THERE IS HEREBY CREATED WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT, THE NEW YORK 12 STATE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON PHYSICAL FITNESS, SPORTS AND HEALTH (HERE-13 AFTER "COUNCIL"). THE COUNCIL SHALL BE REGULATED BY THE DEPARTMENT, AND 14 SUPPORT STAFF OF THE COUNCIL, AS PROVIDED BY THIS TITLE, SHALL BE 15 EMPLOYEES OF THE DEPARTMENT.

16 S 267-A. POWERS, FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES. THE POWERS, FUNCTIONS AND 17 DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL SHALL INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOW-18 ING:

14^{13}	2. MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL SHALL SERVE WITHOUT COMPENSATION, BUT SHALL
15	BE ELIGIBLE FOR REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO
16	TRAVEL, HOTEL AND MEAL EXPENSES TO BE APPROPRIATED FROM FUNDS PROVIDED
17	FOR IN SECTION NINETY-FIVE-H OF THE STATE FINANCE LAW. STAFF MEMBERS TO

33	S 2. The state finance law is amended by adding a new section 95-h to
34	read as follows:
35	S 95-H. NEW YORK STATE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON PHYSICAL FITNESS, SPORTS
36 37	AND HEALTH FUND. 1. THERE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED IN THE JOINT CUSTODY OF THE STATE COMPTROLLER AND COMMISSIONER OF HEALTH A SPECIAL FUND TO BE
38	KNOWN AS THE "NEW YORK STATE GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON PHYSICAL FITNESS,
39	SPORTS AND HEALTH FUND".
40	2. SUCH FUND SHALL CONSIST OF ALL MONIES APPROPRIATED FOR THE PURPOSE
41	OF SUCH FUND AND ANY GRANT, GIFT OR BEQUEST MADE TO THE NEW YORK STATE
42 43	GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON PHYSICAL FITNESS, SPORTS AND HEALTH. 3. MONIES OF THE FUND SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO THE NEW YORK STATE GOVER-
44	NOR'S COUNCIL ON PHYSICAL FITNESS, SPORTS AND HEALTH FOR THE FOLLOWING
45	PURPOSES:
46	(A) OPERATIONAL EXPENSES OF THE COUNCIL, WHICH SHALL INCLUDE, BUT ARE
47	NOT LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:
48 49	(I) THE CREATION OF A COUNCIL WEBSITE; (II) THE CREATION AND DISSEMINATION OF A COUNCIL BROCHURE;
50	(II) THE CREATION AND DISSEMINATION OF A COUNCIL DECEMENT, (III) THE CREATION AND DISSEMINATION OF A COUNCIL NEWSLETTER;

54 55	(V) COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH REIMBURSING THE COUNCIL MEMBERS FOR VARIOUS EXPENSES AS PROVIDED FOR IN TITLE SIX OF ARTICLE TWO OF THE PUBLIC

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1 (B) THE DEVELOPMENT AND ADMINISTRATION OF SPECIAL COMMUNITY-BASED 2 PROGRAMS TO PROMOTE PHYSICAL FITNESS;

3 (C) THE CREATION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A GRANT PROGRAM TO PROVIDE 4 INCENTIVES TO EMPLOYERS WHO PROMOTE PHYSICAL ACTIVITY AND PHYSICAL 5 FITNESS; AND

6 (D) THE COSTS OF ANY AND ALL OTHER PROGRAMS PROVIDED FOR OR AUTHORIZED 7 UNDER TITLE FIVE OF ARTICLE TWO OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW AS ADDED BY 8 CHAPTER FIVE HUNDRED THIRTY-EIGHT OF THE LAWS OF TWO THOUSAND TWO.

9 4. THE MONIES OF THE FUND SHALL BE PAID OUT ON THE AUDIT AND WARRANT 10 OF THE COMPTROLLER ON VOUCHERS CERTIFIED OR APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER 11 OF HEALTH, OR BY AN OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH 12 DESIGNATED BY SUCH COMMISSIONER.

13 S 3. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 14 it shall have become a law, provided however, that effective immediate-15 ly, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rules or regulations 16 necessary for the implementation of the foregoing sections of this act 17 on its effective date is authorized and directed to be made and 18 completed on or before such effective date.
