- AN ACT to amend the benevolent orders law, the general municipal law, the general city law, the military law and the real property tax law, in relation to declaring the Vietnam Veterans of America to be a benevolent order and granting such organization various benefits available to specified veterans' organizations

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 2 of the benevolent orders law is amended by adding
 a new subdivision 59 to read as follows:
 59. THE VIETNAM VETERANS OF AMERICA, OR ANY SUBORDINATE CHAPTER THER-

- 4 EOF, WHICH IS DULY CHARTERED BY AND INSTITUTED ACCORDING TO THE CONSTI-5 TUTION AND LAWS OF THAT ORGANIZATION.
- 6 S 2. Section 7 of the benevolent orders law is amended by adding a new 7 subdivision 16-i to read as follows:
- 8 16-I. ANY NUMBER OF CHARTERS OF THE VIETNAM VETERANS OF AMERICA, 9 CHARTERED AND INSTALLED ACCORDING TO THE REGULATIONS OF THAT ORGANIZA-10 TION;
- 11 S 3. Subdivision 1 of section 77 of the general municipal law, as 12 amended by chapter 1013 of the laws of 1969, is amended to read as 13 follows:
- 1. A municipal corporation may lease, for not exceeding five years, to 14 a post or posts of the Grand Army of the Republic, Veterans of Foreign 15 Wars of the United States, American Legion, Catholic War Veterans, Inc., 16 Disabled American Veterans, the Army and Navy Union, U.S.A., Marine 17 18 Corps League, AMVETS, American Veterans of World War II, Jewish War Veterans of the United States, Inc., Italian American War Veterans of 19 the United States, Incorporated, Masonic War Veterans of the State of 20 New York, Inc., Veterans of World War I of the United States of America 21 22 Department of New York, Inc., Polish-American Veterans of World War II,

Amsterdam, N.Y., Inc., Polish-American Veterans of World War II, Sche-1 2 Inc., Polish Legion of American Veterans, Inc., VIETNAM nectady, N.Y., 3 VETERANS OF AMERICA or other veteran organization of honorably 4 discharged members of the armed forces of the United States or to an 5 incorporated organization or an association of either active or exempt 6 volunteer firemen, a public building or part thereof, belonging to such 7 municipal corporation, except schoolhouses in actual use as such, with-8 expense, or at a nominal rent, fixed by the board or council having out charge of such buildings and provide furniture and furnishings, and 9 10 heat, light and janitor service therefor, in like manner.

11 S 4. Section 13 of the general city law, as separately amended by 12 chapters 14 and 982 of the laws of 1965, is amended to read as follows:

S 13. Moneys for Memorial and Veterans days; how expended. The moneys 13 14 appropriated by a city for observance of Memorial and Veterans days 15 therein pursuant to section twelve of this chapter shall be expended 16 under the direction of a board composed of the mayor and the commanders 17 and quartermasters of the Grand Army posts, the American Legion, the 18 United Spanish War Veterans camps, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the 19 United States, the Army and Navy Union of the United States, the Marine 20 Corps League, Inc., the Catholic War Veterans, Inc., the Italian American War Veterans of the United States, Incorporated, the Jewish 21 War 22 Veterans of the United States and commanders and treasurers of Sons of 23 Veterans, Military Order of the Purple Heart, Inc., Disabled American Veterans camps, AMVETS, American Veterans of World War II, Masonic War 24 25 Veterans of the State of New York, Inc., Veterans of World War I of the United States of America Department of New York, Inc., Polish-American 26 Veterans of World War II, Amsterdam, N. Y., Inc., Polish-American Veter-27 ans of World War II, Schenectady, N. Y., Inc., Polish Legion of American 28 Veterans, Inc., United Veteran's Association of America, Incorporated, 29 30 VIETNAM VETERANS OF AMERICA and the United Veterans Memorial and Executive Committee of such city. The whole amount of such money appropriated 31 32 or any part thereof may be spent by such board in observance of Memorial 33 and Veterans days. Bills properly verified for all claims and expendi-34 tures arising under section twelve of this chapter or under this 35 section, shall be presented to and audited by such board and shall be paid by the common council of any such city. The moneys appropriated 36 37 shall be raised by tax on the real and personal property liable to taxa-38 tion in any such city in the same manner as the ordinary expenses of 39 maintaining the city government.

40 S 5. Subdivision 3 of section 24 of the military law, as amended by 41 chapter 141 of the laws of 1988, is amended to read as follows:

3. He is authorized to request and accept from incorporated associ-42 ations of veterans of the different regiments, statements and informa-43 tion duly authenticated by them, descriptive of their colors, standards 44 45 and battle flags, together with the number and class of arms of the regiment, the date and place of muster into the service of the state and 46 47 also into the service of the United States, the period of service, and 48 the date and place of muster-out, the date of departure for the seat of 49 war, and the various battles and engagements and places of service, 50 including garrison duty, the time of joining brigades, corps and armies, with the time and nature of the service, and the names of colonels of 51 such regiments, the names of those killed in action, including those who 52 died of wounds, and the names of those who died of disease during their 53 54 period of service. He is further authorized to ask the cooperation and 55 assistance of the adjutant-general of the United States, and of the city, county and town authorities and officials, and of the Grand Army 56

of the Republic, the Military Order of the Loyal Legion, the United 1 2 Spanish War Veterans, the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars, 3 War Veterans of the United States, Inc. , the Catholic War the Jewish Veterans, Inc., the Italian American War Veterans of the United States, 4 Incorporated, the Polish Legion of American Veterans, Inc., VIETNAM 5 6 VETERANS OF AMERICA and of other organizations and persons in the state 7 New York and elsewhere in the collection of such other information, of 8 relics, memorials and battle flags as is contemplated by this article, in order to make as complete as possible the records, history and 9 10 statistics of the patriotic service of the soldiers of the state during 11 the wars in which the state participated.

12 S 6. Paragraph b of subdivision 1 of section 183 of the military law, 13 as amended by chapter 141 of the laws of 1988, is amended to read as 14 follows:

15 b. On application of one or more posts or chapters of the United Spanish War Veterans, the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States, the Disabled American Veterans, the AMVETS, American 16 17 Veterans of World War II, the Jewish War Veterans of the United States, 18 19 Inc., the Catholic War Veterans, Inc., the Italian American War Veterans 20 of the United States, Incorporated, the Polish Legion of American Veter-21 ans, Inc., the Army and Navy Union of the United States of America, 22 VIETNAM VETERANS OF AMERICA, posts of the Masonic War Veterans of the state of New York, Incorporated, or groups or squadrons of New York 23 24 Wing, Civil Air Patrol, or of incorporated associations of veterans of 25 units of the organized militia, or one or more posts or chapters of organizations of sons of veterans of any war of the United States or of 26 27 the Reserve Officers Association of the United States, or those historic military commands set forth in section two hundred forty-a of [the] this 28 29 chapter, approved by the officer in charge and control of the armory, 30 and by his military superiors as prescribed by regulations issued pursuant to this chapter and under such restrictions as may be prescribed by 31 32 the adjutant general, the officer in charge and control of an armory 33 shall provide a proper and convenient room or rooms or other appropriate 34 space in such armory where such posts or chapters may hold regular and 35 special meetings and organizational social events of a private nature without the payment of any charge or expense therefor, provided that 36 37 such use does not interfere with the members and units of the organized 38 militia stationed in such armory.

39 S 7. Subdivision 1 of section 452 of the real property tax law, as 40 amended by chapter 610 of the laws of 1960, is amended to read as 41 follows:

1. Real property owned by a corporation, association or post composed 42 43 of veterans of the Grand Army of the Republic, Veterans of Foreign Wars, 44 Disabled American Veterans, the United Spanish War Veterans, the Jewish 45 Veterans of the United States, Inc., Catholic War Veterans, Inc., War the American Legion, AMVETS, American Veterans of World War II, Italian 46 47 American War Veterans of the United States, Incorporated, Masonic War 48 Veterans of the State of New York, Incorporated, VIETNAM VETERANS OF 49 AMERICA and any other corporation or association of veterans of the 50 armed forces of the United States in any war, actually and exclusively 51 and occupied by such corporation, association or post shall be used exempt from taxation and exempt from special ad valorem levies and 52 53 special assessments to the extent provided in section four hundred nine-54 ty of this chapter.
