AN ACT to authorize the commissioner of education to develop a plan for
elimination in the use of trans fat in schools

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Trans fat elimination program. 1. The commissioner of
2 education, in consultation with the department of health, is hereby
3 authorized and directed to develop a trans fat elimination program. For
4 purposes of this act, "trans fat" means a specific type of fat formed
5 when liquid fats are made into solid fats by the addition of hydrogen
6 atoms, in a process known as hydrogenation. Such program shall consist
7 of two main components: a public information campaign and a protocol for
8 eliminating the use of trans fats in foods prepared by any institution
9 under the jurisdiction of the department of education including, but not
10 limited to, public schools.

11 2. The public information campaign shall be developed, in consultation
12 with the department of health, to provide public service announcements,
13 website sources and educational brochures about the health risks associ-
14 ated with trans fat in foods.

15 3. The commissioner of education, in consultation with the commission-
16 er of health, shall include in the department of education's annual
17 report not later than December 31, 2014, a report assessing the success
18 of the trans fat elimination program. Such report shall be submitted to
19 the governor, the temporary president of the senate, the speaker of the
20 assembly, and any appropriate committees of the legislature concerned
21 with nutritional standards, education and health in New York state.

22 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately. The commissioner of
23 education is authorized and directed to promulgate any and all rules and
24 regulations and take any other measures necessary to implement this act
25 on its effective date on or before such date.
