AN ACT authorizing the Lake Ronkonkoma Historical Society to file a retroactive application for real property tax exemption

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary,
2 the assessor of the town of Brookhaven is hereby authorized to accept
3 from the Lake Ronkonkoma Historical Society an application for exemption
4 from real property taxes pursuant to section 420-b of the real property
5 tax law for the 2012-2013 assessment roll, with such parcel being
6 located in the Hamlet of Ronkonkoma at Pond Road, Ronkonkoma, New York,
7 11779, otherwise known as property tax map number
8 0200-724.00-05.00-020.002. If accepted, the application shall be
9 reviewed as if it had been received on or before the taxable status date
10 established for such roll. If satisfied that such organization would
11 otherwise be entitled to such exemption if such organization had filed
12 an application for exemption by the appropriate taxable status date, the
13 assessor of the town of Brookhaven, upon approval by the town board of
14 such town, may grant exemption from taxation and make appropriate
15 correction to the subject roll. If such exemption is granted and if the
16 Lake Ronkonkoma Historical Society shall have paid any tax with respect
17 to such subject roll, the town board may, in its sole discretion,
18 provide for the refund of those taxes paid and cancel taxes, fines,
19 penalties, or interest remaining unpaid.
20 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
