AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to prohibiting biologically identifying questions from being asked prior to standardized testing

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 340 of the education law is amended by adding a new 2 subdivision 10 to read as follows:

- 10. "BIOLOGICALLY IDENTIFYING QUESTIONS" MEANS ANY QUESTION OR GROUP OF QUESTIONS THAT IMPLICITLY ACTIVATE A SOCIAL IDENTITY THAT CAN EITHER FACILITATE OR HINDER PERFORMANCE, INCLUDING RACE, GENDER, FAMILY INCOME, RELIGION, AND SEXUALITY.
- 7 S 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 344-d to 8 read as follows:
- 9 S 344-D. PROHIBITED QUESTIONS. NO STANDARDIZED TEST GIVEN PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE SHALL CONTAIN ANY BIOLOGICALLY IDENTIFY- ING QUESTIONS ABOUT THE TEST SUBJECT OR HIS OR HER FAMILY PRIOR TO THE INITIATION OF THE TEST.
- 13 S 3. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 14 have become a law.
