WHEREAS, The Avenue U Senior and Community Center truly enhances the overall quality of life among the senior population and is an asset within the community it so ably serves; and

WHEREAS, This significant milestone is an excellent opportunity to recognize the special contributions of the Avenue U Senior and Community Center and the dedicated individuals who strive to better the quality of life for senior citizens in the community; and
