AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the capital costs of
Medgar Evers college

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision B of section 6221 of the education law, as
2 amended by section 1 of part HH of chapter 57 of the laws of 2009, is
3 amended to read as follows:
4 B. Senior college capital costs. Commencing with the twelve-month
5 period beginning July first, nineteen hundred eighty-two and thereafter,
6 the state shall pay one hundred per centum of capital costs exclusive of
7 those financed pursuant to the provisions of article one hundred twen-
8 ty-five-B of this chapter, of the senior colleges of the city university
9 of New York, provided however that commencing with the twelve month
10 period beginning July first, nineteen hundred eighty-two and thereafter,
11 the state shall pay one hundred per centum of capital costs exclusive of
12 those financed pursuant to the provisions of article one hundred twen-
13 ty-five-B of this chapter, of the college of Staten Island, New York
14 city college of technology and, commencing with the twelve month period
15 beginning July first, two thousand nine and thereafter, Medgar Evers
16 college, provided, however, that appropriations authorizing such costs
17 have been approved by the legislature. [The advancement of capital
18 projects pursuant to this subdivision shall be undertaken only in
19 accordance with the provisions of section ninety-three of the state
20 finance law.]
21 S 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall
22 have become a law, provided that no provision of this act shall be
23 construed to affect the amounts appropriated by the city of New York for
24 the capital costs of Medgar Evers college for any fiscal year of such
25 city ending on or before June 30, 2013.
