AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to requirements of proof for certain licenses; and to repeal certain provisions of such law relating thereto

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 3 of section 490 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by chapter 235 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as follows:

- The commissioner shall upon submission of an appropriate application, upon payment of the prescribed fee, and upon being satisfied that the person described is the applicant and that such applicant meets the requirements set forth in subdivision two of this section, issue to such applicant a nontransferable identification card. In addition, commissioner also shall require that an applicant for an identification card or renewal thereof provide his or her social security number, IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR A SOCIAL SECURITY PROVIDE PROOF THAT HE OR SHE NUMBER. SUCH PROOF MAY INCLUDE ANY DOCUMENTS SUBMITTED BY AN APPLICANT THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER SUCH APPLICANT IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE A SOCIAL SECU-RITY NUMBER.
- S 2. Subparagraph (i) of paragraph (a) of subdivision 3 of section 490 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by chapter 487 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

The commissioner shall provide space so that an applicant may request a notation upon such identification card that he or she is a veteran of the United States armed forces.

- Application for license. Application for a driver's license shall be made to the commissioner. The fee prescribed by law may be submitted with such application. The applicant shall furnish such proof of identity, age, and fitness as may be required by the commissioner. The commissioner may also provide that the application procedure shall include the taking of a photo image or images of the applicant in accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the commissioner. In addition, the commissioner [also] shall require that the applicant provide his or her social security number [and], OR PROVIDE PROOF THAT HE OR SHE IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. SUCH PROOF MAY INCLUDE ANY DOCU-24 MENTS SUBMITTED BY AN APPLICANT TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOME-SECURITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER SUCH APPLICANT IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. THECOMMISSIONER ALSO provide space on the application so that the applicant may register the New York state organ and tissue donor registry under section forty-three hundred ten of the public health law. In addition, an applicant for a commercial driver's license who will operate a commercial motor vehicle in interstate commerce shall certify that such applicant 31 meets the requirements to operate a commercial motor vehicle, as 33 forth in public law 99-570, title XII, and title 49 of the code of 34 federal regulations, and all regulations promulgated by the United States secretary of transportation under the hazardous materials trans-35 portation act. In addition, an applicant for a commercial driver's license shall submit a medical certificate at such intervals as required the federal motor carrier safety improvement act of 1999 and Part 383.71(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations relating to medical certification and in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. For purposes of this section and sections five hundred three, five hundred ten-a, and five hundred ten-aa of this title, the terms "medical certificate" and "medical certification" shall mean a form substantially compliance with the form set forth in Part 391.43(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations. Upon a determination that the holder of a commercial driver's license has made any false statement, with respect to the application for such license, the commissioner shall revoke license.
 - Subdivision 1 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as 4. amended by chapter 465 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:
 - Application for license. Application for a driver's license shall be made to the commissioner. The fee prescribed by law may be submitted with such application. The applicant shall furnish such proof of identity, age, and fitness as may be required by the commissioner. The commissioner may also provide that the application procedure shall include the

taking of a photo image or images of the applicant in accordance with rules and regulations prescribed by the commissioner. In addition, the commissioner [also] shall require that the applicant provide his or her security number [and], OR PROVIDE PROOF THAT HE OR SHE IS NOT 5 ELIGIBLE FOR A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. SUCH PROOF MAY INCLUDE ANY 6 MENTS SUBMITTED BY AN APPLICANT TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOME-7 SECURITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER SUCH APPLICANT IS 8 ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. THE COMMISSIONER shall ALSO provide space on the application so that the applicant may register 9 10 the New York state organ and tissue donor registry under section forty-three hundred ten of the public health 11 law with the following stated on the application in clear and conspicuous type: 12

"You must fill out the following section: Would you like to be added to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this question'."

The commissioner of the department of health shall not maintain records of any person who checks "skip this question". Failure to check box shall not impair the validity of an application, and failure to check "yes" or checking "skip this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under eighteen years of age, checking "yes" shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry. Where an applicant has previously consented to make an anatomical gift or registered in the donate life registry, checking "skip this question" or failing to check a box shall not impair that consent or registration. APPLICATION SHALL ALSO PROVIDE SPACE SO THAT THE APPLICANT MAY REQUEST A NOTATION UPON SUCH LICENSE THAT HE OR SHE IS A VETERAN OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES. In addition, an applicant for a commercial driver's license who will operate a commercial motor vehicle in interstate commerce shall certify that such applicant meets the requirements to operate a commercial motor vehicle, as set forth in public law 99-570, title XII, and title 49 of the code of federal regulations, and all regulations promulgated by the United States secretary of transportation under the hazardous materials transportation act. In addition, an applicant for a commercial driver's license shall submit a medical certificate at such intervals as required by the federal motor safety improvement act of 1999 and Part 383.71(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations relating to medical certification and in a manner prescribed by the commissioner. For purposes of this section and sections five hundred three, five hundred ten-a, and five hundred ten-aa this title, the terms "medical certificate" and "medical certifof ication" shall mean a form substantially in compliance with the form set forth in Part 391.43(h) of title 49 of the code of federal regulations. Upon a determination that the holder of a commercial driver's license has made any false statement, with respect to the application for such license, the commissioner shall revoke such license.

- S 5. Subdivision 1 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by chapter 487 of the laws of 2012, is REPEALED.
- S 6. Subdivision 1 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by section four of this act, is amended to read as follows:
- 1. Application for license. Application for a driver's license shall be made to the commissioner. The fee prescribed by law may be submitted with such application. The applicant shall furnish such proof of identity, age, and fitness as may be required by the commissioner. The commissioner may also provide that the application procedure shall include the taking of a photo image or images of the applicant in accordance with

rules and regulations prescribed by the commissioner. In addition, the commissioner shall require that the applicant provide his or her social security number, or provide proof that he or she is not eligible for a social security number. Such proof may include any documents submitted by an applicant to the United States department of homeland security for the purpose of determining whether such applicant is eligible to receive a social security number. The commissioner shall also provide space on the application so that the applicant may register in the New York state organ and tissue donor registry under section forty-three hundred ten of the public health law [with the following stated on the application in clear and conspicuous type:

"You must fill out the following section: Would you like to be added to the Donate Life Registry? Check box for 'yes' or 'skip this question'."

The commissioner of the department of health shall not maintain records of any person who checks "skip this question". Failure to check a box shall not impair the validity of an application, and failure to check "yes" or checking "skip this question" shall not be construed to imply a wish not to donate. In the case of an applicant under eighteen years of age, checking "yes" shall not constitute consent to make an anatomical gift or registration in the donate life registry. - S 7. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 6 of section 502 of the vehicle and traffic law, as amended by section 3 of part K of chapter 59 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows:
- (a) A license issued pursuant to subdivision five of this section shall be valid until the expiration date contained thereon, unless such license is suspended, revoked or cancelled. Such license may be renewed by submission of an application for renewal, the fee prescribed by law, proofs of prior licensing, fitness and acceptable vision prescribed by the commissioner, AND the applicant's social security number[, and if required by the commissioner] OR PROVIDE PROOF THAT HE OR SHE IS NOT ELIGIBLE FOR A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. SUCH PROOF MAY INCLUDE ANY DOCU-

MENTS SUBMITTED BY AN APPLICANT TO THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOME-SECURITY FOR THE PURPOSE OF DETERMINING WHETHER SUCH APPLICANT IS ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE A SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER. THE COMMISSIONER MAY ALSO REQUIRE SUBMISSION OF a photo image of the applicant in such numbers and 5 form as the commissioner shall prescribe. In addition, an applicant for 6 a license containing a hazardous material endorsement shall renewal of 7 pass an examination to retain such endorsement. The commissioner shall, with respect to the renewal of a hazardous materials endorsement, comply 8 9 with the requirements imposed upon states by sections 383.141 and 10 1572.13 of title 49 of the code of federal regulations. A renewal of such license shall be issued by the commissioner upon approval of such 11 application, except that no such license shall be issued if its issuance 12 would be inconsistent with the provisions of section five hundred 13 14 sixteen of this title, and except that the commissioner may refuse to 15 renew such license if the applicant is the holder of a currently valid 16 or renewable license to drive issued by another state or foreign country 17 unless the applicant surrenders such license. 18

S 8. This act shall take effect immediately; provided however that section two of this act shall take effect on the same date and in the same manner as section 1 of chapter 487 of the laws of 2012 takes effect; provided further that sections four and five of this act shall take effect October 3, 2013; and provided further that section six of this act shall take effect October 3, 2016.
