IN SENATE -- Introduced by Sen. LAVALLE -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Environmental Conservation -- reported favorably from said committee, ordered to first and second report, amended on second report, ordered to a third reading, and to be reprinted as amended, retaining its place in the order of third reading -- again amended and ordered reprinted, retaining its place in the order of third reading

IN ASSEMBLY -- Introduced by M. of A. THIELE -- read once and referred to the Committee on Environmental Conservation -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee -- again reported from said committee with amendments, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to the use of spears, spearguns or underwater guns in recreational and commercial bass fishing

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Section 13-0347 of the environmental conservation law is 2 amended by adding a new subdivision 5 to read as follows:
  - 5. THE TAKING OF STRIPED BASS BY THE USE OF SPEARS, SPEARGUNS OR UNDERWATER GUNS SHALL BE AUTHORIZED FOR RECREATIONAL AND COMMERCIAL PURPOSES. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, "SPEARGUN" AND "UNDERWATER GUN" MEANS ANY SPEARGUN THAT STORES POTENTIAL ENERGY PROVIDED FROM THE SPEARFISHER'S MUSCLES ONLY AND IS USED WHILE SUBMERGED UNDER THE WATER. SUCH GUN MAY ONLY RELEASE THAT AMOUNT OF ENERGY THAT THE DIVER HAS PROVIDED TO IT FROM SUCH DIVER'S OWN MUSCLES. COMMON TEMPORARY ENERGY STORING DEVICES FOR SPEARGUNS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO:
- 11 RUBBER BANDS, SPRINGS, AND SEALED AIR CHAMBERS.
- 12 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
