AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to assaults upon station cleaners and terminal cleaners

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. Subdivision 11 of section 120.05 of the penal law, as  
2 amended by chapter 377 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as  
3 follows:  
4     11. With intent to cause physical injury to a train operator, ticket  
5 inspector, conductor, signalperson, bus operator [or], station agent,  
6 STATION CLEANER OR TERMINAL CLEANER employed by any transit agency,  
7 authority or company, public or private, whose operation is authorized  
8 by New York state or any of its political subdivisions, a city marshal,  
9 a traffic enforcement officer, traffic enforcement agent, sanitation  
10 enforcement agent, New York city sanitation worker, registered nurse or  
11 licensed practical nurse he or she causes physical injury to such train  
12 operator, ticket inspector, conductor, signalperson, bus operator [or],  
13 station agent, city marshal, traffic enforcement officer, traffic  
14 enforcement agent, STATION CLEANER OR TERMINAL CLEANER, registered nurse  
15 or licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent or New York  
16 city sanitation worker, while such employee is performing an assigned  
17 duty on, or directly related to, the operation of a train or bus, or  
18 such city marshal, traffic enforcement officer, traffic enforcement  
19 agent, registered nurse or licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforce-  
20 ment agent or New York city sanitation worker, is performing an assigned  
21 duty.  
22     S 2. This act shall take effect on the first of November next succeed-  
23 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
