AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to requiring employers to make a conditional offer of employment before inquiring about any criminal convictions of a prospective employee

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 296 of the executive law is amended by adding a new 2 subdivision 15-a to read as follows:

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15-A. IT SHALL BE AN UNLAWFUL DISCRIMINATORY PRACTICE, UNLESS ICALLY REQUIRED OR PERMITTED BY STATUTE, FOR ANY PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYER, INCLUDING ANY PERSON, AGENCY, BUREAU, CORPORATION OR ASSOCIATION, STATE AND ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION THEREOF, TO MAKE AN INCLUDING THE INOUIRY ABOUT, WHETHER IN ANY FORM OF APPLICATION OR OTHERWISE, UPON ADVERSELY TO THE INDIVIDUAL INVOLVED BASED UPON, ANY CRIMINAL CONVICTION OF SUCH INDIVIDUAL UNLESS SUCH EMPLOYER FIRST MAKES A CONDI-TIONAL OFFER OF EMPLOYMENT TO SUCH INDIVIDUAL. SUCH CONDITIONAL OFFER OF EMPLOYMENT MAY ONLY SUBSEQUENTLY BE WITHDRAWN ON THE BASIS OF A CRIMINAL CONVICTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE TWENTY-THREE-A OF THE CORRECTION LAW WHERE SUCH CONVICTION BEARS A DIRECT RELATIONSHIP, AS SUCH SECTION SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY OF THE DEFINED INSUBDIVISION THREE OF CORRECTION LAW, TO THE SPECIFIC POSITION BEING OFFERED, OR THE SUCH EMPLOYMENT WOULD INVOLVE AN UNREASONABLE RISK TO PROPERTY OR TO THE SAFETY OR WELFARE OF SPECIFIC INDIVIDUALS OR THE GENERAL PUBLIC.

18 S 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 19 have become a law.
