AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the gap elimination adjustment

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subitems (b), (c), (d) and (e) of item 1 of clause (G) of  
2 subparagraph (viii) of paragraph b of subdivision 17 of section 3602 of  
3 the education law, as added by section 37 of part A of chapter 58 of the  
4 laws of 2011, are amended to read as follows:  
5 (b) in the case of a city school district in a city with a population  
6 of more than two hundred fifty thousand inhabitants and less than one  
7 million inhabitants according to the two thousand TEN federal census,  
8 four and one-tenth percent (0.041),  
9 (c) in the case of a city school district in a city with a population  
10 of more than two hundred ten thousand inhabitants and less than two  
11 hundred fifty thousand inhabitants according to the two thousand TEN  
12 federal census, four and thirteen hundredths percent (0.0413),  
13 (d) in the case of a city school district in a city with a population  
14 of more than one hundred seventy thousand inhabitants and less than two  
15 hundred ten thousand inhabitants according to the two thousand TEN  
16 federal census, five and ninety-seven hundredths percent (0.0597),  
17 (e) in the case of a city school district in a city with a population  
18 of more than one hundred thousand inhabitants and less than one hundred  
19 seventy thousand inhabitants according to the two thousand TEN federal  
20 census, five and fifty-three hundredths percent (0.0553),  
21 S 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014.
