AN ACT authorizing the town of Stockport to transfer reserve funds to the Water Fund for repayment of an inter-fund advance from the Town Sewer #1 Fund

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The town of Stockport was unable to pay its water district's 2012 obligations, needed a \$100,000 inter-fund advance from the Town Sewer #1 Fund to pay such obligations, and is unable to repay such inter-fund advance by the close of the fiscal year in which the 5 advance was made as is required by section 9-a of the general municipal law, without a significant rate increase, therefore, notwithstanding 7 section 6-c of the general municipal law or any other provision to the 8 contrary, the governing board of the town of Stockport may authorize by 9 resolution the transfer of \$100,000 from the Capital Reserve Fund created for the purpose of financing the acquisition and/or construction 10 of a municipal complex pursuant to section 6-c of the general municipal 11 12 law to the Water Fund for repayment of such inter-fund advance from the 13 Town Sewer #1 Fund provided that such transfer does not result 14 effect that properties that are not included in the town's water district contribute proportionally more for any project funded by such 15 16 capital reserve fund than the properties included in such water 17 district. The resolution authorized pursuant to this section shall not be subject to referendum. 18 19

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
