AN ACT granting retroactive tier V membership in the New York state and local employees' retirement system to Kirsten Mason, Laura Strizzi, Christian Ward and Austin Horton

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Kirsten Mason,  
2     a member of the New York state and local employees' retirement system,  
3     who was employed on July 1, 2010, by the village of Green Island as a  
4     recreation assistant, and who filed membership applications in such  
5     system on July 7, 2010 which should have given her Tier V status but for  
6     reasons not ascribable to her own negligence and due to an administrative  
7     error, the application was not processed in the usual manner and  
8     therefore not processed until August 16, 2012, may be deemed to have  
9     become a member of the New York state and local employees' retirement  
10    system on July 1, 2010.

11    S 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Laura Strizzi, a  
12    member of the New York state and local employees' retirement system, who  
13    was employed on July 1, 2010, by the village of Green Island as a recreation  
14    assistant, and who filed membership applications in such system on  
15    July 13, 2010 which should have given her Tier V status but for reasons  
16    not ascribable to her own negligence and due to an administrative error,  
17    the application was not processed in the usual manner and therefore not  
18    processed until July 5, 2012, may be deemed to have become a member of  
19    the New York state and local employees' retirement system on July 1,  
20    2010.

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1 S 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Christian Ward, a  
2 member of the New York state and local employees' retirement system, who  
3 was employed on July 1, 2010, by the village of Green Island as a recre-  
4 ation assistant, and who filed membership applications in such system on  
5 July 14, 2010 which should have given him Tier V status but for reasons  
6 not ascribable to his own negligence and due to an administrative error,  
7 the application was not processed in the usual manner and therefore not  
8 processed until July 5, 2012, may be deemed to have become a member of  
9 the New York state and local employees' retirement system on July 1,  
10 2010.

11 S 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, Austin Horton, a  
12 member of the New York state and local employees' retirement system, who  
13 was employed on July 5, 2011, by the village of Green Island as a recre-  
14 ation assistant, and who filed membership applications in such system on  
15 July 5, 2011 which should have given him Tier V status but for reasons  
16 not ascribable to his own negligence and due to an administrative error,  
17 the application was not processed in the usual manner and therefore not  
18 processed until July 19, 2012, may be deemed to have become a member of  
19 the New York state and local employees' retirement system on July 5,  
20 2011.

21 S 5. Any past service costs incurred in implementing the provisions of  
22 this act shall be borne by the village of Green Island.

23 S 6. This act shall take effect immediately.

FISCAL NOTE.--Pursuant to Legislative Law, Section 50:

This bill will deem Kirsten Mason, Laura Strizzi, Christian Ward and Austin Horton, employees of the Village of Green Island, to become Tier 5 members of the New York State and Local Employees' Retirement System by changing their dates of membership in the System to be the dates they first were employed by the Village of Green Island.

If this bill is enacted, we anticipate that there will be an increase in the annual contributions of the Village of Green Island of 5.4% of the annual salaries of these members for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2014.

In addition to the annual contributions discussed above, there will be an immediate past service cost of approximately \$230 which would be borne by the Village of Green Island as a one-time payment. This estimate is based on the assumption that payment would be made on February 1, 2014.
