AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to authorizing insurance coverage for equipment and supplies used for the treatment of ostomies

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subsection (i) of section 3216 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new paragraph 30 to read as follows:

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- (30) EVERY POLICY WHICH PROVIDES MEDICAL COVERAGE THAT INCLUDES COVER-IN A PHYSICIAN'S OFFICE AND EVERY POLICY FOR PHYSICIAN SERVICES WHICH PROVIDES MAJOR MEDICAL OR SIMILAR COMPREHENSIVE-TYPE COVERAGE SHALL INCLUDE COVERAGE FOR THE FOLLOWING EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES USED FOR TREATMENT OF OSTOMIES, IF RECOMMENDED OR PRESCRIBED BY A PHYSICIAN OR OTHER LICENSED HEALTH CARE PROVIDER LEGALLY AUTHORIZED TO PRESCRIBE EIGHT OF THE EDUCATION LAW: UNDER TITLE FLANGES, COLLECTION BAGS, CLAMPS, IRRIGATION DEVICES, SANITIZING PRODUCTS, OSTOMY RINGS AND OSTOMY BELTS. IN ADDITION, THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH PROVIDE AND PERIODICALLY UPDATE BY RULE OR REGULATION A LIST OF ADDI-TIONAL OSTOMY EQUIPMENT AND RELATED SUPPLIES SUCH AS ARE MEDICALLY NECESSARY FOR THE TREATMENT OF OSTOMIES FOR WHICH THERE SHALL ALSO BE COVERAGE.
- S 2. Subsection (k) of section 3221 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new paragraph 19 to read as follows:
- INSURANCE 18 (19) EVERY GROUP OR BLANKET ACCIDENT AND HEALTH19 ISSUED OR ISSUED FOR DELIVERY IN THIS STATE WHICH PROVIDES MEDICAL 20 COVERAGE THAT INCLUDES COVERAGE FOR PHYSICIAN SERVICES IN A PHYSICIAN'S 21 AND EVERY POLICY WHICH PROVIDES MAJOR MEDICAL OR SIMILAR COMPRE-

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HENSIVE-TYPE COVERAGE SHALL INCLUDE COVERAGE FOR THE FOLLOWING EOUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES USED FOR THE TREATMENT OF OSTOMIES, IF RECOMMENDED OR 3 PRESCRIBED BY A PHYSICIAN OR OTHER LICENSED HEALTH CARE PROVIDER LEGALLY AUTHORIZED TO PRESCRIBE UNDER TITLE EIGHT OF THE EDUCATION LAW: FLANGES, COLLECTION BAGS, CLAMPS, IRRIGATION DEVICES, SANITIZING PRODUCTS, OSTOMY RINGS AND OSTOMY BELTS. IN ADDITION, THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT 5 6 7 OF HEALTH SHALL PROVIDE AND PERIODICALLY UPDATE BY RULE OR REGULATION A LIST OF ADDITIONAL OSTOMY EQUIPMENT AND RELATED SUPPLIES SUCH AS ARE 8 9 MEDICALLY NECESSARY FOR THE TREATMENT OF OSTOMIES FOR WHICH THERE SHALL 10 ALSO BE COVERAGE.

- S 3. Section 4303 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new subsection (u-1) to read as follows:
- (U-1) A MEDICAL EXPENSE INDEMNITY CORPORATION OR A HEALTH SERVICE 13 14 CORPORATION WHICH PROVIDES MEDICAL COVERAGE THAT INCLUDES COVERAGE FOR 15 PHYSICIAN SERVICES IN A PHYSICIAN'S OFFICE AND EVERY POLICY PROVIDES MAJOR MEDICAL OR SIMILAR COMPREHENSIVE-TYPE COVERAGE SHALL 16 17 INCLUDE COVERAGE FOR THE FOLLOWING EQUIPMENT AND SUPPLIES USED FOR TREATMENT OF OSTOMIES, IF RECOMMENDED OR PRESCRIBED BY A PHYSICIAN OR 18 19 OTHER LICENSED HEALTH CARE PROVIDER LEGALLY AUTHORIZED TO PRESCRIBE 20 UNDER TITLE EIGHT OF THE EDUCATION LAW: FLANGES, COLLECTION BAGS, CLAMPS, IRRIGATION DEVICES, SANITIZING PRODUCTS, OSTOMY RINGS AND OSTOMY 21 BELTS. IN ADDITION, THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH SHALL 23 PROVIDE AND PERIODICALLY UPDATE BY RULE OR REGULATION A LIST OF ADDI-TIONAL OSTOMY EQUIPMENT AND RELATED SUPPLIES SUCH AS ARE 24 MEDICALLY 25 NECESSARY FOR THE TREATMENT OF OSTOMIES FOR WHICH THERE SHALL ALSO BE COVERAGE. 26
- 27 S 4. This act shall take effect on the first of January next succeed-28 ing the date on which it shall have become a law and shall apply to all 29 policies and contracts issued, renewed, modified, altered or amended on 30 or after such effective date.
