- AN ACT to amend the general business law, in relation to prohibiting issuers from accepting personal financial information of holders from a third-party

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 518-b to read as follows:

3 518-B. PROHIBITED CREDIT CARD USER INFORMATION REQUESTS. 1. ISSUERS OF CREDIT CARDS AND DEBIT CARDS ARE PROHIBITED FROM KNOWINGLY ACCEPTING 4 5 SOLICITING THE PERSONAL FINANCIAL INFORMATION OF A HOLDER FROM A OR THIRD-PARTY. PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT NO PROVISION OF THIS SECTION 6 SHALL 7 ΒE DEEMED TO PROHIBIT AN ISSUER OF A CREDIT CARD OR DEBIT CARD FROM 8 ACCEPTING OR SOLICITING FROM A BANKING ORGANIZATION, AS DEFINED IN SECTION TWO OF THE BANKING LAW, THE PERSONAL INFORMATION OF A HOLDER FOR 9 THE PURPOSE OF VERIFYING THE IDENTITY OF SUCH HOLDER AND PREVENT IMPROP-10 11 ER OR UNAUTHORIZED USE.

12 2. A VIOLATION OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION BY AN ISSUER SHALL BE 13 PUNISHABLE BY A CIVIL PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR 14 EACH SUCH VIOLATION.

15 S 2. This act shall take effect on the first of September next 16 succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law.
