- AN ACT to amend the insurance law, in relation to third party notification by insurance carriers in certain instances in regard to long term care policies; prohibiting the inclusion of certain goods and services in the sale of certain insurance policies without the insured's informed consent, and providing a specific penalty for violation of such prohibition

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subsection (f) of section 3111 of the insurance law, as 2 relettered by section 30 of part B of chapter 58 of the laws of 2004, is 3 relettered subsection (g) and a new subsection (f) is added to read as 4 follows:

5 (F) EVERY INSURER THAT HAS IN FORCE A LONG-TERM CARE INSURANCE POLICY 6 AS DEFINED IN SECTION ONE THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SEVENTEEN OF THIS CHAPTER 7 THE PREMIUMS FOR WHICH ARE PAID DIRECTLY TO THE INSURER BY THE SENIOR 8 CITIZEN INSURED SHALL PERMIT THE INSURED TO DESIGNATE A PARTY TO WHOM 9 THE INSURER SHALL TRANSMIT NOTICES OF NONPAYMENT OF PREMIUMS DUE OR 10 NOTICE OF CANCELLATION FOR NONPAYMENT OF PREMIUMS, AS DETERMINED BY THE INSURER. THE SENIOR CITIZEN SHALL NOTIFY THE INSURER THAT A THIRD PARTY 11 HAS BEEN SO DESIGNATED. SUCH NOTIFICATION SHALL BE DELIVERED 12 TO THE INSURER BY CERTIFIED MAIL, RETURN RECEIPT REQUESTED, AND SHALL BE EFFEC-13 LATER THAN TEN BUSINESS DAYS FROM THE DATE OF RECEIPT BY THE 14 TIVE NOT INSURER. THE NOTIFICATION MUST CONTAIN, IN WRITING, AN ACCEPTANCE BY THE 15 16 THIRD PARTY DESIGNEE TO RECEIVE SUCH NOTICES OF CANCELLATION. SHOULD THE 17 THIRD PARTY DESIGNEE DESIRE TO TERMINATE HIS OR HER STATUS AS А THIRD PARTY DESIGNEE, SUCH DESIGNEE SHALL PROVIDE WRITTEN NOTICE TO BOTH THE 18 19 INSURER AND THE SENIOR CITIZEN INSURED. SHOULD THE SENIOR CITIZEN

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TO TERMINATE THE THIRD PARTY DESIGNATION, THE INSURED 1 INSURED DESIRE 2 SHALL PROVIDE WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE INSURER. THE TRANSMISSION TO THE 3 ANY SUCH NOTICE OF CANCELLATION SHALL BE IN THIRD PARTY DESIGNEE OF 4 ADDITION TO А COPY OF SUCH DOCUMENT TRANSMITTED TO THE SENIOR CITIZEN 5 INSURED AND WHEN A THIRD PARTY IS SO DESIGNATED ALL SUCH NOTICES SHALL 6 MAILED IN AN ENVELOPE CLEARLY MARKED ON ITS FACE WITH THE FOLLOWING: ΒE 7 "IMPORTANT INSURANCE POLICY INFORMATION: OPEN IMMEDIATELY". DESIGNATION 8 AS A THIRD PARTY SHALL NOT CONSTITUTE ACCEPTANCE OF ANY LIABILITY ON THE 9 THIRD PARTY FOR SERVICES PROVIDED TO SUCH SENIOR CITIZEN. THE INSURER 10 SHALL NOTIFY ITS INSURED SENIOR CITIZEN ANNUALLY IN WRITING OF THE 11 THIRD PARTY DESIGNEE NOTICE PROCEDURE AND PROVIDE AVAILABILITY OF THE INFORMATION ON HOW THE INSURED CAN COMMENCE THIS PROCEDURE; 12 HOWEVER, 13 SUCH NOTICE NEED NOT BE PROVIDED ONCE A SENIOR CITIZEN HAS MADE A DESIG-14 NATION.

15 S 2. Subsection (a) of section 2324 of the insurance law, as amended 16 by chapter 291 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

17 (a) (1) No authorized insurer, no licensed insurance agent, no 18 licensed insurance broker, and no employee or other representative of 19 any such insurer, agent or broker shall make, procure or negotiate any 20 contract of insurance other than as plainly expressed in the policy or 21 other written contract issued or to be issued as evidence thereof, or 22 shall directly or indirectly, by giving or sharing a commission or in any manner whatsoever, pay or allow or offer to pay or allow to the 23 insured or to any employee of the insured, either as an inducement to 24 25 the making of insurance or after insurance has been effected, any rebate 26 from the premium which is specified in the policy, or any special favor or advantage in the dividends or other benefit to accrue thereon, or 27 shall give or offer to give any valuable consideration or inducement of 28 29 any kind, directly or indirectly, which is not specified in such policy or contract, other than any valuable consideration, including but not limited to merchandise or periodical subscriptions, not exceeding twen-30 31 32 ty-five dollars in value, or shall give, sell or purchase, or offer to 33 give, sell or purchase, as an inducement to the making of such insurance in connection therewith, any stock, bond or other securities or any 34 or dividends or profits accrued thereon, nor shall the insured, his OR HER 35 agent or representative knowingly receive directly or indirectly, any 36 37 such rebate or special favor or advantage, provided, however, a licensed 38 insurance agent or a licensed insurance broker may retain the usual 39 commission or underwriting fee on insurance placed on his OR HER own 40 property or risks, if the aggregate of such commissions or underwriting fees will not exceed five percent of the total net commissions or under-41 42 writing fees received by such licensed insurance agent or insurance broker during the calendar year. 43

44 (2) NO AUTHORIZED INSURER, NO LICENSED INSURANCE AGENT, NO LICENSED
45 INSURANCE BROKER, AND NO EMPLOYEE OR OTHER REPRESENTATIVE OF ANY SUCH
46 INSURER, AGENT OR BROKER SHALL INCLUDE WITH THE SALE OF AN INSURANCE
47 POLICY ANY OTHER INSURANCE POLICY OR PRODUCT OR OTHER GOODS AND SERVICES
48 WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING THE INFORMED CONSENT OF THE PROPOSED INSURED.

49 S 3. Subsection (f) of section 2324 of the insurance law is amended to 50 read as follows:

51 (f) (1) Any person or corporation violating the provisions of this 52 section shall, in addition to all other penalties provided by law, pay 53 to the people of this state as a penalty the sum of five hundred dollars 54 for each such violation.

55 (2) ANY PERSON OR CORPORATION VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH 56 TWO OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION SHALL, IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER 1 PENALTIES PROVIDED BY LAW, PAY A FINE IN THE SUM OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS 2 FOR EACH SUCH VIOLATION.

3 S 4. Subsection (c) of section 4224 of the insurance law, as amended 4 by chapter 291 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

(c) (1) Except as permitted by section three thousand two hundred thirty-nine of this chapter, no such life insurance company and no such 5 б 7 savings and insurance bank and no officer, agent, solicitor or represen-8 tative thereof and no such insurer doing in this state the business of 9 accident and health insurance and no officer, agent, solicitor or repre-10 sentative thereof, and no licensed insurance broker and no employee or 11 other representative of any such insurer, agent or broker, shall pay, allow or give, or offer to pay, allow or give, directly or indirectly, 12 13 as an inducement to any person to insure, or shall give, sell or 14 purchase, or offer to give, sell or purchase, as such inducement, or 15 interdependent with any policy of life insurance or annuity contract or policy of accident and health insurance, any stocks, bonds, or other 16 17 securities, or any dividends or profits accruing or to accrue thereon, any valuable consideration or inducement whatever not specified in 18 or 19 such policy or contract other than any valuable consideration, including 20 but not limited to merchandise or periodical subscriptions, not exceed-21 twenty-five dollars in value; nor shall any person in this state inq 22 knowingly receive as such inducement, any rebate of premium or policy 23 fee or any special favor or advantage in the dividends or other benefits accrue on any such policy or contract, or knowingly receive any paid 24 to 25 employment or contract for services of any kind, or any valuable consid-26 eration or inducement whatever which is not specified in such policy or 27 contract.

28 SUCH LIFE INSURANCE COMPANY AND NO SUCH SAVINGS AND INSURANCE (2) NO BANK AND NO SUCH INSURER DOING IN THIS STATE THE BUSINESS OF 29 ACCIDENT AND HEALTH INSURANCE AND NO OFFICER, AGENT, SOLICITOR OR REPRESENTATIVE 30 THEREOF AND NO LICENSED INSURANCE BROKER AND NO EMPLOYEE OR OTHER REPRE-31 32 SENTATIVE OF ANY SUCH INSURER, AGENT OR BROKER SHALL INCLUDE WITH THE 33 INSURANCE POLICY ANY OTHER INSURANCE POLICY OR PRODUCT OR SALE OF AN 34 OTHER GOODS AND SERVICES WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING THE INFORMED CONSENT OF 35 THE PROPOSED INSURED.

36 S 5. Section 4224 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new 37 subsection (f) to read as follows:

38 (F) ANY PERSON OR CORPORATION VIOLATING THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH 39 TWO OF SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION SHALL IN ADDITION TO ALL OTHER 40 PENALTIES PROVIDED BY LAW PAY A FINE IN THE SUM OF ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS 41 FOR EACH SUCH VIOLATION.

S 6. This act shall take effect immediately, except that section one of this act shall take effect on the first of January next succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law and shall apply to policies issued or renewed on or after such date.
