AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to training regarding domestic violence

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Paragraph a of subdivision 3 of section 6507 of the education law, as amended by chapter 554 of the laws of 2013, is amended to read as follows:

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a. Establish standards for preprofessional and professional education, experience and licensing examinations as required to implement the article for each profession. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commissioner shall establish standards requiring that all persons applyon or after January first, nineteen hundred ninety-one, initially, or for the renewal of, a license, registration or limited permit to be a physician, chiropractor, dentist, registered nurse, podiatrist, trist, psychiatrist, psychologist, licensed master social licensed clinical social worker, licensed creative arts therapist, licensed marriage and family therapist, licensed mental health counselicensed psychoanalyst, dental hygienist, licensed analyst, or certified behavior analyst assistant shall, in addition to all the other licensure, certification or permit requirements, have completed [two] THREE hours of coursework or training regarding the identification and reporting of child abuse [and], maltreatment, AND

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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DOMESTIC VIOLENCE. The coursework or training shall be obtained from an institution or provider which has been approved by the department to provide such coursework or training. The coursework or training include information regarding the physical and behavioral indicators of 5 child abuse [and], maltreatment, AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE and the statutory reporting requirements set out in sections four hundred thirteen through 6 7 four hundred twenty of the social services law, including but not limit-8 ed to, when and how a report must be made, what other actions the reporter is mandated or authorized to take, the legal protections afforded 9 10 reporters, and the consequences for failing to report. THE COMMISSIONER ESTABLISH STANDARDS REQUIRING THAT BEGINNING JANUARY FIRST, TWO 11 THOUSAND FIFTEEN, ONE HOUR OF THE THREE COURSEWORK OR 12 TRAINING HOURS 13 RELATIONSHIP SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION REGARDING THE BETWEEN CHILD 14 ABUSE, MALTREATMENT, AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND THEIDENTIFICATION 15 BEHAVIORAL AND PHYSICAL INDICATORS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AS DEFINED IN 16 SECTION FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-NINE-A OF THE SOCIAL SERVICES LAW. Such coursework or training may also include information regarding the phys-17 ical and behavioral indicators of the abuse of individuals with mental 18 19 retardation and other developmental disabilities and voluntary reporting 20 abused or neglected adults to the office of mental retardation and 21 developmental disabilities or the local adult protective services unit. 22 Each applicant shall provide the department with documentation showing 23 that he or she has completed the required training. The department shall provide an exemption from the child abuse [and], maltreatment, 24 25 training requirements to any applicant who requests DOMESTIC VIOLENCE 26 such an exemption and who shows, to the department's satisfaction, 27 there would be no need because of the nature of his or her practice for 28 him or her to complete such training;
