AN ACT to amend the agriculture and markets law, in relation to training, examination and certification of dog control officers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The agriculture and markets law is amended by adding a new 2 section 114-a to read as follows:

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- S 114-A. TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION OF DOG CONTROL OFFICERS. 1. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DEVELOP A TRAINING, EXAMINATION AND CERTIFICATION PROGRAM FOR DOG CONTROL OFFICERS, POLICE OFFICERS AND PEACE OFFICERS WHO DEAL WITH ANIMAL CONTROL OR ANIMAL ABUSE ISSUES.
- 7 EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION, ANY 8 PERSON APPOINTED AS A DOG CONTROL OFFICER SHALL, WHERE REQUIRED BY GOVERNING BODY OF ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, COMPLETE A COURSE OF TRAIN-9 10 APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND SHALL TAKE AND PASS AN EXAMINATION GIVEN BY THE DEPARTMENT. ANY PERSON CURRENTLY EMPLOYED AS A DOG CONTROL 11 WHERE REQUIRED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF ANY POLITICAL 12 OFFICER SHALL, 13 SUBDIVISION, COMPLETE THE TRAINING AND TAKE AND PASS THE EXAMINATION NO LATER THAN DECEMBER FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN. THE TRAINING AND 14 15 CERTIFICATION SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO, BUT NOT REQUIRED FOR POLICE CERS OR PEACE OFFICERS WHO DEAL WITH ANIMAL CONTROL OR ANIMAL ABUSE 16 17 ISSUES.
- 18 (B) A VETERINARIAN LICENSED PURSUANT TO ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED 19 THIRTY-FIVE OF THE EDUCATION LAW SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE TRAINING 20 REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION.
- 21 3. THE TRAINING PROGRAM REQUIRED BY THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE TRAIN-22 ING REGARDING:
 - (A) THE SCOPE OF THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DOG CONTROL OFFICER;

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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(B) APPROPRIATE AND HUMANE HANDLING OF ANIMALS, INCLUDING TRANSPORTING ANIMALS SAFELY, GENERAL ANIMAL CONTROL AND PROPER METHODS FOR CAPTURING ANIMALS;

- (C) THE LAWS AND RULES REGARDING DOG LICENSING, AND SEARCH AND SEIZURE;
 - (D) CRISIS INTERVENTION AND OFFICER SAFETY;
- (E) IDENTIFICATION OF RESOURCES TO HOUSE ANIMALS WHILE A CRIMINAL CASE IS RESOLVED;
 - (F) REPORT WRITING AND COURTROOM TESTIMONY;
 - (G) DISPOSAL OF THE REMAINS OF DECEASED ANIMALS;
 - (H) IDENTIFICATION AND NOTIFICATION OF AN ANIMAL'S OWNER; AND
 - (I) OTHER RELEVANT PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER.
- 4. GOVERNING BODIES OF POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS THAT REQUIRE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION SHALL TERMINATE THE APPOINTMENT OF ANY DOG CONTROL OFFICER WHO FAILS TO OBTAIN SUCH TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION WITHIN THE REQUIRED PERIOD OF TIME.
- 5. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL: (A) DETERMINE THE FORMAT OF THE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION EXAMINATIONS, INCLUDING AN INTERNET-BASED FORMAT IF THE DEPARTMENT DEEMS SUCH TO BE APPROPRIATE;
 - (B) ESTABLISH THE SCHEDULE FOR OFFERING TRAINING AND EXAMINATIONS; AND
- 21 (C) PROMULGATE RULES, REGULATIONS AND STANDARDS REGARDING THE APPLICA-22 TION OF THE TRAINING AND CERTIFICATION TOWARD RECERTIFICATION OR CONTIN-23 UING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS.
- S 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015, provided that, effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date are authorized to be made on or before such effective date.
