- AN ACT to amend the education law and the public health law, in relation to requiring cultural awareness and competence training for all medical professionals; to amend the public health law, in relation to a public health education program; and making an appropriation therefor

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new section 6505-d 2 to read as follows:

3 S 6505-D. COURSE WORK OR TRAINING IN CULTURAL AWARENESS AND COMPE-4 TENCE. 1. EVERY PHYSICIAN, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, DENTIST, REGISTERED 5 LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, PODIATRIST, OPTOMETRIST AND DENTAL NURSE, б HYGIENIST PRACTICING IN THE STATE SHALL, ON OR BEFORE JULY FIRST, TWO 7 THOUSAND SIXTEEN AND EVERY TWO YEARS THEREAFTER, COMPLETE COURSE WORK OR 8 TRAINING APPROPRIATE TO THE PROFESSIONAL'S PRACTICE APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT REGARDING CULTURAL AWARENESS AND COMPETENCE IN THE 9 NON-DIS-10 CRIMINATORY PROVISION OF MEDICAL SERVICES, IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATORY 11 STANDARDS PROMULGATED BY THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE 12 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ALSO CONSULT WITH ORGANIZA-13 TIONS REPRESENTATIVE OF PROFESSIONS, INSTITUTIONS AND THOSE WITH EXPER-TISE IN CULTURAL AWARENESS AND COMPETENCE WITH RESPECT TO THE REGULATORY 14 STANDARDS PROMULGATED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. 15

2. EACH SUCH PROFESSIONAL SHALL DOCUMENT TO THE DEPARTMENT AT THE TIME
OF REGISTRATION COMMENCING WITH THE FIRST REGISTRATION AFTER JULY FIRST,
TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN THAT THE PROFESSIONAL HAS COMPLETED COURSE WORK OR
TRAINING IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT A

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1 PROFESSIONAL SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH (F) OF SUBDIVISION 2 ONE OF SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED FIVE-K OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW 3 SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO SO DOCUMENT.

4 3. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE AN EXEMPTION FROM THIS REQUIREMENT TO 5 ANYONE WHO REQUESTS SUCH AN EXEMPTION AND WHO (I) CLEARLY DEMONSTRATES 6 THE DEPARTMENT'S SATISFACTION THAT THERE WOULD BE NO NEED FOR HIM OR TΟ 7 HER TO COMPLETE SUCH COURSE WORK OR TRAINING BECAUSE OF THENATURE OF 8 OR HER PRACTICE OR (II) THAT HE OR SHE HAS COMPLETED COURSE WORK OR HIS TRAINING DEEMED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO BE EQUIVALENT TO THE COURSE WORK OR 9 10 TRAINING APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

11 S 2. Paragraph (f) of subdivision 1 of section 2805-k of the public 12 health law, as amended by chapter 477 of the laws of 2008, is amended to 13 read as follows:

(f) Documentation that the physician, dentist or podiatrist has completed the course work or training as mandated by section two hundred thirty-nine of this chapter or section six thousand five hundred five-b of the education law OR SECTION SIX THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FIVE-D OF THE EDUCATION LAW. A hospital or facility shall not grant or renew professional privileges or association to a physician, dentist, or podiatrist who has not completed such course work or training.

21 S 3. Section 206 of the public health law is amended by adding a new 22 subdivision 29 to read as follows:

23 29. THE COMMISSIONER IS AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO DEVELOP AND IMPLE-MENT A STATEWIDE, COMMUNITY-BASED PUBLIC HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM 24 TO 25 ROOT CAUSES OF DISPARITIES IN MINORITY HEALTH CARE. SUCH REDUCE THE 26 EDUCATION PROGRAM SHALL BE AIMED AT HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS, PATIENTS 27 AND PATIENT ADVOCATES. THE COMMISSIONER AND THE DEPARTMENT MAY CONSULT 28 WITH THE APPROPRIATE PROFESSIONALS IN DEVELOPING AND IMPLEMENTING SUCH A 29 PROGRAM. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ADMINISTER ANY STATE FUNDS APPROPRIATED 30 FOR SUCH HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAM.

31 The sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), or so much S 4. 32 thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to the department of 33 health out of any moneys in the state treasury in the general fund to 34 the credit of the state purposes account, not otherwise appropriated, 35 and made immediately available, for such purpose of carrying out the provisions of section three of this act. Such moneys shall be payable on 36 37 the audit and warrant of the comptroller on vouchers certified or 38 approved by the commissioner of health, or his or her duly designated 39 representative in the manner prescribed by law. No expenditure shall be 40 made from this appropriation until a certificate of approval of availability shall have been issued by the director of the budget and filed 41 with the state comptroller and a copy filed with the chairman of the 42 43 senate finance committee and the chairman of the assembly ways and means 44 committee. Such certificate may be amended from time to time by the 45 director of the budget and a copy of each such amendment shall be filed with the state comptroller, the chairman of the senate finance committee 46 47 and the chairman of the assembly ways and means committee. 48 S 5. This act shall take effect immediately.
