THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 S 8800. INTRODUCTION. THIS ARTICLE APPLIES TO THE PROFESSION OF VISION 2 REHABILITATION SERVICES, AND PROVIDES FOR THE LICENSING OF LICENSED 3 ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS AND VISION REHABILITATION THERA-4 PISTS. THE GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR ALL PROFESSIONS CONTAINED IN ARTICLE 5 ONE HUNDRED THIRTY OF THIS TITLE SHALL APPLY TO THIS ARTICLE.

6 S 8801. DEFINITIONS. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE, THE FOLLOWING TERMS 7 SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING MEANINGS:

8 1. THE PRACTICE OF "ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY TRAINING" SHALL MEAN: (A) THE ASSESSMENT OF INDIVIDUAL NEEDS OF PERSONS WHO ARE VISUALLY 9 10 IMPAIRED FOR SKILLS TRAINING IN METHODS OF SAFE MOVEMENT AND IN STRATE-GIES TO GATHER REQUIRED ENVIRONMENTAL AND SPATIAL INFORMATION; (B) 11 THE DEVELOPMENT OF APPROPRIATE INTEGRATED SERVICE PLANS TAILORED TO MEET 12 SUCH INDIVIDUAL NEEDS AS IDENTIFIED IN SUCH ASSESSMENT PROCESS; (C) 13 THE 14 PROVISION OF TRAINING IN, AND UTILIZATION OF (I) EQUIPMENT AND ADAPTIVE DEVICES INTENDED AND DESIGNED FOR USE BY PERSONS WHO ARE VISUALLY 15 16 IMPAIRED, AND (II) SPECIALIZED TECHNIQUES ADAPTED FOR PERSONS WHO ARE VISUALLY IMPAIRED, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO ORIENTATION; SENSORY 17 DEVELOPMENT; SYSTEMS OF SAFE MOVEMENT, INCLUDING LONG CANE TECHNIOUES; 18 19 RESOURCE IDENTIFICATION AND, AS APPROPRIATE, PROFESSIONAL REFERRALS; 20 AND, IN APPLIED SETTINGS, REINFORCING INSTRUCTION FOR THE USE OF OPTICAL 21 DEVICES AS PRESCRIBED BY OPTOMETRISTS AND OPHTHALMOLOGISTS; AND (D) THE EVALUATION OF CLIENTS RECEIVING SUCH SPECIALIZED TRAINING. 22

23 2. THE PRACTICE OF "VISION REHABILITATION THERAPY" SHALL MEAN: (A) THE 24 ASSESSMENT OF INDIVIDUAL NEEDS OF PERSONS WHO ARE VISUALLY IMPAIRED FOR 25 SKILLS TRAINING IN INDEPENDENT LIVING AND COMMUNICATIONS; (B) THE DEVEL-26 OPMENT OF APPROPRIATE INTEGRATED SERVICE PLANS TAILORED TO MEET SUCH INDIVIDUAL NEEDS AS IDENTIFIED IN SUCH ASSESSMENT PROCESS; (C) THE 27 28 PROVISION OF TRAINING IN, AND UTILIZATION OF (I) EQUIPMENT AND ADAPTIVE 29 DEVICES INTENDED AND DESIGNED FOR USE BY PERSONS WHO ARE VISUALLY IMPAIRED, INCLUDING, IN APPLIED SETTINGS, REINFORCING INSTRUCTION FOR 30 THE USE OF OPTICAL DEVICES AS PRESCRIBED BY OPTOMETRISTS OR OPHTHALMOLO-31 32 GISTS, AND (II) SPECIALIZED TECHNIQUES ADAPTED FOR PERSONS WHO ARE VISU-ALLY IMPAIRED, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO BRAILLE AND OTHER COMMUNI-33 CATION SKILLS; ADAPTED COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY; PERSONAL MANAGEMENT SKILLS; 34 35 HOME MANAGEMENT SKILLS; PROBLEM SOLVING SKILLS; RESOURCE MANAGEMENT AND, AS APPROPRIATE, PROFESSIONAL REFERRALS; AND (D) THE EVALUATION OF 36 37 PERSONS RECEIVING SUCH SPECIALIZED TRAINING.

3. THE PRACTICE OF "VISION REHABILITATION SERVICES" SHALL MEAN PROVID-ING ASSESSMENT AND EVALUATION OF, AND TRAINING FOR, PERSONS WHO ARE 38 39 40 VISUALLY IMPAIRED WHEN SUCH ASSESSMENT, EVALUATION AND TRAINING INCORPO-RATES THE FULL RANGE OF SPECIALIZED SKILLS AND TASKS SUBSUMED IN THE TWO 41 PROFESSIONS DEFINED IN THIS SECTION AS: (A) ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY 42 43 TRAINING AND (B) VISION REHABILITATION THERAPY. SUCH SERVICES SHALL BE 44 RENDERED ON THE PRESCRIPTION OR REFERRAL WHICH MAY BE DIRECTIVE AS TO 45 TREATMENT BY A LICENSED PHYSICIAN OR OPTOMETRIST, PROVIDED HOWEVER THAT NO SUCH TREATMENT DIRECTIVE AND LOW VISION EXAMINATION SHALL BE REQUIRED 46 47 WHEN THE PERSON BEING REFERRED HAS BEEN DIAGNOSED WITHIN THE PREVIOUS 48 TWELVE MONTHS AS VISUALLY IMPAIRED, BLIND OR LEGALLY BLIND AS THOSE TERMS ARE DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION FIVE OF THIS SECTION AND SUCH SERVICES 49 50 ARE BEING RENDERED CONSISTENT WITH THAT DIAGNOSIS, PRESCRIPTION OR REFERRAL. VISION REHABILITATION THERAPISTS AND ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY 51 SPECIALISTS MAY NOT PRESCRIBE OPTICAL LOW VISION DEVICES. 52

53 4. "APPLIED SETTINGS" MEANS THOSE LOCATIONS WHERE PERSONS WHO ARE 54 VISUALLY IMPAIRED ENGAGE IN DAY-TO-DAY ACTIVITIES UTILIZING THE TOOLS 55 SUPPLIED AND TECHNIQUES TAUGHT BY THE LICENSED PRACTITIONERS DEFINED IN 56 THIS ARTICLE.

5. "VISUALLY IMPAIRED" MEANS A PERSON WHO IS TOTALLY BLIND, LEGALLY 1 BLIND OR PARTIALLY SIGHTED. A PERSON WHO IS BLIND IS ONE WHO HAS NO 2 3 USEABLE VISION. A PERSON WHO IS LEGALLY BLIND IS ONE WHO SATISFIES THE 4 DEFINITION SET FORTH IN SUBDIVISION B OF SECTION THREE OF CHAPTER FOUR 5 HUNDRED FIFTEEN OF THE LAWS OF NINETEEN HUNDRED THIRTEEN. A PERSON WHO 6 IS PARTIALLY SIGHTED IS ONE WHO HAS FUNCTIONAL VISION IMPAIRMENT THAT 7 CONSTITUTES A SIGNIFICANT LIMITATION OF VISUAL CAPABILITY RESULTING FROM 8 DISEASE, TRAUMA, OR CONGENITAL CONDITION, THAT CANNOT BE FULLY AMELIO-9 RATED BY STANDARD REFRACTIVE CORRECTION, MEDICATION, OR SURGERY, AND 10 IS MANIFESTED BY ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING: INSUFFICIENT VISUAL THAT 11 RESOLUTION, INADEQUATE FIELD OF VISION OR REDUCED PEAK CONTRAST SENSI-12 TIVITY.

13 8802. USE OF THE TITLES "LICENSED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIAL-S 14 ISTS" AND "VISION REHABILITATION THERAPISTS". 1. PRACTICE OF ORIEN-TATION AND MOBILITY TRAINING AND USE OF THE TITLE "LICENSED ORIENTATION 15 AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS". ONLY A PERSON LICENSED OR OTHERWISE AUTHOR-16 17 IZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL PRACTICE ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY TRAINING 18 TITLE "LICENSED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS" IN OR USE THECONNECTION WITH HIS OR HER NAME OR WITH ANY TRADE NAME IN THE CONDUCT OF 19 20 HIS OR HER PROFESSION.

21 2. PRACTICE OF VISION REHABILITATION THERAPY AND USE OF THE TITLE 22 "VISION REHABILITATION THERAPIST". ONLY A PERSON LICENSED OR OTHERWISE 23 AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS ARTICLE SHALL PRACTICE VISION REHABILITATION THER-24 APY OR USE THE TITLE "VISION REHABILITATION THERAPIST" IN CONNECTION 25 WITH HIS OR HER NAME OR WITH ANY TRADE NAME IN THE CONDUCT OF HIS OR HER 26 PROFESSION.

8803. STATE BOARD FOR VISION REHABILITATION SERVICES. A STATE BOARD 27 S 28 FOR VISION REHABILITATION SERVICES SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSIONER FOR THE PURPOSE OF 29 ASSISTING THE BOARD OF REGENTS AND THE DEPARTMENT ON MATTERS OF PROFES-30 SIONAL LICENSING AND PROFESSIONAL CONDUCT IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 31 32 SIXTY-FIVE HUNDRED EIGHT OF THIS TITLE. THE BOARD SHALL CONSIST OF NOT 33 LESS THAN FOURTEEN INDIVIDUALS, FOUR OF WHOM SHALL BE LICENSED ORIEN-34 TATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS, FOUR OF WHOM SHALL BE LICENSED VISION REHABILITATION THERAPISTS, ONE OPHTHALMOLOGIST SPECIALIZING 35 IN LOW VISION TREATMENT, ONE OPTOMETRIST SPECIALIZING IN LOW VISION TREATMENT 36 37 AND FOUR OF WHOM SHALL BE BLIND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE PUBLIC AT LARGE 38 WHOSE NAMES WILL BE PLACED IN NOMINATION FOR THE BOARD FROM ORGANIZA-39 TIONS OF THE BLIND OR VISUALLY IMPAIRED. MEMBERS OF THE INITIAL BOARD 40 NEED NOT BE LICENSED PRIOR TO THEIR APPOINTMENT TO THE BOARD. OF THE MEMBERS FIRST APPOINTED, FOUR SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR A THREE YEAR TERM, 41 FIVE SHALL BE APPOINTED FOR A FOUR YEAR TERM, AND FIVE 42 SHALL BE 43 APPOINTED FOR A FIVE YEAR TERM. THEREAFTER ALL MEMBERS SHALL SERVE FOR 44 FIVE YEAR TERMS. IN THE EVENT THAT MORE THAN FOURTEEN MEMBERS ARE 45 APPOINTED, A MAJORITY OF THE ADDITIONAL MEMBERS SHALL BE LICENSED ORIEN-TATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS AND LICENSED VISION REHABILITATION THER-46 47 APISTS. THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD SHALL SELECT ONE OF THEMSELVES AS CHAIR 48 ΤO SERVE FOR A ONE YEAR TERM. AN EXECUTIVE SECRETARY SHALL BE APPOINTED 49 BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS UPON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSIONER.

50 S 8804. REQUIREMENTS FOR A LICENSE. 1. TO QUALIFY FOR A LICENSE AS AN 51 ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST, AN APPLICANT SHALL FULFILL THE 52 FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS:

(A) APPLICATION: FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT;

54 (B) EDUCATION/EXPERIENCE: (I) HAVE SATISFACTORILY COMPLETED AN 55 APPROVED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY CURRICULUM IN A BACCALAUREATE OR 56 MASTERS PROGRAM, OR A CERTIFICATE PROGRAM SATISFACTORY TO THE DEPARTMENT 1 WHICH IS SUBSTANTIALLY EQUIVALENT TO A BACCALAUREATE DEGREE PROGRAM, IN 2 ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS; AND

3 (II) HAVE A MINIMUM OF THREE MONTHS OF SUPERVISED ORIENTATION AND 4 MOBILITY EXPERIENCE WHICH SUPERVISION AND EXPERIENCE SHALL BE SATISFAC-5 TORY TO THE STATE BOARD FOR VISION REHABILITATION SERVICES AND IN 6 ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS;

7 (C) EXAMINATION: PASS AN EXAMINATION SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND TN 8 ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS THAT MAY BE BASED ON AN 9 EXAM UTILIZED BY ANY NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ACCREDITING OR CERTIFICATION 10 SUCH AS THE ACADEMY FOR CERTIFICATION OF VISION REHABILITATION AND BODY EDUCATION PROFESSIONALS (ACVREP), NATIONAL ORIENTATION AND 11 MOBILITY 12 (NOMC) ADMINISTERED BY THE NATIONAL BLINDNESS PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATE CERTIFICATION BOARD (NBPCB) OR AN EQUIVALENT EXAM. 13

14 (D) AGE: BE AT LEAST TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE;

15 (E) CHARACTER: BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPART-16 MENT;

17 (F) REGISTRATION: ALL LICENSED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS 18 SHALL REGISTER TRIENNIALLY WITH THE DEPARTMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 19 COMMISSIONER'S REGULATION;

20 (G) MANDATORY CONTINUING COMPETENCY: (I)(A) EACH LICENSED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST REQUIRED UNDER THIS ARTICLE TO REGISTER TRIENNI-21 22 ALLY WITH THE DEPARTMENT TO PRACTICE IN THE STATE SHALL COMPLY WITH THE 23 THE MANDATORY CONTINUING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS PROVISIONS OF PRESCRIBED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN 24 25 CLAUSES (B) AND (C) OF THIS SUBPARAGRAPH. ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY 26 SPECIALISTS WHO DO NOT SATISFY THE MANDATORY CONTINUING COMPETENCY 27 REQUIREMENTS SHALL NOT BE AUTHORIZED TO PRACTICE UNTIL THEY HAVE MET 28 SUCH REQUIREMENTS, AND THEY HAVE BEEN ISSUED A REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE, 29 EXCEPT THAT AN ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST MAY PRACTICE WITHOUT HAVING MET SUCH REQUIREMENTS IF HE OR SHE IS ISSUED A CONDITIONAL REGIS-30 TRATION PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (III) OF THIS PARAGRAPH. 31

32 (B) ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALISTS SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE MANDATORY CONTINUING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENT FOR THE TRIENNIAL REGISTRA-33 34 TION PERIOD DURING WHICH THEY ARE FIRST LICENSED. ADJUSTMENT ΤO THE 35 MANDATORY CONTINUING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS MAY BE GRANTED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR REASONS OF HEALTH OF THE LICENSEE WHERE CERTIFIED BY 36 AN 37 APPROPRIATE HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL, FOR EXTENDED ACTIVE DUTY WITH THE 38 ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, OR FOR OTHER GOOD CAUSE ACCEPTABLE TO 39 THE DEPARTMENT WHICH MAY PREVENT COMPLIANCE.

40 (C) A LICENSED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST NOT ENGAGED IN41 PRACTICE, AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT, SHALL BE EXEMPT FROM THE MANDATORY CONTINUING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENT UPON THE FILING OF A STATE-42 43 MENT WITH THE DEPARTMENT DECLARING SUCH STATUS. ANY LICENSEE WHO RETURNS 44 PRACTICE OF THE PROFESSION OF ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST TO 45 DURING THE TRIENNIAL REGISTRATION PERIOD SHALL NOTIFY THE DEPARTMENT PRIOR TO REENTERING THE PROFESSION AND SHALL MEET SUCH MANDATORY CONTIN-46 47 UING COMPETENCY REQUIREMENTS AS SHALL BE PRESCRIBED BY REGULATIONS OF 48 THE COMMISSIONER.

49 (II) DURING EACH TRIENNIAL REGISTRATION PERIOD AN APPLICANT FOR REGIS-50 TRATION AS AN ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST SHALL COMPLETE A MINI-51 MUM OF TWENTY-FOUR HOURS OF ACCEPTABLE LEARNING ACTIVITIES WHICH CONTRIBUTE TO CONTINUING COMPETENCE, AS SPECIFIED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (IV) 52 OF THIS PARAGRAPH, PROVIDED FURTHER THAT AT LEAST SIXTEEN HOURS SHALL BE 53 54 IN RECOGNIZED AREAS OF STUDY PERTINENT TO THE PROFESSIONAL SCOPE OF Α 55 LICENSED ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST. ANY ORIENTATION AND MOBIL-56 SPECIALIST WHOSE FIRST REGISTRATION DATE FOLLOWING THE EFFECTIVE ITY

DATE OF THIS SECTION OCCURS LESS THAN THREE YEARS FROM SUCH EFFECTIVE 1 DATE, BUT ON OR AFTER JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN, SHALL 2 COMPLETE CONTINUING COMPETENCY HOURS ON A PRORATED BASIS AT THE RATE OF 3 4 ONE-HALF HOUR PER MONTH FOR THE PERIOD BEGINNING JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN UP TO THE FIRST REGISTRATION DATE. THEREAFTER, A LICEN-5 6 SEE WHO HAS NOT SATISFIED THE MANDATORY CONTINUING COMPETENCY REQUIRE-7 MENTS SHALL NOT BE ISSUED A TRIENNIAL REGISTRATION CERTIFICATE BY THE 8 DEPARTMENT AND SHALL NOT PRACTICE UNLESS AND UNTIL A CONDITIONAL REGIS-TRATION CERTIFICATE IS ISSUED AS PROVIDED FOR IN SUBPARAGRAPH (III) OF 9 10 THIS PARAGRAPH. CONTINUING COMPETENCY HOURS TAKEN DURING ONE TRIENNIUM MAY NOT BE TRANSFERRED TO A SUBSEQUENT TRIENNIUM. 11

(III) THE DEPARTMENT, IN ITS DISCRETION, MAY ISSUE A CONDITIONAL 12 REGISTRATION TO A LICENSEE WHO FAILS TO MEET THE CONTINUING COMPETENCY 13 14 REQUIREMENTS ESTABLISHED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, BUT WHO AGREES TO MAKE UP ANY DEFICIENCIES AND COMPLETE ANY ADDITIONAL LEARNING 15 ACTIVITIES WHICH THE DEPARTMENT MAY REQUIRE. THE FEE FOR SUCH A CONDI-16 TIONAL REGISTRATION SHALL BE THE SAME AS, AND IN ADDITION TO, THE FEE 17 FOR THE TRIENNIAL REGISTRATION. THE DURATION OF SUCH CONDITIONAL REGIS-18 19 TRATION SHALL BE DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT BUT SHALL NOT EXCEED ONE 20 YEAR. ANY LICENSEE WHO IS NOTIFIED OF THE DENIAL OF REGISTRATION FOR FAILURE TO SUBMIT EVIDENCE, SATISFACTORY TO THE DEPARTMENT, OF REQUIRED 21 CONTINUING COMPETENCY LEARNING ACTIVITIES AND WHO PRACTICES WITHOUT SUCH 22 REGISTRATION, MAY BE SUBJECT TO DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS PURSUANT TO 23 SECTION SIXTY-FIVE HUNDRED TEN OF THIS TITLE. 24

25 (IV) AS USED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, "ACCEPTABLE LEARNING ACTIVITIES "SHALL MEAN ACTIVITIES WHICH CONTRIBUTE TO THE 26 PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE OF AN ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY SPECIALIST AND 27 WHICH MEET THE STANDARDS PRESCRIBED IN THE REGULATIONS OF THE COMMIS-28 29 SIONER. (A) HOLDS A BACHELOR'S DEGREE OR HIGHER, OR EQUIVALENT AS DETER-30 MINED BY THE DEPARTMENT, WITH A SPECIALIZATION IN ORIENTATION AND MOBIL-ITY TRAINING; OR (B) HOLDS A BACHELOR'S DEGREE OR HIGHER, OR EQUIVALENT 31 32 AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT, WITH A SPECIALIZATION IN VISION REHA-33 BILITATION THERAPY; OR (C) HOLDS A BACHELOR'S DEGREE OR HIGHER, OR EQUIVALENT AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPARTMENT IN A REHABILITATION FIELD OR 34 35 SPECIAL EDUCATION AND (I) HAS COMPLETED ALL ADDITIONALLY REQUIRED IN ELEMENTS OF THE ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY TRAINING OR VISION REHABILI-36 37 TATION THERAPY CURRICULUM SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND IN ACCORDANCE 38 WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS; OR (II) HAS BEEN CERTIFIED IN 39 ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY TRAINING OR VISION REHABILITATION THERAPY BY A 40 NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED ACCREDITING BODY ACCEPTABLE TO THE DEPARTMENT; AND

SUBMITS EVIDENCE OF A MINIMUM OF THREE YEARS EXPERIENCE OR EMPLOY-42 MENT IN THE PRACTICE OF ORIENTATION AND MOBILITY TRAINING OR VISION 43 REHABILITATION THERAPY SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH 44 THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS, WHETHER SUCH EXPERIENCE OR EMPLOYMENT 45 OCCURS WITHIN OR WITHOUT THIS STATE.

50 S 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2015. The commissioner of 51 education and the board of regents are authorized to promulgate such 52 rules and regulations and take any other measures as may be necessary 53 for the timely implementation of this act on or before its effective 54 date, including but not limited to the appointment of the state board 55 for vision rehabilitation services, the acceptance and processing of 56 applications for licensure, and the issuance of licenses.
