AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to creating the "Foster  
care higher education scholarship program"

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-  
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as  
2     the "Foster care higher education scholarship program".

3     S 2. Section 604 of the education law is amended by adding a new  
4     subdivision 13 to read as follows:

5     13. FOSTER CARE HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM PURSUANT TO  
6     SECTION SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-EIGHT-H OF THIS TITLE.

7     S 3. The education law is amended by adding a new section 668-h to  
8     read as follows:

9     S 668-H. FOSTER CARE HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM. 1.  
10    PURPOSE. THE PRESIDENT SHALL GRANT SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF  
11    ENHANCING OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGHER EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN AND YOUNG  
12    ADULTS WHO ARE RECEIVING, OR WHO HAVE RECEIVED, FOSTER CARE SERVICES IN  
13    NEW YORK STATE. SUCH SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS SHALL BE AVAILABLE FOR THE  
14    TUITION AND NON-TUITION COSTS OF ELIGIBLE STUDENTS ENROLLED IN APPROVED  
15    UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS OR VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMS.

16    2. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE TERM:

17    (A) "TUITION" MEANS THE TOTAL SEMESTER, QUARTER, OR CREDIT HOUR COST  
18    OF INSTRUCTION TO THE STUDENT AS PERIODICALLY PUBLISHED IN THE CATALOGUE  
19    OF THE INSTITUTIONS, SPECIFICALLY EXCLUDING MANDATORY FEES, BOOK CHARG-  
20    ES, AND ROOM AND BOARD.

21    (B) "NON-TUITION COST OF ATTENDANCE" MEANS (I) THE ACTUAL AMOUNT  
22    CHARGED BY THE INSTITUTION FOR ROOM AND BOARD, AND (II) AN ALLOWANCE FOR  
23    TRANSPORTATION, BOOKS AND SUPPLIES AS DETERMINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND AS

EXPLANATION--Matter in *ITALICS* (underscored) is new; matter in brackets  
[ ] is old law to be omitted.

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APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUDGET, PROVIDED THAT SUCH DETERMINATION SHALL BE MADE NO LATER THAN DECEMBER FIRST OF EACH YEAR FOR USE IN THE SUCCEEDING ACADEMIC YEAR. IN THE EVENT A STUDENT DOES NOT INCUR ROOM OR BOARD CHARGES AT THE INSTITUTION, "NON-TUITION COST OF ATTENDANCE" SHALL MEAN AN ALLOWANCE FOR ROOM AND BOARD AS DETERMINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND APPROVED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUDGET. IN DETERMINING ALLOWANCES PURSUANT TO THIS PARAGRAPH, THE PRESIDENT MAY TAKE INTO CONSIDERATION THE ALLOWANCES PROVIDED FOR IN THE PELL GRANT PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SECTION 1070-A OF TITLE 20 OF THE UNITED STATES CODE.

(C) "PART-TIME STUDY" MEANS ENROLLMENT FOR AT LEAST THREE BUT LESS THAN TWELVE SEMESTER HOURS PER SEMESTER, OR THE EQUIVALENT, IN AN APPROVED UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM.

(D) "FULL-TIME STUDY" SHALL MEAN ENROLLMENT FOR AT LEAST TWELVE CREDIT HOURS PER SEMESTER, OR THE EQUIVALENT, IN AN APPROVED UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM.

(E) "APPROVED VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAMS" MEANS IN-STATE PROGRAMS OFFERED BY AGENCIES APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER FOR FUNDING PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL APPROVE ONLY SUCH NON-CREDIT PROGRAMS WHICH ARE AT LEAST THREE HUNDRED TWENTY CLOCK HOURS IN LENGTH, AND WHICH MEET STANDARDS OF INSTRUCTIONAL QUALITY ESTABLISHED IN REGULATIONS BY THE COMMISSIONER. THESE STANDARDS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, QUALIFICATIONS OF ADMINISTRATIVE AND INSTRUCTIONAL PERSONNEL, QUALITY OF FACILITIES AND EQUIPMENT, RECORDKEEPING, ADMISSION, GRADING, ATTENDANCE, AND RECORD OF PLACEMENT OF COMPLETERS WHICH MEETS STANDARDS OF ACCEPTABILITY AS ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSIONER.

3. ELIGIBILITY. (A) AN APPLICANT SHALL BE ELIGIBLE FOR A SCHOLARSHIP AWARD PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION IF, AT THE TIME OF THE INITIAL APPLICATION TO THE CORPORATION, THE APPLICANT:

(1) IS SIXTEEN TO TWENTY-THREE YEARS OF AGE;

(2) HAS RECEIVED FOSTER CARE SERVICES PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE HUNDRED FIFTY-EIGHT-A OF THE SOCIAL SERVICES LAW OR ARTICLE TEN OF THE FAMILY COURT ACT FOR A PERIOD OF NINE MONTHS OR MORE FOLLOWING THE CHILD'S SIXTEENTH BIRTHDAY OR HAS BEEN ADOPTED AFTER THE AGE OF SIXTEEN;

(3) HAS RECEIVED (I) A CERTIFICATE OF GRADUATION FROM A SCHOOL PROVIDING SECONDARY EDUCATION FROM A STATE WITHIN THE UNITED STATES; OR (II) THE RECOGNIZED EQUIVALENT OF SUCH CERTIFICATE; OR (III) RECEIVED A PASSING SCORE ON A FEDERALLY APPROVED ABILITY TO BENEFIT TEST THAT HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS AS SATISFYING THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION AND HAS BEEN INDEPENDENTLY ADMINISTERED AND EVALUATED AS DEFINED BY THE COMMISSIONER; AND

(4) IS MATRICULATED IN (I) AN APPROVED UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM OR (II) AN APPROVED VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM. PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH A OF SUBDIVISION FOUR OF SECTION SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE OF THIS PART, THE INSTITUTION OR VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM SHALL BE ONE THAT HAS BEEN APPROVED AND OPERATING IN THIS STATE FOR AT LEAST ONE YEAR, AND HAS BEEN APPROVED FOR PARTICIPATION IN FEDERAL STUDENT FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS AUTHORIZED BY TITLE IV OF THE HIGHER EDUCATION ACT OF 1965, AS AMENDED.

(B) APPLICATIONS FOR A SCHOLARSHIP AWARD SHALL BE MADE ON FORMS AND IN THE MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE CORPORATION.

4. AMOUNT. (A) THE PRESIDENT SHALL GRANT ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS IN THE FOLLOWING AMOUNTS:

(1) IF THE RECIPIENT ATTENDS AN UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM AT AN INSTITUTION OF THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK OR AN INSTITUTION OF THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK, THE ANNUAL AWARD SHALL BE AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO: THE TUITION CHARGED AT THE APPLICABLE INSTITUTION OF THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK OR THE CITY UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK PROVIDED THAT,

1 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, THE TUITION  
2 CHARGED TO AWARD RECIPIENTS SHALL NOT EXCEED THAT CHARGED TO STATE RESI-  
3 DENT STUDENTS ATTENDING SUCH INSTITUTION; THE MANDATORY FEES CHARGED AT  
4 SUCH INSTITUTION; AND THE NON-TUITION COSTS OF ATTENDANCE AT SUCH INSTI-  
5 TUTION OR COLLEGE, PROVIDED THAT THE SCHOLARSHIP SHALL NOT EXCEED AN  
6 AMOUNT THAT IS EQUAL TO THE TOTAL COSTS OF ATTENDANCE DETERMINED FOR  
7 FEDERAL TITLE IV STUDENT FINANCIAL AID PURPOSES, LESS ALL OTHER SCHOLAR-  
8 SHIPS AND GRANTS PROVIDED BY NEW YORK STATE, OTHER STATES, THE FEDERAL  
9 GOVERNMENT, OR OTHER GOVERNMENTS EXCLUDING LOANS, AND THE AMOUNT OF  
10 EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS PAID UNDER ANY PROGRAM THAT WOULD DUPLICATE THE  
11 PURPOSES OF THIS PROGRAM, PROVIDED THAT ANY SCHOLARSHIPS OR GRANTS  
12 PROVIDED TO A RECIPIENT BY THE INSTITUTION WHICH ARE INTENDED TO FUND  
13 ANY PORTION OF THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE ANNUAL AWARD AMOUNT AND THE  
14 ACTUAL COSTS OF ATTENDANCE AT ANY SUCH INSTITUTION SHALL NOT BE CONSID-  
15 ERED TO DUPLICATE THE PURPOSES OF THIS PROGRAM.

16 (2) IF THE RECIPIENT ATTENDS ANY OTHER APPROVED UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM  
17 OR VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM WITHIN NEW YORK STATE, THE ANNUAL AWARD  
18 SHALL BE BASED UPON AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO: THE TUITION CHARGED TO STATE  
19 RESIDENT STUDENTS ATTENDING A FOUR-YEAR COLLEGE OF THE STATE UNIVERSITY  
20 OF NEW YORK; THE AVERAGE MANDATORY FEES CHARGED AT FOUR-YEAR COLLEGES OF  
21 THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK, OR THE ACTUAL TUITION AND FEES CHARGED  
22 TO THE RECIPIENT, WHICHEVER IS LESS; AND THE AVERAGE NON-TUITION COST OF  
23 ATTENDANCE, AS DETERMINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND AS APPROVED BY THE DIREC-  
24 TOR OF THE BUDGET, FOR A STUDENT AT THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK OR  
25 ACTUAL NON-TUITION COST OF ATTENDANCE AT SUCH INSTITUTION, WHICHEVER IS  
26 LESS, PROVIDED THAT THE SCHOLARSHIP SHALL NOT EXCEED AN AMOUNT THAT IS  
27 EQUAL TO THE TOTAL COST OF ATTENDANCE DETERMINED FOR FEDERAL TITLE IV  
28 STUDENT FINANCIAL AID PURPOSES, LESS ALL OTHER SCHOLARSHIPS AND GRANTS  
29 PROVIDED BY NEW YORK STATE, OTHER STATES, THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, OR  
30 OTHER GOVERNMENTS EXCLUDING LOANS, AND THE AMOUNT OF EDUCATIONAL BENE-  
31 FITS PAID UNDER ANY PROGRAM THAT WOULD DUPLICATE THE PURPOSES OF THIS  
32 PROGRAM, PROVIDED THAT ANY SCHOLARSHIPS OR GRANTS PROVIDED TO A RECIPI-  
33 ENT BY THE INSTITUTION WHICH ARE INTENDED TO FUND ANY PORTION OF THE  
34 DIFFERENCE BETWEEN THE ANNUAL AWARD AMOUNT AND THE ACTUAL COSTS OF  
35 ATTENDANCE AT ANY SUCH INSTITUTION SHALL NOT BE CONSIDERED TO DUPLICATE  
36 THE PURPOSES OF THIS PROGRAM.

37 (B) NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS SECTION SHALL MODIFY OR ELIMINATE THE  
38 OBLIGATIONS OF A SOCIAL SERVICES OFFICIAL PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION TEN OF  
39 SECTION THREE HUNDRED NINETY-EIGHT OF THE SOCIAL SERVICES LAW WHO, FOR A  
40 FOSTER CHILD IN ATTENDANCE AT A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY AWAY FROM HIS OR  
41 HER FOSTER FAMILY BOARDING HOME, GROUP HOME, AGENCY BOARDING HOME OR  
42 INSTITUTION, MAKES FOSTER PAYMENTS TO SUCH COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY IN LIEU  
43 OF PAYMENT TO THE FOSTER PARENTS OR AUTHORIZED AGENCY, FOR THE PURPOSE  
44 OF ROOM AND BOARD.

45 (C) IN NO EVENT SHALL THE COMBINATION OF ALL STUDENT FINANCIAL AID  
46 RECEIVED BY A STUDENT EXCEED A RECIPIENT'S TOTAL COST OF ATTENDANCE AT  
47 THE INSTITUTION BEING ATTENDED.

48 5. ADDITIONAL SERVICES. IF A STUDENT QUALIFYING FOR THE FOSTER CARE  
49 HIGHER EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM HAS MATRICULATED IN AN UNDERGRADU-  
50 ATE INSTITUTION OF THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK, THE CITY UNIVERSITY  
51 OF NEW YORK, OR A NON-PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION WHICH OPER-  
52 ATES AN EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM PURSUANT TO SECTIONS SIXTY-FOUR  
53 HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE OR SIXTY-FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY-TWO OF THIS CHAPTER, THE  
54 STUDENT SHOULD BE PROVIDED ACCESS TO THE SUPPORT SERVICES PROVIDED UNDER  
55 THIS EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM, INCLUDING REMEDIAL COURSES, DEVELOP-

1 MENTAL AND COMPENSATORY COURSES AND SUMMER CLASSES, SPECIAL TUTORING,  
2 COUNSELING, AND GUIDANCE SERVICES.

3 6. DURATION. (A) NO RECIPIENT SHALL RECEIVE AWARDS FOR MORE THAN EIGHT  
4 SEMESTERS OF FULL TIME UNDERGRADUATE STUDY, OR THE EQUIVALENT OF FOUR  
5 ACADEMIC YEARS, OR, IF AN UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM NORMALLY REQUIRES FIVE  
6 ACADEMIC YEARS OF FULL-TIME STUDY, FOR MORE THAN TEN SEMESTERS OF FULL-  
7 TIME STUDY, OR THE EQUIVALENT OF FIVE ACADEMIC YEARS. RECIPIENTS  
8 ENROLLED IN A PROGRAM OF REMEDIAL STUDY CONFORMING TO THE PROVISIONS OF  
9 THIS ARTICLE, APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER IN A DEGREE GRANTING INSTITU-  
10 TION, AND INTENDED TO CULMINATE IN AN UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE SHALL BE  
11 CONSIDERED AS ENROLLED IN A PROGRAM NORMALLY REQUIRING FIVE YEARS. NO  
12 RECIPIENT ENROLLED IN AN APPROVED VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM SHALL  
13 RECEIVE AWARDS FOR MORE THAN FOUR SEMESTERS OF FULL-TIME STUDY OR THE  
14 EQUIVALENT OF TWO ACADEMIC YEARS OF FULL-TIME STUDY.

15 (B) NO RECIPIENT SHALL RECEIVE AWARDS FOR MORE THAN SIXTEEN SEMESTERS  
16 OF PART-TIME UNDERGRADUATE STUDY AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS  
17 SECTION, OR THE EQUIVALENT OF EIGHT ACADEMIC YEARS OF PART-TIME STUDY,  
18 OR, IF AN UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM NORMALLY REQUIRES FIVE ACADEMIC YEARS OF  
19 FULL-TIME STUDY, FOR MORE THAN TWENTY SEMESTERS OF PART-TIME STUDY, OR  
20 THE EQUIVALENT OF TEN ACADEMIC YEARS. RECIPIENTS ENROLLED IN A PROGRAM  
21 OF REMEDIAL STUDY CONFORMING TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER, APPROVED  
22 BY THE COMMISSIONER IN A DEGREE GRANTING INSTITUTION, AND INTENDED TO  
23 CULMINATE IN AN UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE SHALL BE CONSIDERED AS ENROLLED IN  
24 A PROGRAM NORMALLY REQUIRING FIVE YEARS. NO RECIPIENT ENROLLED IN AN  
25 APPROVED VOCATIONAL TRAINING PROGRAM SHALL RECEIVE AWARDS FOR MORE THAN  
26 EIGHT SEMESTERS OF PART-TIME STUDY OR THE EQUIVALENT OF FOUR ACADEMIC  
27 YEARS OF PART-TIME STUDY.

28 7. REQUIREMENTS. (A) EACH RECIPIENT OF AN AWARD PURSUANT TO THIS  
29 SECTION SHALL ENROLL IN AN APPROVED FULL-TIME OR PART-TIME DEGREE,  
30 DIPLOMA OR CERTIFICATE PROGRAM OR COURSE OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDY AND  
31 RETAIN SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC STANDING.

32 (B) EACH APPLICANT SHALL HAVE COMPLETED THE FOLLOWING AT THE TIME OF  
33 APPLICATION: (1) APPLIED FOR A TUITION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AWARD PURSUANT  
34 TO SECTION SIX HUNDRED SIXTY-SEVEN OF THIS SUBPART, (2) COMPLETED AND  
35 SUBMITTED A FEDERAL STUDENT AID APPLICATION PURSUANT TO SECTION 1090 OF  
36 THE UNITED STATES CODE, AND (3) IF ELIGIBLE, APPLIED FOR AN EDUCATIONAL  
37 AND TRAINING VOUCHER PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH I OF SECTION 677 OF THE  
38 UNITED STATES CODE. PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH (A) OF SUBDIVISION FOUR OF  
39 THIS SECTION, WHEN DETERMINING THE ANNUAL AWARD AMOUNT, ANY GRANT AID OR  
40 FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE RECEIVED, EXCLUDING LOANS, SHALL BE UTILIZED TO  
41 OFFSET THE TOTAL COST OF ATTENDANCE DETERMINED FOR FEDERAL TITLE IV  
42 STUDENT FINANCIAL AID PURPOSES TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT POSSIBLE, EXCEPT  
43 THAT NOTHING SHALL REQUIRE THAT AID RECEIVED WHICH MAY BE USED TOWARDS  
44 COSTS OTHER THAN TUITION SHALL BE APPLIED TOWARD THE COST OF TUITION.

45 8. RULES AND REGULATIONS. THE CORPORATION IN CONSULTATION WITH THE  
46 COMMISSIONER OF THE OFFICE OF CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES, SHALL  
47 PROMULGATE ANY RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF  
48 THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

49 S 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
