- AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to the composition of the interagency task force on human trafficking and their meetings; and to amend chapter 74 of the laws of 2007 amending the penal law, the criminal procedure law, the correction law, the social services law, and the executive law relating to human trafficking, in relation to extending the interagency task force on human trafficking

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 483-ee of the social services law, as added by 2 chapter 74 of the laws of 2007, subdivision (a) as amended by section 5 3 of part A-1 of chapter 56 of the laws of 2010, is amended to read as 4 follows:

5 S 483-ee. Establishment of interagency task force on human traffickб ing. (a) There is established an interagency task force on trafficking 7 in persons, which shall consist of the following members or their desig-8 nees: (1) the commissioner of the division of criminal justice services; (2) the commissioner of the office of temporary and disability assist-9 10 ance; (3) the commissioner of health; (4) the commissioner of the office of mental health; (5) the commissioner of labor; (6) the commissioner of 11 12 the office of children and family services; (7) the commissioner of the 13 office of alcoholism and substance abuse services; (8) the director of the office of victim services; (9) the executive director of the office 14 for the prevention of domestic violence; [and] (10) the superintendent 15 of the division of state police; AND THE FOLLOWING ADDITIONAL MEMBERS, 16 SHALL BE PROMPTLY APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, EACH FOR A TERM OF TWO 17 WHO 18 YEARS, PROVIDED THAT SUCH PERSON'S MEMBERSHIP SHALL CONTINUE AFTER SUCH 19 TWO YEAR TERM UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND PROVIDED, FURTHER, THAT

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A MEMBER MAY BE REAPPOINTED IF AGAIN RECOMMENDED IN THE MANNER SPECIFIED 1 2 TWO MEMBERS, WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED ON THE THIS SUBDIVISION: (11) IN 3 PRESIDENT OF RECOMMENDATION OF THE TEMPORARY THESENATE; (12)TWO 4 MEMBERS, WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE SPEAKER OF 5 THE ASSEMBLY; (13) TWO MEMBERS, WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED ON THE RECOMMEN-6 THE NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION IN NEW YORK DATION OF STATE THAT 7 RECEIVES THE LARGEST SHARE OF FUNDS, APPROPRIATED BY AND THROUGH THE 8 STATE BUDGET, FOR PROVIDING SERVICES TO VICTIMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING, AS SHALL BE IDENTIFIED ANNUALLY IN WRITING BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUDGET; 9 10 AND (14) ONE MEMBER, WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE NEW YORK STATE BAR ASSOCIATION; and others as 11 may be 12 necessary to carry out the duties and responsibilities under this 13 section. The task force will be co-chaired by the commissioners of the 14 division of criminal justice services and the office of temporary and 15 disability assistance, or their designees. It shall meet as often as is necessary, BUT NO LESS THAN THREE TIMES PER YEAR, and under 16 circum-17 stances as are appropriate to fulfilling its duties under this section. 18 ALL MEMBERS SHALL BE PROVIDED WITH WRITTEN NOTICE REASONABLY IN ADVANCE 19 OF EACH MEETING WITH DATE, TIME AND LOCATION OF SUCH MEETING.

20 (b) The task force shall: (1) collect and organize data on the nature 21 and extent of trafficking in persons in the state; (2) identify avail-22 able federal, state and local programs that provide services to victims 23 of trafficking, including but not limited to case management, housing, health care, mental health counseling, drug addiction screening and 24 25 treatment, language interpretation and translation services, English 26 language instruction, job training and placement assistance, post-employment services for job retention, and services to assist the individ-ual and any of his or her family members to establish a permanent resi-27 28 29 dence in New York state or the United States; (3) consult with governmental and non-governmental organizations in developing recommen-30 dations to strengthen state and local efforts to prevent trafficking, 31 32 protect and assist victims of trafficking and prosecute traffickers; (4) 33 establish interagency protocols and collaboration between federal, state, and local law enforcement, state and governmental agencies, child 34 35 welfare agencies, and non-governmental organizations; (5) evaluate approaches to increase public awareness about trafficking and make 36 37 recommendations on such approaches; (6) evaluate the effectiveness of training programs on human trafficking that have been designed for law 38 39 enforcement personnel, criminal defense attorneys, social service 40 providers and non-governmental organizations, and make recommendations improving the quality and effectiveness of such programs; [and] (7) 41 for measure and evaluate the progress of the state in preventing traffick-42 43 ing, protecting and providing assistance to victims of trafficking, and prosecuting persons engaged in trafficking; AND (8) CONVENE ANY 44 SUBCOM-45 MITTEE NECESSARY, PROVIDED SUCH SUBCOMMITTEE HAS AT LEAST ONE OF THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF 46 47 THE SENATE OR GOVERNOR, TO CONSIDER SPECIFIC ISSUES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT 48 LIMITED TO: FEDERAL, STATE AND/OR LOCAL COOPERATION; JUVENILES AND HUMAN 49 TRAFFICKING; THE IMPORTANCE OF TRAINING AND WHO SHOULD RECEIVE SUCH 50 TRAINING; HOW DATA IS COMPILED AND SHARED; SERVICES FOR AND TREATMENT OF 51 DOMESTIC VERSUS FOREIGN BORN VICTIMS.

52 (c) [One year from the effective date of this section, or earlier if 53 deemed appropriate, the task force shall report to the governor and the 54 legislature on these issues,] THE TASK FORCE SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVER-55 NOR, THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY, 56 THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE AND THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE 1 SENATE NO LESS THAN ANNUALLY, and it shall [thereafter] ADDITIONALLY 2 issue such reports and recommendations as it deems necessary to carry 3 out its duties and responsibilities.

4 S 2. Section 14 of chapter 74 of the laws of 2007, amending the penal 5 law, the criminal procedure law, the correction law, the social services 6 law, and the executive law relating to human trafficking, as amended by 7 chapter 24 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows:

8 This act shall take effect on the first of November next S 14. succeeding the date on which it shall have become a law; provided that 9 10 section 483-ee of the social services law, as added by section eleven of this act, shall take effect immediately and shall remain in full force 11 and effect until September 1, [2013] 2017 when upon such date the 12 provisions of such section shall expire and be deemed 13 repealed. 14 Provided, effective immediately, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary for the timely implementation of the 15 provisions of article 10-D of the social services law, as added by 16 section eleven of this act, on its effective date are authorized to be 17 18 made on or before such effective date.

19 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately; provided that the amend-20 ments to section 483-ee of the social services law made by section one 21 of this act shall not affect the repeal of such section and shall be 22 deemed repealed therewith.
