AN ACT to amend the military law, in relation to providing for the "Campaign Medal for Service" to be granted to those who provided military service in Iraq

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 247 of the military law is amended by adding a new 2 subdivision 1-b to read as follows:

3 GOVERNOR IS HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO PRESENT IN THE NAME OF THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, A MILITARY DECORATION, TO BE KNOWN 5 AS THE "CAMPAIGN MEDAL FOR SERVICE", BEARING A SUITABLE INSCRIPTION, AND RIBBON, ALL OF WHICH SHALL BE OF SUITABLE DESIGN, TO ANY 6 7 PERSON (I) WHO IS A CITIZEN OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK OR (II) WHO WAS A 8 CITIZEN OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK WHILE SERVING IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES, AND WHO, WHILE SERVING IN THE UNITED STATES 9 10 FORCES, DEFINED AS ARMY, AIR FORCE, NAVY, MARINE CORPS, OR COAST GUARD, SERVED IN ACTIVE DUTY IN IRAQ. NOT MORE THAN ONE CAMPAIGN MEDAL 11 ISSUED TO ANY ONE PERSON; NOR SHALL ANY CITATION BE 12 SERVICE SHALL BE AWARDED OR PRESENTED, UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBDIVISION, 13 PERSON WHOSE ENTIRE SERVICE SUBSEQUENT TO THE TIME OF THE RECEIPT OF 14 15 SUCH MEDAL SHALL NOT HAVE BEEN HONORABLE. FOR EACH SUCCEEDING MEDAL AS IN THIS SECTION, SUCH PERSON SHALL BE ENTITLED TO WEAR, AS THE 16 PROVIDED CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE STATE MAY DIRECT, A RIBBON WHOSE COLOR AND DESIGN 17 SHALL BE SELECTED BY THE DIVISION OF MILITARY AFFAIRS. 18 IN THE EVENT OF THE DEATH OF ANY PERSON DURING OR SUBSEQUENT TO 19 THERECEIPT OF SUCH 20 THE CAMPAIGN MEDAL FOR SERVICE SHALL BE PRESENTED TO SUCH CITATION 21 REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DECEASED AS MAY BE DESIGNATED. S 2. Subdivision 1-a of section 247 of the military law, as added by chapter 184 of the laws of 1998, is amended to read as follows:

The governor is hereby authorized to present in the name of the legislature of the state of New York, a military decoration, to be known as the "conspicuous service star", bearing a suitable inscription, device, and ribbon, all of which shall be of suitable design, to any person (i) who is a citizen of the state of New York or (ii) who was a citizen of the state of New York while serving in the armed forces of the United States, and who, while serving in the United States Armed Forces, defined as army, air force, navy, marine corps, or coast guard, has, or shall have received a United States unit level decoration denoting combat participation and foreign unit awards, issued from a company, regimental, brigade, or division commander, or equivalent naval unit, or issued by the President of the United States, the Congress of the United 15 States, the United States Defense Department or the joint chiefs of staff, such as, but not limited to, a presidential unit citation or a joint meritorious unit award. Not more than one conspicuous service star shall be issued to any one person; nor shall any citation be awarded or presented, under the provisions of this subdivision, to any person whose 19 entire service subsequent to the time of the receipt of such star shall not have been honorable. For each succeeding star as provided [herein] IN THIS SUBDIVISION, such person shall be entitled to wear, as the chief staff of the state may direct, a ribbon whose color and design shall be selected by the division of [miliary] MILITARY affairs. In the event of the death of any person during or subsequent to the receipt citation the conspicuous service star shall be presented to such representative of the deceased as may be designated. The chief of staff shall 27 28 make such rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary for the prop-29 er presentation and distribution of such decorations. 30

S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
