AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to creating a small business and household pollution prevention program

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

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ARE GENERATED THROUGH VOLUNTARY POLLUTION PREVENTION MEASURES, RECOGNIZ-1 2 ING THIS GOAL MAY NOT BE COMPLETELY ACHIEVABLE BY SOME. 3 2. EDUCATION, DEMONSTRATION PROJECT, AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS 4 ON POLLUTION PREVENTION ARE ESSENTIAL TO HELP SMALL AND MEDIUM SIZED 5 BUSINESSES ACHIEVE THE ZERO DISCHARGE GOAL AND HELP THE PUBLIC CONSERVE 6 RESOURCES, REDUCE THE VOLUME AND TOXICITY OF WASTES, AND RECYCLE OR 7 RECLAIM WASTES. 8 3. AN EVENT OR PROGRAM THAT INCLUDES COLLECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF SOLID WASTES FROM ELIGIBLE ENTITIES UNDER THIS TITLE. 27 28 THE TERM INCLUDES ONE-DAY WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAMS AND WASTE COLLECTION 29 PROGRAMS THAT ARE DESIGNED FOR CONTINUOUS OR ONGOING OPERATION THROUGH-OUT A DESIGNATED PERIOD OF TIME. 30 3. "ELIGIBLE ENTITY." A HOUSEHOLD, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE 31 32 STATE, OR A SMALL BUSINESS. 33 4. "HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE." HAZARDOUS WASTE AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION 34 ONE OF SECTION 27-1301 OF THIS ARTICLE. 5. "MUNICIPALITY." A COUNTY, CITY, TOWN, OR VILLAGE. 35 "POLLUTION PREVENTION ASSESSMENT." AN EVALUATION DESIGNED TO IDEN-36 6. 37 TIFY OPPORTUNITIES TO ELIMINATE AND REDUCE POLLUTION OR REUSE WASTE 38 MATERIALS. 39 7. "PROGRAM." SOURCE REDUCTION AND METHODS FOR CONDUCTING POLLUTION PREVENTION 8 ASSESSMENTS TO ELIMINATE OR REDUCE THE VOLUME OR TOXICITY OF SOLID 9 WASTES GENERATED. 10 B. NATURAL RESOURCE AND ENERGY CONSERVATION. 11 C. OPPORTUNITIES TO REDUCE ENVIRONMENTAL CONTAMINATION FROM AIR EMIS-12 SIONS AND WATER EFFLUENTS. 13 D. OPPORTUNITIES TO BENEFICIALLY USE, REUSE, RECYCLE, OR RECLAIM SOLID 14 WASTE MATERIALS. 15 E. OPPORTUNITIES TO COLLECT AND MANAGE UNIVERSAL WASTES RECEIVED FROM 16 SMALL BUSINESS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC. 17 F. INFORMATION ON COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION 19 20 LAWS, INCLUDING COMPLIANCE WITH SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT REQUIREMENTS. 21 4. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO SPONSORS AND COLLECTION CONTRAC-22 TORS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE PROGRAMS AND COLLECTION EVENTS TO ENCOUR-23 24 AGE AND PROMOTE ALL ASPECTS OF POLLUTION PREVENTION. 25 5. TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR IMPLEMENTATION. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO SPONSORS AND COLLECTION CONTRACTORS TO 26 PROVIDE 27 IMPLEMENT THE PURPOSES OF THIS TITLE AND TO FACILITATE THE PROGRAM AND PROPER COLLECTION, TREATMENT, RECYCLING, OR DISPOSAL OF HAZARDOUS 28 THE 29 SUBSTANCES GENERATED BY ELIGIBLE ENTITIES. 6. SITE VISIT. AT THE REQUEST OF A SMALL BUSINESS, THE DEPARTMENT MAY 30 OFFER A POLLUTION PREVENTION ASSESSMENT SITE VISIT AT THE PLACE OF BUSI-31 32 NESS AND MAY PROVIDE ASSISTANCE ON COMPLIANCE WITH THE ENVIRONMENTAL 33 PROTECTION LAWS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND GUIDANCE ISSUED BY 34 THE DEPARTMENT ON POLLUTION PREVENTION. 35 PRIVATE CONTRACT AUTHORIZATION. THE DEPARTMENT MAY COOPERATE WITH 7. AND MAY CONTRACT FOR SERVICES FROM PRIVATE AND OTHER ENTITIES AND IS 36 37 AUTHORIZED TO MAKE GRANTS TO PRIVATE, GOVERNMENTAL, AND OTHER ENTITIES 38 TO IMPLEMENT THIS TITLE. 39 S 27-3007. SMALL BUSINESS HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE COLLECTION PROGRAM. 40 1. GENERAL RULE. A SPONSOR MAY ESTABLISH A COLLECTION PROGRAM FOR THE COLLECTION AND MANAGEMENT OF SOLID WASTES GENERATED BY ELIGIBLE ENTITIES 41 THROUGH COLLECTION EVENTS. EACH SPONSOR MUST REGISTER THE PROGRAM WITH 42 43 THE DEPARTMENT AND RECEIVE APPROVAL OF THE DEPARTMENT PRIOR TO COMMENC-44 ING OPERATION. 45 SITES. COLLECTION EVENTS MAY BE CONDUCTED ON SITES SELECTED BY THE 2. SPONSOR. SUCH SITES MAY BE ON PUBLIC OR PRIVATE PROPERTY, INCLUDING, BUT 46 47 NOT LIMITED TO, PROPERTY OWNED, LEASED OR CONTROLLED BY THE STATE, ITS AGENCIES, OR ITS POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS. WRITTEN PERMISSION TO USE THE 48 49 SITE FOR THE CONDUCT OF THE EVENT SHALL BE OBTAINED FROM THE OWNER PRIOR 50 TO THE EVENT. 3. LIABILITY. AN OWNER WHO, WITHOUT CHARGE, PERMITS ANY PROPERTY TO BE 51 USED AS A SITE FOR A COLLECTION EVENT SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY 52 DAMAGE, HARM, OR INJURY TO ANY PERSON OR PROPERTY WHICH RESULTS FROM THE 53 54 USE OF THE PROPERTY AS A SITE FOR A COLLECTION EVENT. A SPONSOR OF A 55 COLLECTION EVENT SHALL NOT BE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGE, HARM, OR INJURY TO

ANY PERSON OR PROPERTY WHICH RESULTS FROM THE OPERATION OF A COLLECTION 1 2 EVENT. 3 4. LIMITATION OF TYPE. THE SPONSOR MAY LIMIT THE TYPES OF SOLID WASTES 4 OR MATERIALS TO BE COLLECTED AT A COLLECTION EVENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH 5 GUIDANCE ISSUED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND FURTHER LIMITATIONS DETERMINED AΤ 6 DISCRETION OF THE SPONSOR. A SMALL BUSINESS ENTITY MAY BRING UP TO THE 7 BUT NOT MORE THAN ONE THOUSAND KILOGRAMS OF HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE TO A 8 COLLECTION EVENT OR COLLECTION EVENTS IN ANY CALENDAR MONTH FOR WASTE RECYCLING, TREATMENT, OR DISPOSAL ARRANGED BY THE COLLECTION CONTRACTOR. 9 10 5. FEES. THE SPONSOR MAY ESTABLISH AND ASSESS REASONABLE FEES FROM 11 ENTITIES FOR SERVICES PROVIDED IN CONNECTION ELIGIBLE WITH THE 12 COLLECTION EVENT. 6. REGISTRATION AND APPROVAL. THE SPONSOR MAY 13 SELECT A COLLECTION 14 CONTRACTOR TO OPERATE THE COLLECTION EVENT OR MAY OPERATE THE COLLECTION 15 EVENT AS THE COLLECTION CONTRACTOR. EACH SPONSOR OR COLLECTION CONTRAC-16 TOR WHICH OPERATES A COLLECTION EVENT MUST FIRST BE REGISTERED AND 17 APPROVED BY THE DEPARTMENT TO OPERATE COLLECTION EVENTS. THE DEPARTMENT 18 SHALL ISSUE GUIDANCE FOR REGISTRATION REOUIREMENTS FOR THE OPERATION OF 19 COLLECTION EVENTS. 20 7. QUALIFICATIONS. NO COLLECTION CONTRACTOR MAY BE SELECTED TO OPERATE 21 COLLECTION EVENT UNLESS THE CONTRACTOR CAN DEMONSTRATE TO THE SATIS-Α FACTION OF THE DEPARTMENT ITS ABILITY TO COLLECT, PACKAGE, TRANSPORT, 22 AND DISPOSE OF SOLID WASTE COLLECTED UNDER THIS PROGRAM CONSISTENT WITH 23 THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS CHAPTER AND THE REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT. 24 25 8. INELIGIBILITY. A COLLECTION CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO OPERATE A COLLECTION EVENT IF THE DEPARTMENT FINDS THAT SUCH PERSON HAS 26 27 SHOWN A LACK OF ABILITY OR A LACK OF INTENT TO COMPLY WITH APPLICABLE 28 LAWS AND REGULATIONS OF THIS STATE, OTHER STATES, OR THE UNITED STATES. 29 9. GENERATOR. A COLLECTION CONTRACTOR SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE THE GENER-30 ATOR OF HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES COLLECTED AT THE EVENT WHICH IS SENT FOR TREATMENT, STORAGE, OR DISPOSAL AT A PERMITTED HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY. 31 32 10. POLLUTION PREVENTION. THE COLLECTION CONTRACTOR SHALL PRACTICE AND 33 ENCOURAGE POLLUTION PREVENTION AND SHALL RECYCLE OR RECLAIM COLLECTED 34 SOLID WASTES TO THE GREATEST EXTENT PRACTICABLE. 35 DOCUMENTATION. IN CONDUCTING A COLLECTION EVENT UNDER THIS TITLE, 11. THE COLLECTION CONTRACTOR SHALL MANAGE WASTES AND OTHER MATERIALS 36 37 RECEIVED AT A COLLECTION EVENT IN COMPLIANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAWS AND 38 REGULATIONS OF THIS STATE. THE SPONSOR AND THE COLLECTION CONTRACTOR 39 SHALL PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION AND RECORDS OF AN EVENT AS REQUESTED BY THE 40 DEPARTMENT. 12. OPTIONAL PARTICIPATION. THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE INTERPRETED 41 AS REOUIRING A SMALL BUSINESS TO PARTICIPATE IN A SMALL BUSINESS HAZARDOUS 42 SUBSTANCE COLLECTION PROGRAM, OR AS PROHIBITING A SMALL BUSINESS 43 FROM DISPOSING OF ITS HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES UNDER OTHER APPLICABLE LAWS. 44 45 S 27-3009. HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCE COLLECTION PROGRAM. 1. COLLECTION EVENTS. A SPONSOR MAY ESTABLISH A COLLECTION EVENT FOR 46 47 THE PURPOSE OF COLLECTING AND MANAGING HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES. 48 Α COLLECTION EVENT DESIGNED FOR HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES SHALL 49 MEET THE STANDARDS AND REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 27-3007 OF THIS TITLE. A 50 SPONSOR MAY OPERATE A COLLECTION EVENT EXCLUSIVELY FOR HOUSEHOLD HAZARD-51 OUS SUBSTANCES, EXCLUSIVELY FOR SMALL BUSINESS WASTE, OR FOR SPECIFIED WASTES FROM ELIGIBLE ENTITIES. 52 2. HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES. A COLLECTION EVENT THAT INCLUDES COLLECTION 53 54 OF HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES SHALL PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL MATERIALS 55 THAT EMPHASIZE HOME SAFETY, FIRE PREVENTION, AND POLLUTION PREVENTION IN THE HOME, INCLUDING SOURCE REDUCTION THROUGH THE USE OF ALTERNATIVE LESS 56

1 TOXIC PRODUCTS, RECYCLING, AND PROPER DISPOSAL METHODS FOR WASTE MATERI-2 ALS THAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED. WASTE MATERIALS COLLECTED FROM HOUSEHOLDS 3 SHALL BE APPROPRIATELY REUSED OR RECYCLED TO THE GREATEST EXTENT PRACTI-4 CABLE. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE GUIDANCE ON PROPER MANAGEMENT OF 5 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES.

6 S 27-3011. REGULATIONS.

7 THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PROMULGATE REGULATIONS AS NEEDED TO IMPLEMENT 8 THIS TITLE.

9 10 S 27-3013. GRANTS FOR SMALL BUSINESS AND HOUSEHOLD POLLUTION PREVENTION PROGRAMS.

11 1. GENERAL RULE. THE DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO PROVIDE GRANTS TO 12 COUNTIES NOT WHOLLY CONTAINED WITHIN A CITY AND CITIES CONTAINING MORE 13 THAN ONE COUNTY, TO REIMBURSE A COUNTY FOR ELIGIBLE COSTS FOR EDUCATION 14 PROGRAMS ON POLLUTION PREVENTION OR FOR PROVIDING OTHER TECHNICAL 15 ASSISTANCE TO SMALL BUSINESS FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS TITLE.

16 2. EDUCATION PROGRAMS. THE GRANTS TO COUNTIES NOT WHOLLY CONTAINED 17 WITHIN A CITY AND CITIES CONTAINING MORE THAN ONE COUNTY UNDER THIS 18 SECTION MAY REIMBURSE THE COUNTY OR CITY FOR UP TO EIGHTY PERCENT OF THE 19 APPROVED COST OF EDUCATION PROGRAMS ON POLLUTION PREVENTION OR FOR 20 PROVIDING TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO SMALL BUSINESS FOR THE PURPOSES OF 21 THIS TITLE.

3. ELIGIBLE COSTS. ELIGIBLE COSTS UNDER THIS SECTION MAY INCLUDE COSTS 22 23 INCURRED BY COUNTIES NOT WHOLLY CONTAINED WITHIN A CITY AND CITIES 24 CONTAINING MORE THAN ONE COUNTY BY CONTRACT WITH ANOTHER SPONSOR OR 25 OTHER PERSON SELECTED BY THE COUNTY OR CITY TO OPERATE THE PROGRAM UNDER THIS TITLE. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ISSUE GUIDANCE FOR COUNTIES NOT 26 WHOLLY CONTAINED WITHIN A CITY AND CITIES CONTAINING MORE THAN ONE COUNTY IN 27 28 THE OPERATION OF THE PROGRAM AND FOR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR GRANTS 29 ADMINISTERED UNDER THIS SECTION.

30 S 27-3015. GRANTS FOR COLLECTION EVENTS.

31 1. FUNDS. THE DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO ADMINISTER APPROPRIATED 32 FUNDS FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF THESE PROGRAMS.

2. GRANT ELIGIBILITY. GRANTS APPROVED UNDER THIS TITLE MAY BE PAID TO
A REGISTERED SPONSOR OF A COLLECTION EVENT, INCLUDING SPONSORS OTHER
THAN MUNICIPALITIES. THE DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO REIMBURSE SPONSORS
FOR ELIGIBLE COSTS INCURRED AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS TITLE FOR
THE OPERATION OF COLLECTION EVENTS FOR ELIGIBLE ENTITIES UNDER THIS
TITLE.

39 3. MATCHING REQUIREMENT. THE FUNDS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT 40 UNDER THIS TITLE MAY BE EXPENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT ONLY TO THE EXTENT 41 THAT THE GRANT AMOUNT HAS BEEN MATCHED, AT LEAST DOLLAR FOR DOLLAR IN 42 VALUE, BY THE GRANT APPLICANT. SPONSORS OF A COLLECTION EVENT ARE HEREBY 43 AUTHORIZED TO RECEIVE ALL OR PART OF THE REQUIRED MATCHING FUNDS FROM 44 MANUFACTURERS OR OTHER PERSONS.

4. OTHER LIMITATIONS. NO MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS PER
46 FISCAL YEAR MAY BE EXPENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR COLLECTION EVENTS IN
47 ANY ONE COUNTY NOT WHOLLY CONTAINED WITHIN A CITY, AND NO MORE THAN FIVE
48 HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS MAY BE EXPENDED BY THE DEPARTMENT FOR
49 COLLECTION EVENTS IN ANY CITY CONTAINING MORE THAN ONE COUNTY.

This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 51 it shall have become a law; provided that the commissioner of environ-52 mental conservation is authorized to promulgate any and all rules and 53 regulations and take any other measures necessary to implement this act 54 on its effective date on or before such date.
