AN ACT to amend the legislative law, in relation to reducing travel expenses and per diems for members of the legislature and eliminating per diems for members living less than one hundred twenty-five miles from the capitol

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. Subdivision 2 of section 5 of the legislative law, as amended by section 1 of part M-1 of chapter 407 of the laws of 1999, is amended to read as follows:
- 4 member of the legislature LIVING MORE THAN ONE HUNDRED TWEN-5 TY-FIVE MILES FROM THE STATE CAPITOL shall receive payment of actual and 6 necessary transportation expenses and a per diem equivalent to the most 7 recent federal per diem rates published by the General Services Adminis-8 tration and set forth in 41 CFR (Code of Federal Regulations) Part 301, 9 App. A, while in travel status in the performance of his or her duties; 10 and such other reasonable expenses as may be necessary for the performance of the member's responsibilities as determined by the temporary 11 president of the senate or speaker of the assembly for their respective 12 13 houses, AS DOCUMENTED WITH RECEIPTS, NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS PER DAY. The per diem allowances, including partial per diem allowances, 14 15 shall be made pursuant to regulations promulgated by the temporary president of the senate and the speaker of the assembly for their respective 16 houses, on audit and warrant of the comptroller on vouchers approved by 17 the temporary president of the senate or his or her designee and the 18 19 speaker of the assembly or his or her designee for their respective
