AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to requiring elementary and secondary schools to close in the event the governor declares a state of emergency related to the weather in any city having a population of one million or more

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 27-a 2 to read as follows:
- S 27-A. WEATHER RELATED STATE OF EMERGENCY. WHENEVER THE GOVERNOR, ON HIS OR HER OWN INITIATIVE OR PURSUANT TO A REQUEST FROM THE MAYOR OF A CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE MILLION OR MORE, FINDS THAT A STATE OF EMERGENCY EXISTS BECAUSE OF THE IMMINENT OR EXISTING WEATHER CONDITIONS IN A CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE MILLION OR MORE, HE OR SHE SHALL
- 7 IN A CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE MILLION OR MORE, HE OR SHE SHALL 8 DECLARE A WEATHER RELATED STATE OF EMERGENCY BY EXECUTIVE ORDER. UPON
- 9 SUCH A DECLARATION ALL PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY
- 10 SCHOOLS IN SUCH CITY SHALL BE CLOSED AND REMAIN CLOSED UNTIL SUCH STATE
- 11 OF EMERGENCY IS TERMINATED.
- 12 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
