AN ACT to amend the energy law, in relation to appliance and equipment energy efficiency standards

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 5-108-a of the energy law is amended by adding a new subdivision 3 to read as follows:

CONSUMER AUDIO AND VIDEO PRODUCTS AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION SECTION 16-102 OF THIS CHAPTER PURCHASED BY OR FOR THE STATE OR ANY 5 AGENCY THEREOF SHALL MEET OR EXCEED THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS: (I) 6 SUCH PRODUCTS MEET THE ELECTRONIC PRODUCT ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT 7 TOOL (EPEAT) GOLD STANDARDS FOR ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE FOR 8 NINETY-FIVE PERCENT OF PRODUCTS PURCHASED IN ALL RELEVANT ELECTRONIC 9 PRODUCT CATEGORIES, UNLESS THERE IS NO EPEAT GOLD STANDARD FOR (II) THAT SUCH PRODUCTS MEET THE CURRENT VERSION OF THE APPLI-10 11 CABLE ENERGY STAR STANDARD; (III) THAT POLICIES ARE ESTABLISHED IMPLEMENTED TO EXTEND THE USEFUL LIFE OF THE AGENCY ELECTRONIC EOUIP-12 13 MENT; AND (IV) THATENVIRONMENTALLY SOUND PRACTICES ARE USED 14 RESPECT TO DISPOSITION OF AGENCY ELECTRONIC EQUIPMENT THAT HAS REACHED 15 THE END OF ITS USEFUL LIFE.
 - S 2. Paragraph (a) of subdivision 2 of section 16-106 of the energy law, as added by chapter 431 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as follows:
- 19 (a) On or before [June thirtieth, two thousand six] JANUARY 20 THIRTY-FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN, the secretary, in consultation with 21 the president, shall adopt regulations in accordance with the provisions 22 of this article establishing: (i) energy efficiency performance stand-23 ards for new products of the types set forth in paragraphs (a) through

(n) of subdivision one of section 16-104 of this article, with the exception of such [paragraph] PARAGRAPHS (E) (CONSUMER AUDIO AND VIDEO (g) (incandescent reflector lamps); (ii) procedures for PRODUCTS) AND testing the energy efficiency of the products covered by paragraphs (a) 5 through (n) of subdivision one of section 16-104 of this article; 6 procedures for manufacturers to certify that products covered under this 7 article meet the energy efficiency standards to be promulgated under 8 this article; and (iv) such further matters as are necessary to insure 9 proper implementation and enforcement of the provisions of this 10 article. WITH RESPECT TO CONSUMER AUDIO AND VIDEO PRODUCTS, INCLUDED IN PARAGRAPH (E) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION 16-104 OF THIS ARTICLE, 11 SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE PRESIDENT, SHALL CONDUCT A STUDY TO 12 DETERMINE WHETHER AN ENERGY PERFORMANCE STANDARD FOR SUCH PRODUCT SHOULD 13 14 BE ESTABLISHED, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT FACTORS INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED 15 THE POTENTIAL IMPACT ON ELECTRICITY USAGE, PRODUCT AVAILABILITY, MANUFACTURING COST, INNOVATION, PRODUCT CONVERGENCE, PRODUCT 16 FEATURES 17 FUNCTION, AND CONSUMER AND ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS. BASED ON THE 18 RECOMMENDATIONS OF SUCH STUDY, THE SECRETARY, IN CONSULTATION \mathtt{WITH} 19 PRESIDENT, MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF 20 THIS ARTICLE ESTABLISHING ENERGY PERFORMANCE STANDARDS FOR SUCH PRODUCTS 21 ON OR BEFORE JANUARY THIRTY-FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN. With respect 22 incandescent reflector lamps, included in paragraph (g) of subdivision one of section 16-104 of this article, the secretary, in consulta-23 tion with the president, shall conduct a study to determine whether an 24 25 energy efficiency performance standard for such product should be estab-26 lished, taking into account factors including the potential electricity usage, product availability and consumer and environmental benefits. If it is determined based on this study that such a standard 27 28 29 would reduce energy use and would not be preempted by the federal law, the secretary, in consultation with the president, shall adopt requ-30 lations in accordance with the provisions of this article establishing 31 32 energy performance standards for such product on or before January 33 first, two thousand eight. 34

S 3. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that no energy efficiency performance standard shall become effective for a product less than one hundred eighty days after such energy efficiency performance standard shall become final.
