AN ACT to amend the election law, in relation to voter registration and enrollment

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 5-211 of the election law is amended by adding a new subdivision 18 to read as follows:

3 18. ALL COLLEGES, UNIVERSITIES AND PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS LOCATED IN 4 THIS STATE SHALL MAKE VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS AVAILABLE TO ANY ELIGIBLE 5 STUDENTS IN THE SAME MANNER AND SUBJECT TO THE SAME PROVISIONS AND RULES 6 AND REGULATIONS AS ALL OTHER DESIGNATED AGENCIES; EXCEPT THAT A COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OR PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO COLLECT OR 7 8 MAINTAIN FORMS CONTAINING AN INDIVIDUAL'S DECLINATION TO REGISTER TΟ 9 VOTE AS REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION TEN OF THIS SECTION, OR TO CONDUCT A STUDY AND REPORT THEREON AS REQUIRED BY SUBDIVISION SEVENTEEN OF 10 THIS 11 SECTION.

12 EACH COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY AND PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL PROVIDE EACH 13 ELIGIBLE STUDENT WITH A REGISTRATION FORM WITHIN THE FIRST THREE WEEKS 14 OF THE FIRST SEMESTER OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR OR SUCH STUDENT'S ENTRY ΤO SCHOOL OR ARRIVAL ON CAMPUS PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISIONS TWO, THREE, FOUR, 15 FIVE, SEVEN, NINE, ELEVEN, TWELVE AND FIFTEEN OF THIS 16 SECTION. EVERY 17 COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY AND PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL DESIGNATE AT LEAST ONE CONVENIENT CAMPUS LOCATION WHERE STUDENTS MAY RECEIVE VOTER REGIS-18 19 TRATION FORMS AND PERSONAL ASSISTANCE IN THE COMPLETION OF SUCH FORMS. 20 EACH COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OR PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL PUBLICIZE ITS 21 VOTER REGISTRATION SERVICES PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION SEVEN OF THIS SECTION, AND SHALL OFFER TO COLLECT AND TRANSMIT COMPLETED VOTER REGIS-22 23 TRATION FORMS FROM STUDENTS TO THE LOCAL BOARD OF ELECTIONS PURSUANT TO 24 SUBDIVISIONS TWO, THREE, FIVE, NINE, ELEVEN, TWELVE AND FIFTEEN OF THIS 25 SECTION.

ANY COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OR PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT MAY ELECT TO SOLICIT 1 2 ONE OR MORE RECOGNIZED NON-PARTISAN CAMPUS BASED ASSISTANCE OF THE 3 ТО ORGANIZATIONS OR STUDENT GROUPS TO ASSIST INITS EFFORTS OFFER 4 PERSONAL ASSISTANCE, COLLECTION AND TRANSMITTAL OF VOTER REGISTRATION 5 FORMS.

6 IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBDIVISIONS TWO, FIVE AND EIGHT OF 7 SECTION, ALL COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES OFFERING VOTER REGISTRATION THIS 8 SERVICES SHALL INFORM STUDENTS OF THEIR RIGHT TO COMPLETE A VOTER REGIS-TRATION FORM FROM THEIR COLLEGE ADDRESS OR ANY ADDRESS AT WHICH SUCH 9 10 STUDENT MAY REGULARLY RESIDE WHEN NOT IN SCHOOL; INFORM STUDENTS THAT THEIR DECISION TO REGISTER OR DECLINE TO REGISTER TO VOTE SHALL HAVE 11 NO BEARING ON THEIR COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY RECORD; AND NOTWITHSTANDING THE 12 13 PROVISIONS OF SUBDIVISION NINE OF THIS SECTION, SHALL NOT INQUIRE OR 14 KEEP RECORDS PERTAINING TO ANY STUDENT'S ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE.

15 IN ADDITION TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF SUBDIVISION SEVEN OF THIS SECTION, ALL COLLEGES, UNIVERSITIES AND PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICTS 16 SHALL PLACE A 17 PROMINENT LINK ON THEIR INTERNET WEBSITES TO THE APPROPRIATE PAGE OF THE INTERNET WEBSITE OF THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS OR THE NATIONAL 18 19 ELECTION ASSISTANCE COMMISSION FOR INDIVIDUALS TO LEARN ABOUT THE QUALI-FICATIONS TO VOTE, AND TO DOWNLOAD VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS, EXCEPT THAT 20 21 FOR COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK AND FOR THE CITY 22 SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK SUCH LINK SHALL BE TO THE APPRO-23 PRIATE PAGE OF THE INTERNET WEBSITE OF THE NEW YORK CITY BOARD OF 24 ELECTIONS. SUCH LINKS SHALL BE PROMINENTLY FEATURED DURING THE FIRST 25 LAST THREE WEEKS OF THE ACADEMIC YEAR, AND TWO WEEKS IN ADVANCE OF AND 26 STATE REGISTRATION DEADLINES PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION THREE OF SECTION 27 5-210 OF THIS TITLE.

28 STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS AND, IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK, THE NEW THE YORK CITY BOARD OF ELECTIONS SHALL MAKE AVAILABLE TO COLLEGES, UNIVERSI-29 TIES AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS A SUFFICIENT QUANTITY OF CODED VOTER REGISTRA-30 TION APPLICATIONS THAT IDENTIFY EACH SUCH APPLICATION AS ORIGINATING 31 32 FROM EITHER A COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OR PUBLIC SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE STATE 33 BOARD OF ELECTIONS SHALL PROVIDE FOR THE DELIVERY OF SUCH CODED APPLICA-TIONS BY THE FIRST DAY OF AUGUST OF EACH YEAR TO ANY COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY 34 OR SCHOOL DISTRICT WITHIN THE STATE WHICH SUBMITS A REQUEST 35 THEREFOR . EXCEPT THAT THE NEW YORK CITY BOARD OF ELECTIONS SHALL PROVIDE AND 36 37 DELIVER SUCH FORMS TO ANY REQUESTING UNIVERSITY, COLLEGE OR SCHOOL 38 DISTRICT LOCATED IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK.

39 EVERY BOARD OF ELECTIONS SCANNING VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS SHALL 40 CAPTURE ANY DESIGNATED AGENCY CODES THEREON AND REPORT THEM ON A MONTHLY 41 BASIS TO THE STATE BOARD OF ELECTIONS.

42 S 2. The opening paragraph of section 5-211 of the election law, as 43 amended by chapter 200 of the laws of 1996, is amended to read as 44 follows:

45 Each agency designated as a participating agency under the provisions this section, AND COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY AND SCHOOL DISTRICT, shall 46 of 47 implement and administer a program of distribution of voter registration forms pursuant to the provisions of this section. The following offices 48 49 which provide public assistance and/or provide state funded programs 50 primarily engaged in providing services to persons with disabilities are 51 hereby designated as voter registration agencies: designated as the state agencies which provide public assistance are the department of 52 [social services] FAMILY ASSISTANCE and the department of health. Also 53 54 designated as public assistance agencies are all agencies of local 55 government that provide such assistance. Designated as state agencies 56 that provide programs primarily engaged in providing services to people

with disabilities are the department of labor, office for the aging, 1 division of veterans' affairs, office of mental health, office of voca-2 3 tional and educational services for individuals with disabilities, 4 commission on quality of care for the mentally disabled, office [of 5 mental retardation and] FOR PEOPLE WITH developmental disabilities, 6 commission for the blind and visually handicapped, office of alcoholism and substance abuse services, the office of the advocate for the disa-7 8 bled and all offices which administer programs established or funded by 9 such agencies. Additional state agencies designated as voter registra-10 offices are the department of state and the division of workers' tion 11 compensation. Such agencies shall be required to offer voter registration forms to persons upon initial application for services, renewal or 12 recertification for services and change of address relating to such 13 14 services. Such agencies shall also be responsible for providing assist-15 ance to applicants in completing voter registration forms, receiving and transmitting the completed application form from all applicants who wish 16 17 to have such form transmitted to the appropriate board of elections. The 18 state board of elections shall, together with representatives of the department of defense, develop and implement procedures for including 19 recruitment offices of the armed forces of the United States as voter 20 21 registration offices when such offices are so designated by federal law. 22 The state board shall also make request of the United States Immigration 23 and Naturalization Service to include applications for registration by 24 mail with any materials which are given to new citizens. [All insti-25 tutions of the state university of New York and the city university of 26 New York, shall, at the beginning of the school year, and again in Janu-27 ary of a year in which the president of the United States is to be elected, provide an application for registration to each student in each 28 29 institution.] The state board of elections may, by regulation, such 30 grant a waiver from any or all of the requirements of this section to any office or program of an agency, COLLEGE, UNIVERSITY OR SCHOOL 31 32 DISTRICT, if it determines that it is not feasible for such office or 33 program to administer such requirement.

34 S 3. The opening paragraph of subdivision 8 of section 5-211 of the 35 election law, as amended by chapter 659 of the laws of 1994, is amended 36 to read as follows:

37 Each participating agency, department, division or office that makes available voter registration forms pursuant to this section shall offer 38 each application for the services or assistance of such agency, 39 with 40 department, division or office and with each recertification, renewal or change of address form relating to such service or assistance, a regis-41 42 tration form together with instructions relating to eligibility to register and for completing the form, except that COLLEGES, UNIVERSITIES 43 44 AND SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL DISTRIBUTE VOTER REGISTRATION FORMS IN 45 WITH SUBDIVISION EIGHTEEN OF THIS SECTION, AND forms used by ACCORDANCE the department of [social services] FAMILY ASSISTANCE for the initial 46 47 application for services, renewal or recertification for services and 48 change of address relating to such services shall physically incorporate 49 a voter registration application in a fashion that permits the voter 50 registration portion of the agency form to be detached therefrom. Such 51 voter registration application shall be designed so as to ensure the 52 confidentiality of the source of the application. Included on each 53 participating agency's application for services or assistance or on a 54 separate form shall be:

1 S 4. Paragraph (g) of subdivision 5 of section 5-210 of the election 2 law, as amended by chapter 179 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read 3 as follows:

4 (g) Notice that the applicant must be a citizen of the United States, 5 is [or will be at least eighteen years old not later than December thir-6 ty-first of the calendar year in which he or she registers] AT LEAST 7 SIXTEEN YEARS OLD WHEN HE OR SHE SUBMITS AN APPLICATION TO REGISTER TO 8 VOTE and a resident of the county or city to which application is made.

9 S 5. Paragraph o of subdivision 4 of section 5-500 of the election 10 law, as amended by chapter 659 of the laws of 1994, is amended and a new 11 paragraph p is added to read as follows:

12 o. A space for "remarks" regarding other facts required by this chap-13 ter to be recorded or appropriate to identify the voter[.]; AND

P. A SPACE FOR PRE-REGISTERING APPLICANTS TO RESPOND TO THE FOLLOWING UESTION: "ARE YOU AT LEAST SIXTEEN YEARS OF AGE AND UNDERSTAND THAT YOU MUST BE EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE ON OR BEFORE ELECTION DAY TO VOTE, AND THAT UNTIL YOU REACH THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN YEARS YOUR REGISTRATION WILL BE MARKED AS PENDING AND YOU WILL BE UNABLE TO CAST A BALLOT IN ANY ELECTION?".

20 S 6. The election law is amended by adding a new section 5-507 to read 21 as follows:

22 S 5-507. VOTER PRE-REGISTRATION. A PERSON WHO IS AT LEAST SIXTEEN 23 YEARS OF AGE AND WHO IS OTHERWISE QUALIFIED TO REGISTER TO VOTE MAY 24 PRE-REGISTER TO VOTE, AND SHALL BE AUTOMATICALLY REGISTERED UPON REACH-25 ING THE AGE OF ELIGIBILITY, FOLLOWING VERIFICATION OF THE PERSON'S QUAL-26 IFICATIONS AND ADDRESS.

27 S 7. This act shall take effect July 1, 2014; provided, however, that 28 the provisions of this act shall only apply to school districts on and 29 after July 1, 2015.
