AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to assault on a prosecutor

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 120.05 of the penal law, as amended by chapter 377 of the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:

With intent to prevent a peace officer, a police officer, PROSECU-TOR AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION THIRTY-ONE OF SECTION 1.20 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE LAW, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, New York city sanitation worker, a firefighter, including a firefighter acting as a paramedic or emergency medical technician administering first aid in the course of performance of duty as such firefighter, an emergency medical service paramedic or emergency medical service technician, or medical or related personnel in a hospital emergency department, a city marshal, a traffic enforcement officer traffic enforcement agent, from performing a lawful duty, by means including releasing or failing to control an animal under circumstances evincing the actor's intent that the animal obstruct the lawful activity of such peace officer, police officer, PROSECUTOR AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVI-SION THIRTY-ONE OF SECTION 1.20 OF THE CRIMINAL PROCEDURE LAW, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, New York city sanitation worker, firefighter, paramedic, technician, city marshal, traffic enforcement officer or traffic enforcement agent, he or she causes physical injury to such peace officer, police officer, PROSE-CUTOR AS DEFINED IN SUBDIVISION THIRTY-ONE OF SECTION 1.20 OF THE CRIMI-PROCEDURE LAW, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, New York city sanitation worker, firefighter,
