AN ACT to amend the highway law, in relation to designating a portion of the state highway system as the "Hancock Veterans Memorial Highway"

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The highway law is amended by adding a new section 344-b to 2 read as follows:
  - S 344-B. PORTION OF THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM TO BE DESIGNATED AS THE "HANCOCK VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY". ALL THAT PORTION OF THE STATE HIGH-WAY SYSTEM CONSTITUTING STATE ROUTE NINETY-SEVEN IN THE TOWN OF HANCOCK, COUNTY OF DELAWARE, BEGINNING AT THE WESTERN BOUNDARY OF THE VILLAGE OF HANCOCK, CONTINUING IN A GENERALLY SOUTHEASTERLY DIRECTION, AND TERMI-NATING AT THE DELAWARE AND SULLIVAN COUNTY LINE, SHALL BE DESIGNATED AND KNOWN AS THE "HANCOCK VETERANS MEMORIAL HIGHWAY".
- 2. The commissioner of transportation shall provide for the installation and maintenance of adequate signing of the state highway system designated pursuant to section one of this act. However, to avoid confusion and to limit any possible disruption of commerce, the desig-13 nation called for pursuant to section one of this act shall be one of 14 ceremonial nature and the official name of such highway shall not be 15 changed as a result of this act. 16
- 17 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
