AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to medical assistance for poliomyelitis

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraph (g) of subdivision 2 of section 365-a of the
2 social services law, as amended by section 7 of part D of chapter 56 of
3 the laws of 2012, is amended to read as follows:
4 (g) sickroom supplies, eyeglasses, prosthetic appliances and dental
5 prosthetic appliances furnished in accordance with the regulations of
6 the department; provided further that: (i) the commissioner of health is
7 authorized to implement a preferred diabetic supply program wherein the
8 department of health will receive enhanced rebates from preferred
9 manufacturers of glucometers and test strips, and may subject non-pre-
10 ferred manufacturers' glucometers and test strips to prior authorization
11 under section two hundred seventy-three of the public health law; (ii)
12 enteral formula therapy and nutritional supplements are limited to
13 coverage only for nasogastric, jejunostomy, or gastrostomy tube feeding,
14 for treatment of an inborn metabolic disorder, or to address growth and
15 development problems in children, or, subject to standards established
16 by the commissioner, for persons with a diagnosis of HIV infection, AIDS
17 or HIV-related illness or other diseases and conditions; (iii)
18 prescription footwear and inserts are limited to coverage only when used
19 as an integral part of a lower limb orthotic appliance, as part of a
20 diabetic treatment plan, [or] to address growth and development problems
21 in children OR TO ADDRESS CONSEQUENCES OF POLIOMEYELITIS; and (iv)
22 compression and support stockings are limited to coverage only for preg-
23 nancy or treatment of venous stasis ulcers;
24 S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after
25 it shall have become a law.
