AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to regulation of toxic chemicals in children's products

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Article 37 of the environmental conservation law is amended  
2 by adding a new title 9 to read as follows:

3 TITLE IX

4 TOXIC CHEMICALS IN CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS

5 SECTION 37-0901. DEFINITIONS.

6 37-0903. PRIORITY CHEMICALS AND CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN.

7 37-0905. DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION ON PRIORITY CHEMICALS.

8 37-0907. SALES PROHIBITION.

9 37-0909. APPLICABILITY.

10 37-0911. ENFORCEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION.

11 37-0913. INTERSTATE CHEMICAL CLEARINGHOUSE.

12 37-0915. REGULATIONS.

13 S 37-0901. DEFINITIONS.

14 AS USED IN THIS TITLE, UNLESS THE CONTEXT OTHERWISE INDICATES, THE  
15 FOLLOWING TERMS HAVE THE FOLLOWING MEANINGS.

16 1. "CHILDREN'S APPAREL" MEANS ANY ITEM OF CLOTHING THAT CONSISTS OF  
17 FABRIC OR RELATED MATERIAL INTENDED OR PROMOTED FOR USE IN CHILDREN'S  
18 CLOTHING. CHILDREN'S APPAREL DOES NOT MEAN PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT DESIGNED  
19 TO PREVENT INJURY, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, BICYCLE HELMETS,  
20 ATHLETIC SUPPORTERS, KNEE PADS OR ELBOW PADS.

21 2. "CHEMICAL" MEANS A SUBSTANCE WITH A DISTINCT MOLECULAR COMPOSITION  
22 OR A GROUP OF STRUCTURALLY RELATED SUBSTANCES AND INCLUDES THE BREAKDOWN  
23 PRODUCTS OF THE SUBSTANCE OR SUBSTANCES THAT FORM THROUGH DECOMPOSITION,  
24 DEGRADATION OR METABOLISM.

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets  
[ ] is old law to be omitted.

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1 3. "CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN" MEANS: (A) CHEMICALS INCLUDED IN THE  
2 LIST OF "CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN" PUBLISHED IN TWO THOUSAND NINE  
3 PURSUANT TO CHAPTER SIXTEEN-D OF TITLE 38 OF THE MAINE REVISED STATUTES  
4 ANNOTATED; OR (B) A CHEMICAL ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO  
5 SECTION 37-0903 OF THIS TITLE.

6 4. "CHILDREN" MEANS A PERSON OR PERSONS AGED TWELVE AND UNDER.

7 5. "CHILDREN'S PRODUCT" MEANS A PRODUCT PRIMARILY INTENDED FOR, MADE  
8 FOR OR MARKETED FOR USE BY CHILDREN, SUCH AS BABY PRODUCTS, TOYS, CAR  
9 SEATS, PERSONAL CARE PRODUCTS, A PRODUCT DESIGNED OR INTENDED BY THE  
10 MANUFACTURER TO HELP A CHILD WITH SUCKING OR TEETHING, TO FACILITATE  
11 SLEEP, RELAXATION, OR THE FEEDING OF A CHILD, NOVELTY PRODUCTS, BEDDING,  
12 FURNITURE, FURNISHINGS, AND CHILDREN'S APPAREL. "CHILDREN'S PRODUCT"  
13 DOES NOT INCLUDE (A) BATTERIES; OR (B) CONSUMER ELECTRONIC PRODUCTS  
14 INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PERSONAL COMPUTERS, AUDIO AND VIDEO EQUIP-  
15 MENT, CALCULATORS, WIRELESS PHONES, GAME CONSOLES, AND HANDHELD DEVICES  
16 INCORPORATING A VIDEO SCREEN, USED TO ACCESS INTERACTIVE SOFTWARE AND  
17 THEIR ASSOCIATED PERIPHERALS; OR (C) A FOOD OR BEVERAGE OR AN ADDITIVE  
18 TO A FOOD OR BEVERAGE REGULATED BY THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG  
19 ADMINISTRATION; OR (D) A TOBACCO PRODUCT OR PAPER OR FOREST PRODUCT; OR  
20 (E) A PESTICIDE REGULATED BY THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION  
21 AGENCY. CHILDREN'S PRODUCT ALSO DOES NOT INCLUDE A DRUG, BIOLOGIC OR  
22 MEDICAL DEVICE REGULATED BY THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG ADMINIS-  
23 TRATION.

24 6. "DISTRIBUTOR" MEANS A PERSON WHO SELLS CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS TO  
25 RETAIL ESTABLISHMENTS ON A WHOLESALE BASIS.

26 7. "INTENTIONALLY ADDED" MEANS THE DELIBERATE USE IN THE FORMULATION  
27 OF A PRODUCT OR SUBPART WHERE ITS CONTINUED PRESENCE IS DESIRED IN THE  
28 FINAL PRODUCT OR SUBPART TO PROVIDE A SPECIFIC CHARACTERISTIC, APPEAR-  
29 ANCE OR QUALITY.

30 8. "MANUFACTURER" MEANS ANY PERSON WHO CURRENTLY MANUFACTURES A CHIL-  
31 DREN'S PRODUCT OR WHOSE BRAND NAME IS AFFIXED TO THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT.  
32 IN THE CASE OF A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT THAT WAS IMPORTED INTO THE UNITED  
33 STATES, "MANUFACTURER" INCLUDES THE IMPORTER OR FIRST DOMESTIC DISTRIBUTOR  
34 OF THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT IF THE PERSON WHO CURRENTLY MANUFACTURES  
35 OR ASSEMBLES THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT OR WHOSE BRAND NAME IS AFFIXED TO  
36 THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT DOES NOT HAVE A PRESENCE IN THE UNITED STATES.

37 9. "NOVELTY PRODUCT" MEANS A PRODUCT INTENDED MAINLY FOR PERSONAL OR  
38 HOUSEHOLD ENJOYMENT OR ADORNMENT. NOVELTY PRODUCTS INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT  
39 LIMITED TO, ITEMS INTENDED FOR USE AS PRACTICAL JOKES, FIGURINES, ADORN-  
40 MENTS, TOYS, GAMES, CARDS, ORNAMENTS, YARD STATUES AND FIGURES, CANDLES,  
41 JEWELRY, HOLIDAY DECORATIONS, OR SIMILAR PRODUCTS.

42 10. "PRIORITY CHEMICAL" MEANS (A) THE FOLLOWING CHEMICALS:

43 CASRN13674-87-8 TRIS (1, 3 DICHLORO-2-PROPYL) PHOSPHATE  
44 CASRN71-43-2 BENZENE  
45 CASRN7439-92-1 LEAD AND COMPOUNDS (INORGANIC)  
46 CASRN7439-97-6 MERCURY AND MERCURY COMPOUNDS, INCLUDING METHYL  
47 MERCURY (CASRN 22967-92-6)  
48 CASRN7439-98-7 MOLYBDENUM AND MOLYBDENUM COMPOUNDS  
49 CASRN7440-36-0 ANTIMONY AND ANTIMONY COMPOUNDS  
50 CASRN7440-38-2 ARSENIC AND ARSENIC COMPOUNDS INCLUDING ARSENIC  
51 TRIOXIDE (CASRN 1327-53-3)

55 (B) A CHEMICAL ADOPTED BY THE DEPARTMENT PURSUANT TO SECTION 37-0903  
56 OF THIS TITLE.

1 11. "TOY" MEANS A PRODUCT DESIGNED OR INTENDED BY THE MANUFACTURER TO  
2 BE USED BY A CHILD AT PLAY.

3 S 37-0903. PRIORITY CHEMICALS AND CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN.

4 1. PUBLISHING OF LIST. WITHIN ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE  
5 DATE OF THIS TITLE, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL POST LISTS OF PRIORITY CHEMI-  
6 CALS AND CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN ON THE DEPARTMENT'S WEBSITE.

7 2. PERIODIC REVIEW. (A) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE  
8 DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, MAY PERIODICALLY REVIEW THE LIST OF PRIORITY CHEM-  
9 ICALS AND, THROUGH REGULATION, IDENTIFY ADDITIONAL PRIORITY CHEMICALS OR  
10 CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN OR REMOVE A CHEMICAL FROM SUCH LISTS BASED ON  
11 EVIDENCE THAT THE CHEMICAL IS NOT PRESENT IN A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT OR  
12 OTHERWISE SHOULD NOT BE SUBJECT TO THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE.  
13 NOTHING HEREIN SHALL PREVENT THE DEPARTMENT FROM ACTING TO ADD SUCH  
14 CHEMICALS OUTSIDE OF THE PERIODIC REVIEW PROCESS.

15 (B) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, MAY  
16 IDENTIFY A CHEMICAL AS A PRIORITY CHEMICAL IF, UPON SUCH REVIEW, IT  
17 DETERMINES THAT A CHEMICAL OF HIGH CONCERN MEETS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING  
18 CRITERIA:

19 (I) THE CHEMICAL OR ITS METABOLITES HAVE BEEN FOUND THROUGH BIOMONI-  
20 TORING TO BE PRESENT IN HUMANS, INCLUDING HUMAN BLOOD, UMBILICAL CORD  
21 BLOOD, BREAST MILK, URINE OR OTHER BODILY TISSUES OR FLUIDS;

22 (II) THE CHEMICAL HAS BEEN FOUND THROUGH SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS TO BE  
23 PRESENT IN HOUSEHOLD DUST, INDOOR AIR, DRINKING WATER OR ELSEWHERE IN  
24 THE HOME ENVIRONMENT;

25 (III) THE CHEMICAL HAS BEEN FOUND THROUGH MONITORING TO BE PRESENT IN  
26 FISH, WILDLIFE OR THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT;

27 (IV) THE CHEMICAL IS PRESENT IN A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT USED OR PRESENT  
28 IN THE HOME, SCHOOL, OR CHILDCARE CENTER; OR

29 (V) THE SALE OR USE OF THE CHEMICAL OR A PRODUCT CONTAINING THE CHEMI-  
30 CAL HAS BEEN BANNED IN ANOTHER STATE OR STATES WITHIN THE UNITED STATES  
31 BECAUSE OF THE HEALTH EFFECTS OF SUCH CHEMICAL.

32 (C) IF A CHEMICAL IS REMOVED FROM THE LISTING OF CHEMICALS OF HIGH  
33 CONCERN, IT SHALL ALSO BE UNDESIGNATED AS A PRIORITY CHEMICAL.

34 (D) THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH  
35 SHALL IDENTIFY A CHEMICAL AS A CHEMICAL OF HIGH CONCERN IF, UPON REVIEW,  
36 IT DETERMINES THAT THE CHEMICAL HAS BEEN IDENTIFIED BY A STATE, FEDERAL  
37 OR INTERNATIONAL GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY ON THE BASIS OF CREDIBLE SCIENTIFIC  
38 EVIDENCE AS:

39 (I) A CARCINOGEN, A REPRODUCTIVE OR DEVELOPMENTAL TOXICANT OR AN  
40 ENDOCRINE DISRUPTOR;

41 (II) PERSISTENT, BIOACCUMULATIVE AND TOXIC; OR

42 (III) VERY PERSISTENT AND VERY BIOACCUMULATIVE.

43 (E) IN MAKING SUCH DETERMINATION, THE DEPARTMENT MAY CONSIDER BUT IS  
44 NOT LIMITED TO CONSIDERING:

45 (I) CHEMICALS IDENTIFIED AS "GROUP 1 CARCINOGENS" OR "GROUP 2A CARCI-  
46 NOGENS" BY THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION, INTERNATIONAL AGENCY FOR  
47 RESEARCH ON CANCER;

48 (II) CHEMICALS IDENTIFIED AS "KNOWN TO BE A HUMAN CARCINOGEN" AND  
49 "REASONABLY ANTICIPATED TO BE A HUMAN CARCINOGEN" BY THE SECRETARY OF  
50 THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES PURSUANT TO  
51 THE PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE ACT, 42 UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 241(B)(4),  
52 AS AMENDED;

53 (III) CHEMICALS IDENTIFIED AS "GROUP A CARCINOGENS" OR "GROUP B CARCI-  
54 NOGENS" BY THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY;

55 (IV) CHEMICALS IDENTIFIED AS REPRODUCTIVE OR DEVELOPMENTAL TOXICANTS  
56 BY:

1 (A) THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES,  
2 NATIONAL TOXICOLOGY PROGRAM, CENTER FOR THE EVALUATION OF RISKS TO HUMAN  
3 REPRODUCTION; AND

4 (B) THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY, OFFICE OF ENVIRON-  
5 MENTAL HEALTH HAZARD ASSESSMENT PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND  
6 SAFETY CODE, SAFE DRINKING WATER AND TOXIC ENFORCEMENT ACT OF 1986,  
7 CHAPTER 6.6, SECTION 25249.8;

8 (V) CHEMICALS IDENTIFIED AS A CHEMICAL OF HIGH CONCERN FOR CHILDREN OR  
9 A HIGH PRIORITY CHEMICAL OF HIGH CONCERN FOR CHILDREN OR AS A PERSISTENT  
10 BIOACCUMULATIVE TOXIC CHEMICAL BY THE STATE OF WASHINGTON DEPARTMENT OF  
11 ECOLOGY, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 70.240 OF THE REVISED CODE OF WASHINGTON OR  
12 CHAPTER 173-333 OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON ADMINISTRATIVE CODE;

13 (VI) CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN AS SUCH CHEMICALS ARE IDENTIFIED BY THE  
14 STATE OF MAINE'S DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION AND APPEARING  
15 ON SUCH DEPARTMENT'S LIST OF CHEMICALS OF HIGH CONCERN;

16 (VII) CHEMICALS IDENTIFIED AS KNOWN OR LIKELY ENDOCRINE DISRUPTORS  
17 THROUGH SCREENING OR TESTING CONDUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROTOCOLS  
18 DEVELOPED BY THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY PURSUANT  
19 TO THE UNITED STATES FOOD, DRUG AND COSMETIC ACT, 21 UNITED STATES CODE,  
20 346A(P), AS AMENDED BY THE FEDERAL FOOD QUALITY PROTECTION ACT (PUBLIC  
21 LAW 104-170) OR THE FEDERAL SAFE DRINKING WATER ACT, 42 UNITED STATES  
22 CODE, SECTION 300J-17;

23 (VIII) CHEMICALS LISTED ON THE BASIS OF ENDOCRINE-DISRUPTING PROPER-  
24 TIES IN ANNEX XIV, LIST OF SUBSTANCES SUBJECT TO AUTHORISATION, REGU-  
25 LATION (EC) NO 1907/2006 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT CONCERNING THE  
26 REGISTRATION, EVALUATION, AUTHORISATION AND RESTRICTION OF CHEMICALS;

27 (IX) PERSISTENT, BIOACCUMULATIVE AND TOXIC CHEMICALS IDENTIFIED BY  
28 OTHER STATES OR THE UNITED STATES ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY; AND

29 (X) A VERY PERSISTENT, VERY BIOACCUMULATIVE CHEMICAL LISTED IN ANNEX  
30 XIV, LIST OF SUBSTANCES SUBJECT TO AUTHORISATION, REGULATION (EC) NO  
31 1907/2006 OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT CONCERNING THE REGISTRATION, EVALU-  
32 ATION, AUTHORISATION AND RESTRICTION OF CHEMICALS.

33 S 37-0905. DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION ON PRIORITY CHEMICALS.

34 1. REPORTING OF CHEMICAL USE. NO LATER THAN TWELVE MONTHS AFTER A  
35 PRIORITY CHEMICAL IS LISTED ON THE LIST PUBLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION  
36 37-0903 OF THIS TITLE, EVERY MANUFACTURER WHO OFFERS A CHILDREN'S PROD-  
37 UCT FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTION IN THIS STATE THAT CONTAINS AN INTEN-  
38 TIONALLY ADDED PRIORITY CHEMICAL SHALL REPORT SUCH CHEMICAL USE TO THE  
39 DEPARTMENT. THE DEPARTMENT MAY COLLABORATE WITH OTHER STATES AND AN  
40 INTERSTATE CHEMICALS CLEARINGHOUSE IN DEVELOPING SUCH FORM.

41 (A) THIS REPORT MUST AT A MINIMUM IDENTIFY THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT, THE  
42 PRIORITY CHEMICAL OR CHEMICALS CONTAINED IN THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT, AND  
43 THE INTENDED PURPOSE OF THE CHEMICALS IN THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT. THE  
44 DEPARTMENT MAY ALSO REQUIRE REPORTING OF THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

45 (I) THE POTENTIAL FOR HARM TO HUMAN HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT FROM  
46 SPECIFIC USES OF THE PRIORITY CHEMICAL;

47 (II) THE AMOUNT OF SUCH CHEMICAL IN EACH UNIT OF THE CHILDREN'S PROD-  
48 UCT, EXPRESSED IN A RANGE;

49 (III) INFORMATION ON THE LIKELIHOOD THAT THE CHEMICAL WILL BE RELEASED  
50 FROM THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT TO THE ENVIRONMENT DURING THE PRODUCT'S LIFE  
51 CYCLE AND THE EXTENT TO WHICH USERS OF THE PRODUCT ARE LIKELY TO BE  
52 EXPOSED TO THE CHEMICAL; OR

53 (IV) INFORMATION ON THE EXTENT TO WHICH THE CHEMICAL IS PRESENT IN THE  
54 ENVIRONMENT OR HUMAN BODY.

55 (B) THE DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO DIRECT SUBMISSION OF A COPY OF  
56 SUCH REPORT TO THE INTERSTATE CHEMICALS CLEARINGHOUSE.

1 2. WAIVER OF REPORTING. UPON APPLICATION BY A MANUFACTURER, THE  
2 COMMISSIONER MAY WAIVE ALL OR PART OF THE REPORTING REQUIREMENTS UNDER  
3 SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION FOR ONE OR MORE SPECIFIED USES OF A  
4 PRIORITY CHEMICAL. IN MAKING SUCH DETERMINATION, THE COMMISSIONER MAY  
5 CONSIDER: (A) IF SUBSTANTIALLY EQUIVALENT INFORMATION IS ALREADY PUBLIC-  
6 LY AVAILABLE OR THAT THE INFORMATION IS NOT NEEDED FOR THE PURPOSES OF  
7 THIS CHAPTER, (B) SIMILAR WAIVERS GRANTED BY OTHER STATES, AND (C)  
8 WHETHER THE SPECIFIED USE OR USES ARE MINOR IN VOLUME.

9 3. NOTICE TO RETAILERS. A MANUFACTURER OF A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT  
10 CONTAINING A PRIORITY CHEMICAL SHALL NOTIFY PERSONS THAT OFFER THE CHIL-  
11 DREN'S PRODUCT FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTION IN THE STATE, IN A FORM  
12 PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT, OF THE PRESENCE OF SUCH PRIORITY CHEMICAL,  
13 AND PROVIDE SUCH PERSONS WITH INFORMATION REGARDING THE TOXICITY OF SUCH  
14 CHEMICAL.

15 4. FEES. THE MANUFACTURER SHALL PAY A FEE UPON SUBMISSION OF A REPORT  
16 OF CHEMICAL USE PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION OR A WAIVER  
17 REQUEST PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION TO COVER THE DEPART-  
18 MENT'S REASONABLE COSTS IN THE AMOUNT OF SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS PER CHEMI-  
19 CAL.

20 S 37-0907. SALES PROHIBITION.

21 EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2018, NO PERSON SHALL DISTRIBUTE, SELL OR OFFER  
22 FOR SALE IN THIS STATE A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT CONTAINING A PRIORITY CHEMI-  
23 CAL THAT HAS BEEN LISTED FOR AT LEAST ONE YEAR. THIS PROVISION SHALL  
24 NOT APPLY TO A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT SOLELY BASED ON ITS CONTAINING AN  
25 ENCLOSED BATTERY OR ENCLOSED ELECTRONIC COMPONENTS. THE COMMISSIONER MAY  
26 EXEMPT A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT FROM THIS PROHIBITION IF, IN THE COMMISSION-  
27 ER'S JUDGMENT, THE LACK OF AVAILABILITY OF THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT COULD  
28 POSE AN UNREASONABLE RISK TO PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE.

29 S 37-0909. APPLICABILITY.

30 1. NEW CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS. THE PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE SHALL APPLY  
31 TO CHEMICALS IN CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS SOLD OR DISTRIBUTED AS NEW AND DOES  
32 NOT APPLY TO USED CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS THAT ARE SOLD OR DISTRIBUTED FOR  
33 FREE AT SECONDHAND STORES, YARD SALES, ON THE INTERNET OR DONATED TO  
34 CHARITIES.

35 2. INDUSTRY. THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE SHALL NOT APPLY TO PRIORI-  
36 TY CHEMICALS USED IN OR FOR INDUSTRY OR MANUFACTURING, INCLUDING CHEMI-  
37 CALS PROCESSED OR OTHERWISE USED IN OR FOR INDUSTRIAL OR MANUFACTURING  
38 PROCESSES AND NOT INCLUDED IN THE FINAL PRODUCT.

39 3. TRANSPORTATION. THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE SHALL NOT APPLY TO  
40 MOTOR VEHICLES OR THEIR COMPONENT PARTS, WATERCRAFT OR THEIR COMPONENT  
41 PARTS, ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES OR THEIR COMPONENT PARTS, OR OFF-HIGHWAY  
42 MOTORCYCLES OR THEIR COMPONENT PARTS, EXCEPT THAT THE USE OF PRIORITY  
43 CHEMICALS IN DETACHABLE CAR SEATS IS NOT EXEMPT.

44 4. COMBUSTION. THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE SHALL NOT APPLY TO  
45 PRIORITY CHEMICALS GENERATED SOLELY AS COMBUSTION BY-PRODUCTS OR THAT  
46 ARE PRESENT IN COMBUSTIBLE FUELS.

47 5. RETAILERS. A RETAILER IS EXEMPT FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS TITLE  
48 UNLESS THAT RETAILER KNOWINGLY SELLS A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT CONTAINING A  
49 PRIORITY CHEMICAL AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF ITS PROHIBITION FOR WHICH  
50 THAT RETAILER HAS RECEIVED NOTIFICATION PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION THREE OF  
51 SECTION 37-0905 OF THIS TITLE.

52 S 37-0911. ENFORCEMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION.

53 1. FAILURE TO PROVIDE NOTICE. A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT CONTAINING A PRIOR-  
54 ITY CHEMICAL MAY NOT BE SOLD, OFFERED FOR SALE OR DISTRIBUTED FOR SALE  
55 IN THIS STATE UNLESS THE MANUFACTURER HAS PROVIDED THE NOTIFICATION  
56 REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 37-0905 OF THIS TITLE BY THE DATE REQUIRED IN

1 SUCH SECTION. THE COMMISSIONER MAY EXEMPT A CHILDREN'S PRODUCT FROM THIS  
2 PROHIBITION IF, IN THE COMMISSIONER'S JUDGMENT, THE LACK OF AVAILABILITY  
3 OF THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT COULD POSE AN UNREASONABLE RISK TO PUBLIC  
4 HEALTH, SAFETY OR WELFARE.

5 2. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE. IF THERE ARE GROUNDS TO SUSPECT THAT A  
6 CHILDREN'S PRODUCT IS BEING OFFERED FOR SALE IN VIOLATION OF THIS TITLE,  
7 THE DEPARTMENT MAY REQUEST THE MANUFACTURER OF THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT TO  
8 PROVIDE A STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE ON A FORM PROVIDED BY THE DEPARTMENT,  
9 WITHIN TEN DAYS OF RECEIPT OF A REQUEST FROM THE DEPARTMENT. THE STATE-  
10 MENT OF COMPLIANCE SHALL:

11 (A) ATTEST THAT THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT DOES NOT CONTAIN THE PRIORITY  
12 CHEMICAL; OR

13 (B) ATTEST AND PROVIDE THE DEPARTMENT WITH DOCUMENTATION THAT NOTIFI-  
14 CATION OF THE PRESENCE OF THE PRIORITY CHEMICAL HAS BEEN PROVIDED TO THE  
15 DEPARTMENT OR PROVIDE NOTICE AS REQUIRED BY SECTION 37-0905 OF THIS  
16 TITLE; OR

17 (C) ATTEST THAT THE MANUFACTURER HAS NOTIFIED PERSONS WHO SELL THE  
18 PRODUCT IN THIS STATE THAT THE SALE OF THE CHILDREN'S PRODUCT IS PROHIB-  
19 ITED.

20 S 37-0913. INTERSTATE CHEMICAL CLEARINGHOUSE.

21 1. THE DEPARTMENT IS AUTHORIZED TO PARTICIPATE IN AN INTERSTATE CHEMI-  
22 CALS CLEARINGHOUSE TO ASSIST IN CARRYING OUT THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS  
23 TITLE. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL WORK IN COLLABORATION WITH OTHER STATES AND  
24 AN INTERSTATE CHEMICALS CLEARINGHOUSE FOR THE PURPOSE OF, INCLUDING BUT  
25 NOT LIMITED TO:

26 (A) COLLECTION AND DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION REGARDING CHEMICAL  
27 HAZARDS;

28 (B) COLLECTION AND DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION REGARDING THE USE OF  
29 CHEMICALS IN CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS;

30 (C) ASSESSMENT OF ALTERNATIVES TO CHEMICALS AND THEIR USE IN PRODUCTS;  
31 AND

32 (D) PUBLIC EDUCATION.

33 2. SUCH CLEARINGHOUSE IS AUTHORIZED TO MAINTAIN INFORMATION ON BEHALF  
34 OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, INFORMATION  
35 REGARDING CHEMICALS CONTAINED IN CHILDREN'S PRODUCTS DISCLOSED PURSUANT  
36 TO SECTION 37-0905 OF THIS TITLE.

37 S 37-0915. REGULATIONS.

38 THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT ANY RULES AND REGULATIONS IT DEEMS NECESSARY  
39 TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS TITLE.

40 S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after  
41 it shall have become a law. Effective immediately, the department of  
42 environmental conservation is authorized to implement rules and regu-  
43 lations for the timely implementation of this act on its effective date.
