Introduced by Sens. SQUADRON, ESPAILLAT, HOYLMAN, KRUEGER, MONTGOMERY, PARKER, PERALTA, PERKINS, SANDERS, SERRANO -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Rules -- recommitted to the Committee on Housing, Construction and Community Development in accordance with Senate Rule 6, sec. 8 -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to require the office of the mayor of a city with a population of one million or more to produce an annual report listing all compacts, memoranda of understanding or other agreements pertaining to any additional police services and their associated cost

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1.     In cities with a population of one million or more, the  
2 office of the mayor shall produce a report no later than the first of  
3 April each year listing any compacts that are ongoing or have been  
4 entered into within the preceding 24 months to provide additional police  
5 services. The annual report shall include any policies and procedures  
6 that regulate additional police services, a summary of all additional  
7 police services provided, and the revenue received for any additional  
8 police services.  
9     S 2. "Additional police services" shall mean services provided by the  
10 police department in cities with a population of one million or more  
11 pursuant to memoranda of understanding, private contracts, or any other  
12 agreement with an entity other than the government of the city, includ-  
13 ing, but not limited to, any agreement that requires reimbursement,  
14 payment or transfer of funds to the government of the city, including  
15 one of its agencies, from another entity, public or private.  
16     S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
