AN ACT to amend the labor law, in relation to increasing the minimum wage

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 652 of the labor law, as amended 2 by section 1 of part P of chapter 57 of the laws of 2013, is amended to 3 read as follows:
- 4 1. Statutory. Every employer shall pay to each of its employees for 5 each hour worked a wage of not less than:
- 6 \$4.25 on and after April 1, 1991,
 - \$5.15 on and after March 31, 2000,
- 8 \$6.00 on and after January 1, 2005,
 - \$6.75 on and after January 1, 2006,
- 10 \$7.15 on and after January 1, 2007,
- 11 \$8.00 on and after December 31, 2013,
- 12 [\$8.75] \$10.10 on and after December 31, 2014,
- 13 [\$9.00 on and after December 31, 2015,] or, if greater, such other 14 wage as may be established by federal law pursuant to 29 U.S.C. section
- 15 206 or its successors

- 16 or such other wage as may be established in accordance with the 17 provisions of this article.
- AS OF MARCH 1, 2016 AND NO LATER THAN MARCH FIRST OF EACH SUCCESSIVE
- 19 YEAR, THE MINIMUM WAGE PROVIDED FOR IN THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL BE 20 INCREASED IN PROPORTION TO THE INCREASE DURING THE PRECEDING CALENDAR
- 21 YEAR, IF ANY, IN THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX FOR ALL URBAN CONSUMERS AS
- 22 PUBLISHED BY THE U.S. BUREAU OF LABOR STATICS OF THE UNITED STATES
- 23 DEPARTMENT OF LABOR.
- 24 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
