AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the Blue Ribbon Commission

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new article 7-B to read as follows:

S 349-A. DEFINITIONS. AS USED IN THIS ARTICLE: 12

13 1. "COMMISSION" SHALL MEAN THE BLUE RIBBON COMMISSION ON 21ST CENTURY 14 TESTING AND CURRICULUM ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO THIS ARTICLE.

2. "COMMON CORE CURRICULUM" SHALL MEAN ANY CURRICULUM DEVELOPED 15 ΤN 16 FURTHERANCE OF THE COMMON CORE ACADEMIC STANDARDS DEVELOPED BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNORS ASSOCIATION CENTER FOR BEST PRACTICES AND THE COUNCIL 17 OF CHIEF STATE SCHOOL OFFICERS. 18

19 3. "COMMON CORE STATE TEST" SHALL MEAN ANY STATE OR CONSORTIUM 20 DEVELOPED OR ADMINISTERED TEST GIVEN IN NEW YORK STATE TO CREATED, 21 STUDENTS IN GRADES PRE-KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELVE THAT TESTS Α 22 STUDENT'S KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS RELATING TO THE COMMON CORE CURRICULUM.

23 4. "CONSORTIUM" SHALL MEAN THE SMARTER BALANCED ASSESSMENT CONSORTIUM, PARTNERSHIP FOR ASSESSMENT OF READINESS FOR COLLEGE AND CAREERS, OR 24 THE25 ANY OTHER ORGANIZATION, ENTITY, OR GROUP DEVELOPING STANDARDIZED TESTS 26 BASED OFF OF THE COMMON CORE CURRICULUM.

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CENTURY TESTING AND CURRICULUM, WHICH SHALL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING 1 2 TWENTY-THREE MEMBERS WHO SHALL BE APPOINTED NO LESS THAN THIRTY DAYS 3 AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION: 4 A. FIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, ONE OF WHOM SHALL 5 BE THE COMMISSIONER; 6 B. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE 7 SENATE; 8 C. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY; 9 D. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE 10 SENATE; E. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEM-11 12 BLY; 13 F. THREE MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF NEW YORK STATE 14 UNITED TEACHERS, ONE OF WHOM MUST HAVE COMPLETED THEIR SPECIAL EDUCATION 15 CERTIFICATION AND ONE OF WHOM MUST PROVIDE INSTRUCTION TO ENGLISH AS Α SECOND LANGUAGE STUDENTS; 16 17 G. ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS ASSOCIATION OF NEW YORK STATE; 18 19 H. TWO MEMBERS SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE NEW YORK STATE PARENT TEACHER ASSOCIATION, ONE OF WHOM MUST BE A PARENT OF A 20 21 STUDENT WITH A CURRENT INDIVIDUAL EDUCATION PLAN; I. ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE 22 NEW 23 YORK STATE COUNCIL OF SCHOOL SUPERINTENDENTS; 24 J. ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE NEW YORK 25 STATE SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION; PRESIDENT OF 26 K. ONE MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE THE NEW YORK 27 STATE ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS; 28 MEMBER SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE PRESIDENT OF THE NEW YORK L. ONE 29 STATE ASSOCIATION OF SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS. SUCH MEMBER SHALL HAVE EXPE-30 RIENCE IN A CLINICAL SETTING. 2. NO MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION SHALL BE DISOUALIFIED FROM HOLDING ANY 31 32 PUBLIC OFFICE OR EMPLOYMENT, NOR SHALL HE OR SHE FORFEIT ANY SUCH OFFICE 33 OR EMPLOYMENT BY VIRTUE OF HIS OR HER APPOINTMENT PURSUANT ΤO THIS 34 SECTION. MEMBERS OF THE COMMISSION SHALL RECEIVE NO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES, BUT SHALL BE ALLOWED THEIR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES 35 INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR FUNCTIONS PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. 36 37 A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY BE REMOVED BY THE APPOINTING AUTHORITY 38 ONLY FOR GOOD CAUSE, AFTER NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD. VACANCIES 39 SHALL BE FILLED IN THE SAME MANNER AS ORIGINAL APPOINTMENTS. 40 3. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE COMMISSION. A. THE COMMISSION SHALL HOLD AT LEAST ONE PUBLIC HEARING IN EACH OF 41 42 THE FOLLOWING REGIONS: 43 I. LONG ISLAND; 44 II. NEW YORK CITY; 45 III. HUDSON VALLEY; IV. CAPITAL DISTRICT; 46 47 V. NORTH COUNTRY; 48 VI. CENTRAL NEW YORK; 49 VII. FINGER LAKES; 50 VIII. WESTERN NEW YORK; 51 IX. SOUTHERN TIER. B. DURING THE PUBLIC HEARINGS, THE COMMISSION SHALL HEAR THE TESTIMONY 52 OF VOLUNTARY WITNESSES, MAY COMPEL THE TESTIMONY OF WITNESSES AND MAY 53 54 REQUIRE THE PRODUCTION OF ANY DOCUMENTS THE COMMISSION DEEMS REASONABLY 55 NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT ITS RESPONSIBILITIES.

1 C. AFTER REVIEW, STUDY, AND RECEIPT OF PUBLIC COMMENT, THE COMMISSION 2 SHALL ISSUE A REPORT AND PROMULGATE RECOMMENDATIONS GOVERNING EDUCA-3 TIONAL STANDARDS, CURRICULUM, THE IMPLEMENTATION THEREOF, AND TESTING IN 4 THE STATE OF NEW YORK FOR GRADES PRE-KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELVE. RECOM-5 MENDATIONS SHALL INCLUDE INFORMATION ON, BUT SHALL NOT BE LIMITED TO, 6 THE FOLLOWING:

I. AN ANALYSIS OF THE STATE STANDARDS AND RELATED CURRICULUM EXISTING
IN THE TWO THOUSAND NINE--TWO THOUSAND TEN SCHOOL YEAR;

9 II. AN ANALYSIS OF THE COMMON CORE STANDARDS ESTABLISHED IN TWO THOU-10 SAND TEN BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNORS ASSOCIATION CENTER FOR BEST PRACTICES 11 AND THE COUNCIL OF CHIEF STATE SCHOOL OFFICERS;

12 III. AN ANALYSIS OF BEST PRACTICES, IN LIGHT OF THE STUDY AND REVIEW 13 OF PRIOR STATE STANDARDS AND THOSE PUT FORTH BY THE NATIONAL GOVERNORS 14 ASSOCIATION CENTER FOR BEST PRACTICES AND THE COUNCIL OF CHIEF STATE 15 SCHOOL OFFICERS, RELATED TO EDUCATIONAL STANDARDS AND PROMOTING COLLEGE 16 AND CAREER READINESS FOR PRE-KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELFTH GRADE STUDENTS 17 IN NEW YORK STATE;

18 IV. AN ANALYSIS OF AGE APPROPRIATE AND DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE 19 MEANS OF IMPLEMENTING AND TRANSITIONING TO NEW EDUCATIONAL STANDARDS AND 20 CURRICULUMS WITHIN THE STATE;

V. AN ANALYSIS OF THE TIME AND RESOURCES SPENT PREPARING FOR AND ADMINISTERING STATE-WIDE TESTS WITHIN THE STATE, FOR EACH GRADE, IN THE SCHOOL YEARS TWO THOUSAND NINE--TWO THOUSAND TEN, TWO THOUSAND TEN--TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN--TWO THOUSAND TWELVE, TWO THOUSAND TWELVE--TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO THOUSAND FOUR-TEEN;

VI. AN ANALYSIS OF THE DATA COLLECTED PURSUANT TO SUBPARAGRAPH V OF THIS PARAGRAPH AND THE IMPACT THAT THE TIME AND RESOURCES ALLOCATED HAD ON THE QUALITY OF INSTRUCTION AND EMOTIONAL WELL-BEING OF STUDENTS IN THE STATE;

VII. AN ANALYSIS OF THE IMPACT THAT A CHANGE IN CURRICULUM WILL HAVE ON STUDENTS WHO ARE ABSENT FROM THEIR REGULAR CLASSES FOR EXTENDED PERI-ODS EACH WEEK DUE TO RECEIVING SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL SERVICES, REMEDIAL SERVICES, OR STUDENTS WHO HAVE EXTENDED ABSENCES;

35 VIII. AN ANALYSIS OF HOW THE POTENTIAL REINSTATEMENT OF THE COMMON 36 CORE CURRICULUM WILL IMPACT THE AMOUNT OF TIME THAT STUDENTS OF VARIOUS 37 FAMILY STRUCTURES AND SOCIO-ECONOMIC BACKGROUNDS SPEND DOING HOMEWORK;

38 IX. AN ANALYSIS AS TO THE SUFFICIENCY OF THE COMMON CORE MODULES AND 39 ANY LESSON PLANS PROVIDED TO THE SCHOOLS BY THE DEPARTMENT;

40 X. A COMPARISON OF LOCALLY DEVELOPED CURRICULUMS THAT WERE DEVELOPED 41 IN ORDER TO INSTRUCT ON THE COMMON CORE STANDARDS AND THOSE THAT WERE 42 PURCHASED FROM VENDORS, WITH A FOCUS ON QUALITY, AGE APPROPRIATENESS AND 43 DEVELOPMENTAL APPROPRIATENESS;

44 XI. A REVIEW OF THE PERCENTAGE OF SCHOOLS THAT HAD FULLY IMPLEMENTED 45 THE COMMON CORE CURRICULUM, THOSE THAT HAD PARTIALLY IMPLEMENTED THE 46 COMMON CORE CURRICULUM, AND THOSE THAT HAD NOT IMPLEMENTED ANY PART OF 47 THE COMMON CORE CURRICULUM DURING THE TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO THOU-48 SAND FOURTEEN SCHOOL YEAR;

49 XII. AN ANALYSIS OF WHETHER OR NOT INSTRUCTION AND TESTING ON THE 50 COMMON CORE CURRICULUM IS DEVELOPMENTALLY APPROPRIATE FOR CHILDREN WITH 51 INDIVIDUALIZED EDUCATION PLANS AND CHILDREN WITH OTHER LEARNING DISABIL-52 ITIES.

D. AFTER CONCLUDING THEIR STUDY, THE COMMISSION MUST TAKE A VOTE ON
WHETHER OR NOT THEY BELIEVE THE COMMON CORE CURRICULUM SHOULD BE REINSTATED. THE RESULTS OF THAT VOTE MUST BE INCLUDED IN THEIR FINAL REPORT.
E. THE COMMISSION SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO:

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I. APPOINT A CHAIRPERSON BY A MAJORITY VOTE; 1 II. CALL UPON ANY AGENCY, DEPARTMENT, OFFICE, DIVISION OR PUBLIC 2 3 AUTHORITY, OR SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THIS STATE TO SUPPLY IT WITH SUCH 4 INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE AS THE COMMISSION DEEMS NECESSARY TO 5 DISCHARGE ITS RESPONSIBILITIES. EACH AGENCY, DEPARTMENT, OFFICE, DIVI-SION OR SCHOOL DISTRICT OF THIS STATE SHALL COOPERATE WITH THE COMMIS-6 7 SION AND FURNISH SUCH INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE AS IT REOUESTS TO 8 ACCOMPLISH ITS PURPOSES; 9 III. APPOINT A COUNSEL AND SUCH OTHER STAFF AS THE COMMISSION DEEMS 10 REASONABLY NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT ITS RESPONSIBILITIES; IV. CONTRACT WITH ANY STATE OR PRIVATE ENTITY FOR THE PROVISION OF 11 SUCH SERVICES AS THE COMMISSION DETERMINES TO BE REASONABLY NECESSARY; 12 13 AND 14 V. TAKE OTHER ACTIONS NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION AS SHALL ENABLE THE COMMISSION TO CARRY OUT ITS FUNCTIONS. 15 F. RECOMMENDATIONS ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION SHALL BE DECIDED BY A MAJORITY VOTE. RECOMMENDATIONS ISSUED BY THE COMMISSION SHALL BE 16 17 CONTAINED IN A REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE. THE REPORT SHALL 18 19 BE ISSUED NO LATER THAN JANUARY THIRTY-FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN. S 349-C. SUSPENSION OF COMMON CORE TESTING. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE PROHIBITED 20 21 FROM REQUIRING ANY SCHOOL OR SCHOOL DISTRICT IN THE STATE TO 22 ISSUE A COMMON CORE STATE TEST AS DEFINED BY SUBDIVISION THREE OF SECTION THREE 23 HUNDRED FORTY-NINE-A OF THIS ARTICLE UNTIL THE TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN--TWO 24 25 THOUSAND SEVENTEEN SCHOOL YEAR. DURING THE MORATORIUM, STATE-WIDE ASSESSMENTS FOR GRADES PRE-KINDERGARTEN THROUGH TWELVE SHALL BE DEVEL-26 27 OPED FROM STATE STANDARDS WHICH EXISTED FOR THE TWO THOUSAND NINE--TWO 28 THOUSAND TEN SCHOOL YEAR. S 349-D. SUSPENSION OF COMMON CORE CURRICULUM. NOTWITHSTANDING ANY 29 PROVISION OF LAW TO THE CONTRARY, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE PROHIBITED 30 FROM REQUIRING ANY SCHOOL OR SCHOOL DISTRICT IN THE STATE TO IMPLEMENT A 31 32 COMMON CORE CURRICULUM AS DEFINED BY SUBDIVISION TWO OF SECTION THREE 33 HUNDRED FORTY-NINE-A OF THIS ARTICLE UNTIL THE TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN--TWO 34 THOUSAND SEVENTEEN SCHOOL YEAR. 35 S 349-E. WAIVER FROM RACE TO THE TOP OBLIGATIONS RELATED TO COMMON THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE REQUIRED, WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF THE 36 CORE. EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS ARTICLE, TO APPLY TO THE UNITED STATE DEPARTMENT 37 OF EDUCATION FOR ANY AND ALL FLEXIBILITY WAIVERS THAT MAY BE REQUIRED IN 38 ORDER FOR THE STATE TO REMAIN IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE RACE TO THE TOP 39 40 APPLICATION WHICH WAS SUBMITTED BY THE DEPARTMENT ON JUNE FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TEN. PROVIDED HOWEVER, IN THE EVENT THAT THE UNITED STATES 41 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL DENY THE FLEXIBILITY WAIVER, OR ANY PORTION THEREOF, SUCH DENIAL SHALL HAVE NO EFFECT ON THE REQUIREMENTS 42 43 AND PROHIBITIONS PROVIDED IN THIS ARTICLE. 44 45 S 2. This act shall take effect June 30, 2014 or on the thirtieth day after it shall have become a law, whichever is later. 46
