AN ACT in relation to requiring the education department, in consultation with the department of labor, the department of economic development, and any other entity the education department deems appropriate, to produce an annual report regarding state workforce projections and education credential production; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1     Section 1. To the extent practicable within available resources and  
2     subject to the availability of data currently collected by and accessi-  
3     ble to state agencies, the education department, in consultation with  
4     the department of labor, the department of regulatory agencies, and any  
5     other entity the education department deems appropriate, shall produce  
6     an annual report regarding state workforce need projections and creden-  
7     tial production. The report shall:
- 8     a. indicate the state's anticipated workforce needs for the three-year  
9     period following the report and the number of degrees, certificates, and  
10    other credentials that public and private institutions of higher educa-  
11    tion, private occupational schools, local community colleges, area voca-  
12    tional schools expect to issue over the three-year period following the  
13    report;
- 14    b. to the extent provided by sources external to the education depart-  
15    ment, indicate the state's anticipated number of degrees, certificates  
16    and other credentials that high school vocational programs, apprentice-  
17    ship programs and other public or private workforce training programs  
18    expect to issue over the three-year period following the report;
- 19    c. identify any workforce needs, including areas of specialization and  
20    levels of experience within a particular vocation, that may not be met  
21    by the education, training, and apprenticeship programs; and
- 22    d. identify institutions, public or private, that can meet the work-  
23    force needs through expansion of existing programs or by developing new  
24    programs. The education department, by January 15 of each year, begin-

1 ning in 2015, shall provide a copy of the report to the higher education  
2 committees of the assembly and the senate, or any successor committees,  
3 to the commerce, economic development and small business committee of  
4 the senate, or any successor committee, to the economic development, job  
5 creation, commerce and industry committee of the assembly, or any  
6 successor committee, and to the governor.

7 S 2. The education department shall send the report to every public  
8 post-secondary institution governing board in the state and to public  
9 school districts and charter schools in the state. The report shall also  
10 be available to private schools within the state upon request and shall  
11 be made available on the website maintained by the education department.

12 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be  
13 deemed repealed three years after such date.
