AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to the retaking of certain persons absconding from parole or other conditional release

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be know and may be cited as "Cesar's law".

- S 2. Paragraph (i) of subdivision 3 of section 259-i of the executive law, as amended by section 38-f-1 of subpart A of part C of chapter 62 of the laws of 2011, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 6 Where there is reasonable cause to believe that a presumptive 7 releasee, parolee, conditional releasee or person under post-release supervision has absconded from supervision the board may declare such person to be delinquent. IF SUCH PERSON HAS PREVIOUSLY BEEN CONVICTED OF A CLASS A FELONY OFFENSE, OTHER THAN A CLASS A FELONY OFFENSE DEFINED IN 9 10 11 ARTICLE TWO HUNDRED TWENTY OF THE PENAL LAW, OR A VIOLENT FELONY OFFENSE AS DEFINED IN SECTION 70.02 OF THE PENAL LAW, THE BOARD SHALL DECLARE 12 SUCH PERSON TO BE DELINOUENT AND A WARRANT SHALL BE ISSUED FOR THE 13 RETAKING OF SUCH PERSON AND FOR HIS OR HER TEMPORARY DETENTION ACCORDING 14 TO THE RULES OF THE BOARD, AND THE BOARD SHALL 15 IMMEDIATELY NOTIFY LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY HAVING JURISDICTION OF THE LOCALITY IN WHICH SUCH 16 ABSCONDER RESIDES. This paragraph shall not be construed to deny such 17 person a preliminary revocation hearing upon his OR HER retaking, nor to 18 19 relieve the department of any obligation it may have to exercise due 20 diligence to retake the alleged absconder, nor to relieve the parolee or 21 releasee of any obligation he OR SHE may have to comply with the conditions of his OR HER release. 22
